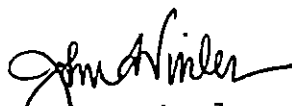
Mr. Edward T. Lawson, Chairman of the Oklahoma Bush/Quayle Finance Committee called and asked that I relay to you his desires regarding your acceptance speech at the convention. On behalf of the Oklahoma and Texas oil and gas businessmen he wanted to make sure you made a statement opposing the Alternative Minimum Tax (A.M.T) in your remarks. Mr. Lawson indicated he had recently discussed this issue with Admiral Watkins, Energy Secretary, and they agreed this needed to be included in your remarks. Mr. Lawson further stated you would be receiving a call from Admiral Watkin's supporting these desires.

-- There is currently a good deal of speculation about potential UN inspections and possible military measures in Iraq and alleged political motivations. *I will not commit on today's speculative stories - except to say some of which were grossly inaccurate*

-- From now on, ^{some with me} I expect to be accused of political opportunism for every move I make. That is unfortunate, but it will not deter me from doing what is right regardless of the political fallout,

-- We are determined that UN Resolution 687 will be fully implemented. This requires UN Teams to inspect and destroy the Iraqi network of weapons of mass destruction -- nuclear, chemical, biological and missile.

-- I have total confidence in Rolf Ekeus and the UNSCOM Teams who have the responsibility for this mission. Let me make clear that what they elect to inspect and when is strictly their decision. The US role is to provide support for their efforts.

-- Saddam Hussein needs to realize that the world will not ignore interference with United Nations requirements. He cannot be allowed to dictate what can and cannot be inspected.

-- Let me underscore something which you all know -- as President whatever I decide has immediate consequences. *There will not be no politics. I will do what is right for this country.*

B-H: French Minister--No 'Death Camps'; Serbs Being Tortured

[Text] Paris, 16 Aug (TANJUG) -- "Nazi-style death camps do not exist in Bosnia," said Bernard Kouchner, French minister of health and humanitarian action, who returned to Paris late last night after a tour of a number of camps near Banja Luka and in Sarajevo.

Kouchner confirmed, for the first time, that Serbian prisoners were being tortured in Muslim camps. He made this statement after a tour of a large camp for Serbs in Sarajevo, stressing that "many prisoners complained of being tortured and beaten." Describing conditions in the camps, the French minister said they were somewhat improved, "but the situation there is still terrible." "Men, women and children in these camps are so terrified that they do not even have the strength to look at you when you are talking to them," he said.

Addressing in particular those in France who have recently called for military intervention in Bosnia-Herzegovina, Minister Kouchner said: "If those in France and especially in Paris who are playing the innocent party believe that a bad army has gone to Bosnia from Belgrade and that all the other ones are good, they are completely mistaken."

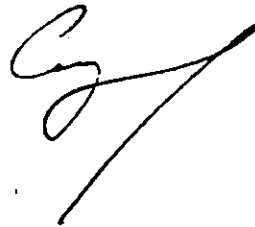

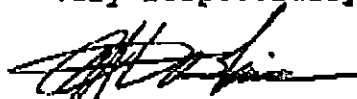

R. I. PRESIDENT ENCOURAGES ATTENDANCE AT INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE

President Rajendra K. Saboo will hold a series of international conferences this year, focusing on the quality of life of people around the world. Built on the "Look Beyond Yourself" theme, the conferences will be co-sponsored by Rotary International and The Rotary Foundation under auspices of the Rotary Peace Programs. Three of the five meetings are scheduled:

Feb. 21-23, 1992--Caribbean Conference, Port-of-Spain, Trinidad, focusing on food production and chronic hunger.

Feb. 28, 1992--Conference at the United Nations Secretariat, New York, emphasizing better understanding of the U. N. among Rotarians and joint efforts by the U.N. and Rotary to improve functional literacy worldwide.

April 3, 4 1992--CEEMA Region Conference, Budapest, Hungary, with emphasis on economic and vocational opportunities in Eastern Europe.

Details of the other two conferences, one of which will be held either in Northern Africa or the Middle East, will be announced at a later date.

President Saboo urges Rotarians to attend the conference in their region to contribute ideas toward improving the living standard in nations around the world.

Dangerous world for presidents and challengers

WHEN Jean Cocteau, the French writer, was asked if he believed in luck, he replied, "Of course. How else do you explain the success of those you don't like?" George Bush will be forgiven for believing Bill Clinton has of late been lucky.

After the Bush campaign tried, for several weeks, with scant success, to portray Clinton as a crypto-leftist on domestic policy, events in Baghdad and the Balkans suddenly shifted attention to foreign policy. And up popped Clinton to the right of Bush.

Regarding foreign policy, the Cold War defined the political spectrum in terms of opposition to aggressive left-wing regimes, so "the right" came to mean readiness for ambitious U.S. interventions, perhaps involving military actions. In the short run, at least, Clinton may benefit from seeming to be "to the right" by suggesting insufficient U.S. efforts against Baghdad and on behalf of Bosnia. But there may be an opportunity for Bush, groggy though he is, at last to land a punch in this, the first post-Cold War election.

There is an old story of candidate Richard Nixon being told in 1960 that he should not talk too much about foreign policy because what matters on Election Day is "the price of hogs in St. Louis." On the other hand, as Democratic candidates must be repeatedly reminded, you cannot run for president of the Department of Health and Human Services.

By suggesting U.S. military support for U.N.-sanctioned air strikes against Serbian attacks on relief efforts in Bosnia, Clinton seemed to put the

Democratic Party on the muscular side of a foreign policy dispute. That may draw the fangs of Republicans who relish saying that the most recent Democratic president invaded a vast country with eight helicopters, and that on the most recent significant foreign policy decision, the authorization of Desert Storm, most Democrats took a position to the left of the United Nations.

In appearing to be to the right of Bush, Clinton was helped — this is becoming a pattern — by the hapless Marlin Fitzwater. He was sent forth to lambaste Clinton, but did so without understanding that Clinton had said approximately what Defense Secretary Dick Cheney and Sen. Richard Lugar (acting ranking minority member on the Foreign Relations Committee) have said.

Meanwhile, Saddam Hussein's cunning continues to tarnish the achievement of which Bush is most proud. Merely by continuing to draw breath — never mind tormenting the enforcers of the cease-fire agreement — Saddam allows Democrats to call attention to the Bush administration's "coddling" of him (Clinton's word) before his invasion of Kuwait. But three things must be said on Bush's behalf.

First, when Iraqi aggression occurred, Bush responded better than most Democrats did.

Second, it is implausible to suggest, as many Democrats do, that a few more hours of the Desert Storm offensive would have solved the problem of Iraq. Because Bush stopped when he did, young Americans are not now patrolling the back alleys of Baghdad. Bush remembers better than his critics evidently do how deeply America became involved in South Vietnam's future by being implicated in the 1963 assassination of Ngo Dinh Diem. It is difficult to disengage from a nation whose regime you have changed.

Third, regarding the fissionable Balkans, do

Democrats want to say Bush is too reluctant to intervene in fratricide? Do they think U.S. policy should aim at — what? Planting the delicate orchid of democracy in the stony soil of south central Europe?

Recently Clinton said "America is being ridiculed around the world." Oh? American political ideas and social and cultural values, expressed in American cadences (often those of the third and 16th presidents), are being embraced around the world. Who are the ridiculers, and who gives a tinker's damn about their opinion? Does Clinton?

Perhaps Clinton is just again indulging his Kennedy fixation. In 1960, candidate John F. Kennedy made much of some polls purporting to show a decline in America's "prestige." That was fatuous, and Clinton's similar lament about ridicule is not less so. But it may betoken a difference for Bush to dwell on.

Americans believe in three kinds of progress — material, intellectual and moral. Periodically Americans regard foreign policy as a realm for pursuing that third kind. The theory is that this nation "dedicated to a proposition" is committed to a foreign policy that tries to universalize that proposition in the form of democracy.

Perhaps Clinton will promise a foreign policy oriented to lofty values rather than concrete interests. That will leave Bush leaning on the ropes but standing on a recognizably conservative principle:

Abroad as at home, the power of government to do good is limited. From time to time there are new world orders, but the world always is a dangerous place.
