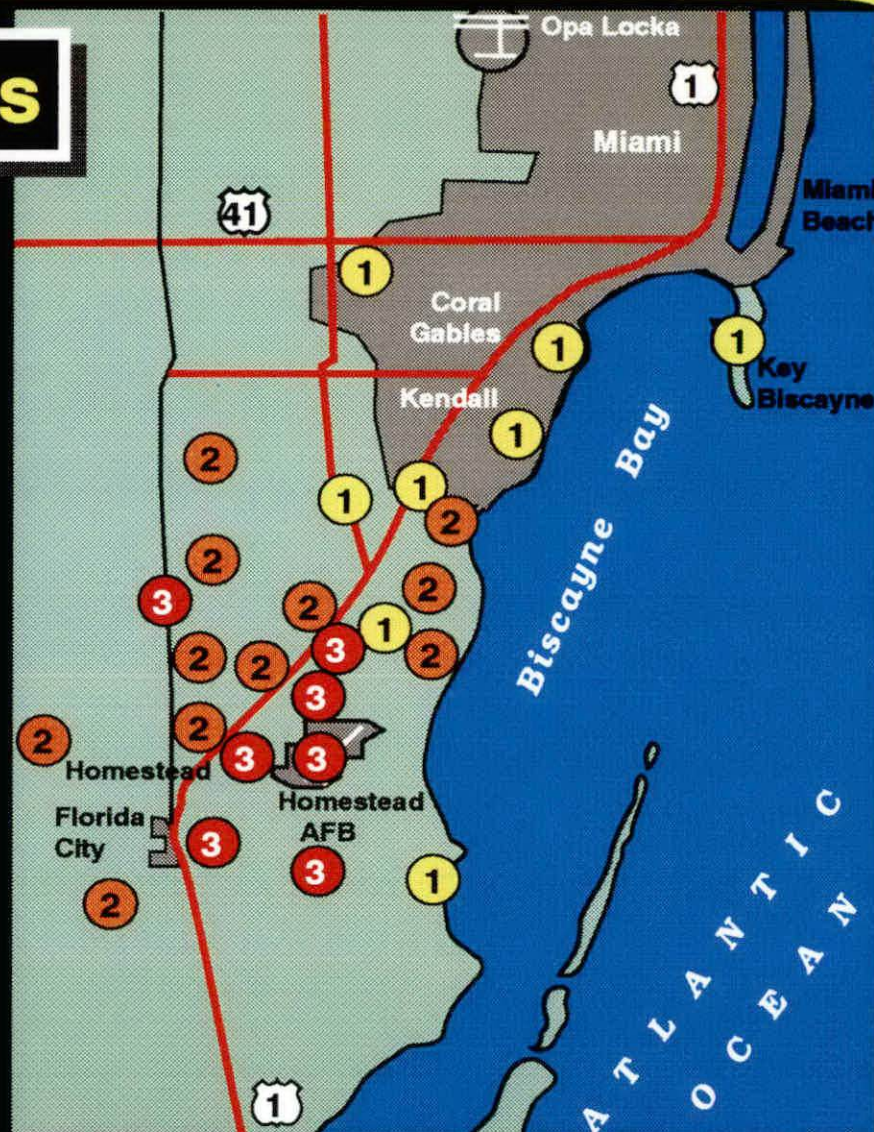
Damage Track

Damage Estimates

- 1 Light Damage:**
Scattered low level flooding and structural damage to buildings
- 2 Heavy Damage:**
Sections of road impassable, structural damage to buildings, wide-spread flooding
- 3 Completely Destroyed:**
Flattened areas, Trailers overturned, large scale flooding, building toppled

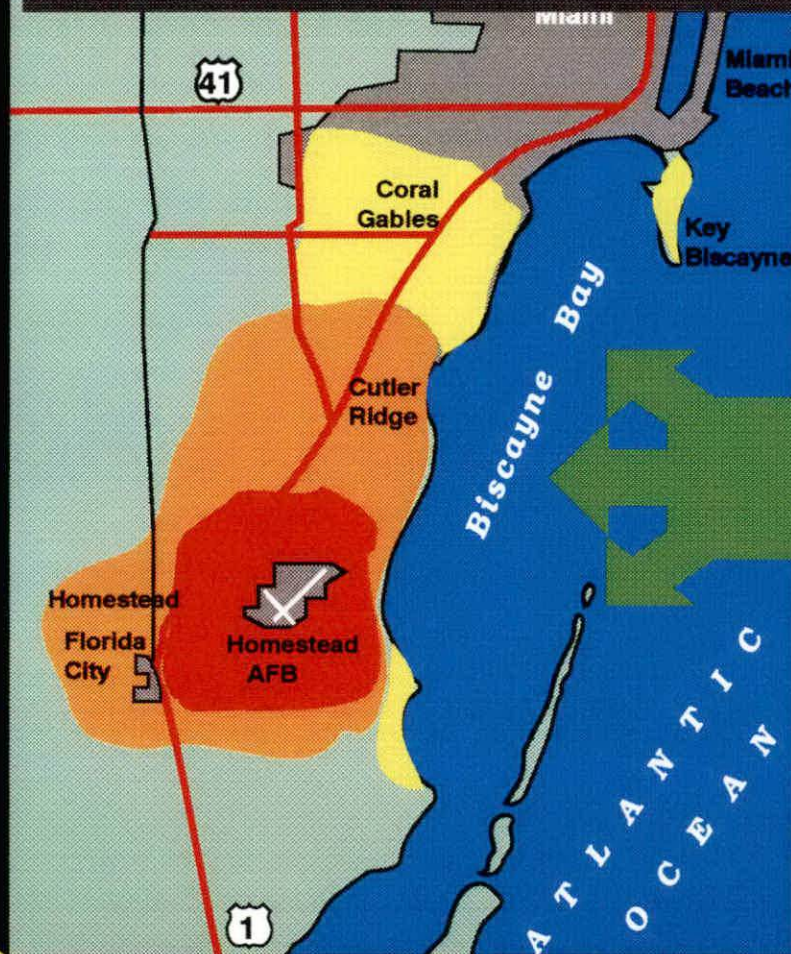

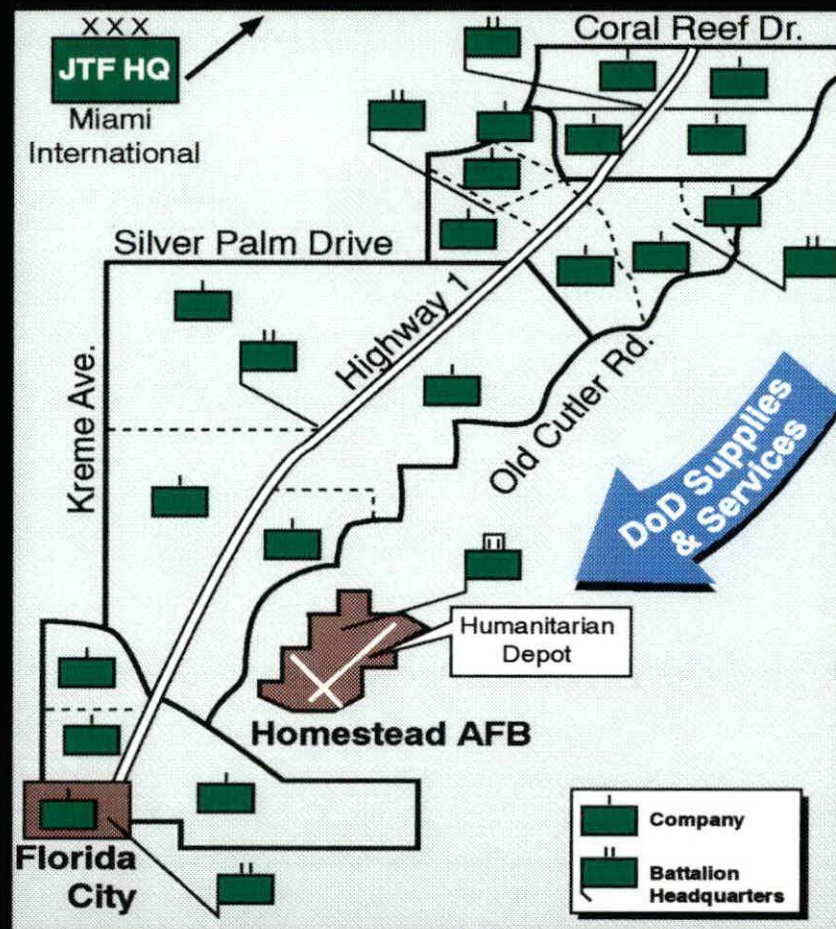

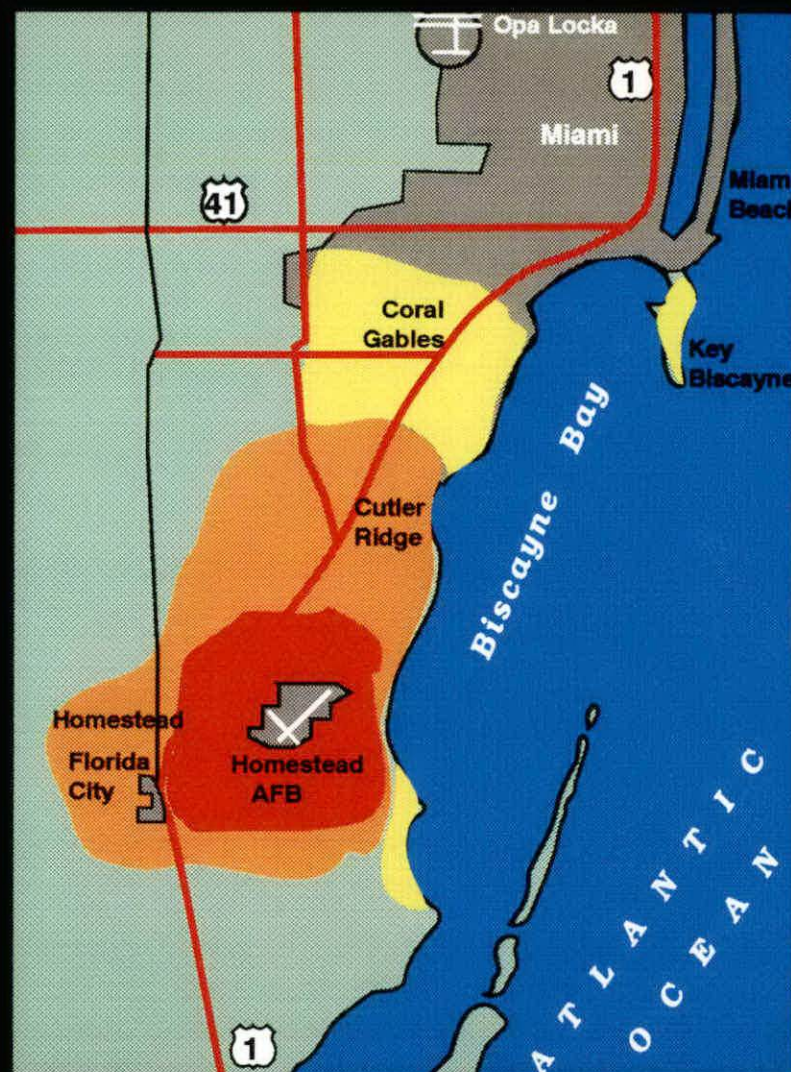

Summary

- ✓ DoD is engaged globally in humanitarian operations...major effort in Florida
- ✓ In Guam, Louisiana & Florida...DoD JTF on ground and working
- ✓ Concept:
 - *Relief*: Basic needs, public health, public services
 - *Recovery*: Debris removal, damage assessments, government facilities
 - *Reconstruction*: Government facilities, public health, private homes
- ✓ Command and control established...relief assistance being distributed
- ✓ Humanitarian depot as focal point for distribution of all supplies and services

Summary

✓ Status:

- **Food:** 22 kitchens, 269,000 MREs, containers
- **Water:** Bottled, tankers, purification units
- **Health services:** Vets, preventive medicine, hospitals
- **Sanitation:** Inspect servers / facilities, 1000 porta-johns
- **Debris removal:** 2 engineer bns to assist COE contractors

✓ **Objective:** Close JTF recovery of 17,261 soldiers, airmen, and marines...active and reserve...by 2400, 2 Sep 92
