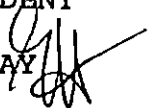

Dear Mr. President:

Today I returned a call to Australian Ambassador Cook, who had requested an update on the GATT talks. I described the areas in which we had made substantial progress and the problem areas that remain.

The Ambassador then told me that he was very grateful for the assistance that we had provided in helping them effect a sale of 500,000 tons of wheat to India, as well as the assistance that we had provided to them on a malting barley issue.

I told Ambassador Cook that it would be very nice if those messages could be conveyed to you, because I knew of your positive feelings about the Australians. He said circumstances were such that he couldn't guarantee that, so I have decided to take the liberty of passing those messages along to you.

Commissioner MacSharry and I continue our work by phone and at the staff level. Contrary to what Carla told me she had learned from Frans Andriessen, MacSharry insists that Jacques Delors continues to be a big problem with regard to getting something done on the export subsidies, which really is the big hangup, at this point.

2. I believe we must begin to downsize government, Mr. Clinton wants to expand the role of government. Listen to him. He wants to "manage competition" and dictate prices in the marketplace. Where will it stop? When he says "invest in America" he means transfer more of the wealth you produce to Washington so he and his one party government can then redistribute it according to their grand five year plan.

3. Mr. Clinton does not have a mature vision of where America is going. He has a fantasy in which we can have liberty and prosperity through more government management of our lives. So let's call it by its name -- socialism.

4. All of Mr. Clinton's high tech talk reveals that he thinks he can manage the economy with an almost scientific precision. But that notion is science fiction. The marketplace will not behave the way you expect it to, Mr. Clinton, and the more you try to control and dictate to the economy the more you will mess it up. Making government bigger is the problem, not the solution.

5. Having been in government all your adult life, I can understand why you believe government is the answer. But it is naive to believe that Congress, business, labor and the marketplace are all going to let you work your will. Believe me, it doesn't work that way. That is why we are a democracy and a market economy, because no one can or should use government to control society the way you propose to do. You are in over your head, you have oversold your program, and I hope the American people don't buy your magic elixir because it won't cure what ails us.

Subj: How to win

Watching the second "debate" last night, I came up with an idea that I think could turn the campaign around. First let me explain what, then I'll elaborate on why.

The "what":

Buy three half-hours of network prime time on three succeeding days during the week of the 26th, preferably Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. It doesn't matter what network, and they can be on the same one or different ones. Announce this before Monday's debate, and announce what you're going to use them for.

Use each one for a straight-on talk to the American people from the Oval Office. No props, no gimmicks, just you and the people.

The first night, talk about the economy. What its condition is, how it got that way, what you're doing about it now, what you're going to do about it in the future, what it's doing by itself and what its prospects are. Place the present recession in both its historical and its global context. Explain the limits as well as the reach of what government can do. Lay out, simply and straightforwardly, the differences between your prescription and Clinton's. Nothing slick or sly or cute or funny. This is serious business to the undecided voter, and so treat it seriously. Take the voter into your confidence, and by doing so win his confidence.

The second night, talk about the world. The dangers, the opportunities, the changes we can expect in the 90s -- but throughout the talk focus in hard on the vital connection between America's leadership abroad in the 1990s and our prospects for prosperity at home. This connection is key to the election, and this connection has been largely missing from the campaign. And concentrate the talk not on the past, but on the future. Draw on the past only to the extent that it's necessary to reinforce what you say about the future.

The third night, talk about the presidency. What it is, what it represents, what it takes, what you've learned about it and how you've learned. The particular qualities of character, intellect, insight and judgment that its

successful exercise calls for. Why and how it's an office that differs from all others. What you want to do with it in your second term. How you intend to use it to leave America a better place than you found it. Why you believe that you're truly the candidate best suited to fill it for these next four crucial years.

The why:

The electorate has been sound-bited and sloganed to death, and last night's "debate" format was the ultimate trivialization of the campaign. We've still got extraordinary numbers of people who are undecided, and one reason is that they've heard so little of real substance. They're looking for something solid on which to base a choice, so be the one to give it to them.

Lead off with the economy, because they won't listen to anything else until you've satisfied them on that. This year, that's the threshold issue. And your case can't be adequately argued in sound bites. If they find you talking seriously and comprehensively, they will listen, and they'll listen through a full half hour -- because they're concerned, they're worried, they're dismayed, they're scared, and they know that candidates to the left of them and candidates to the right of them have been trying to con them all campaign long. And play it straight -- yes, we'd be better off today if some of your proposals had been enacted but there's really no quick fix. A recession is like an illness: it takes time to recover, and you do the patient no favor by dragging him out of bed and pushing him onto the ski slopes. But there are important choices to be made that will determine both the pace and the strength of the ultimate recovery, and it's vital that the choices made be ones that will accelerate long-term growth.

Go on from the economy to the world, because a) that reinforces and elaborates on your case on the economy, b) it plays to your own strength and highlights Clinton's and Perot's weakness, and c) it's central to the presidency. But do use the economic argument to sell the voters on the importance of foreign policy, so that you can use foreign policy to sell them on the need for a Bush presidency.

Then use the speech on the presidency to sum up the entire case for your re-election, while creating a clearly legitimate context in which to fold the issues of character and trust.

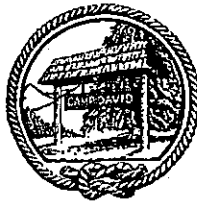
If you buy the time now and announce before Monday's debate that you're going to make the speeches, it will allow you in the debate and all next week to refer ahead to them -- while keeping Clinton off balance, because he'll know that you're going to have that uninterrupted time to answer

whatever charges he makes. It would be an entirely fitting and appropriate wind-up to the campaign. It would restore the campaign to the serious level that a hell of a lot of voters yearn for. It would have the effect of strengthening the John Major factor -- reassuring the undecided, and giving the reluctant either a reason or a rationale for pulling the Bush lever when they get inside the booth. You would do it well. It would be appropriate, uplifting and thoroughly presidential. And I think it could win the election.

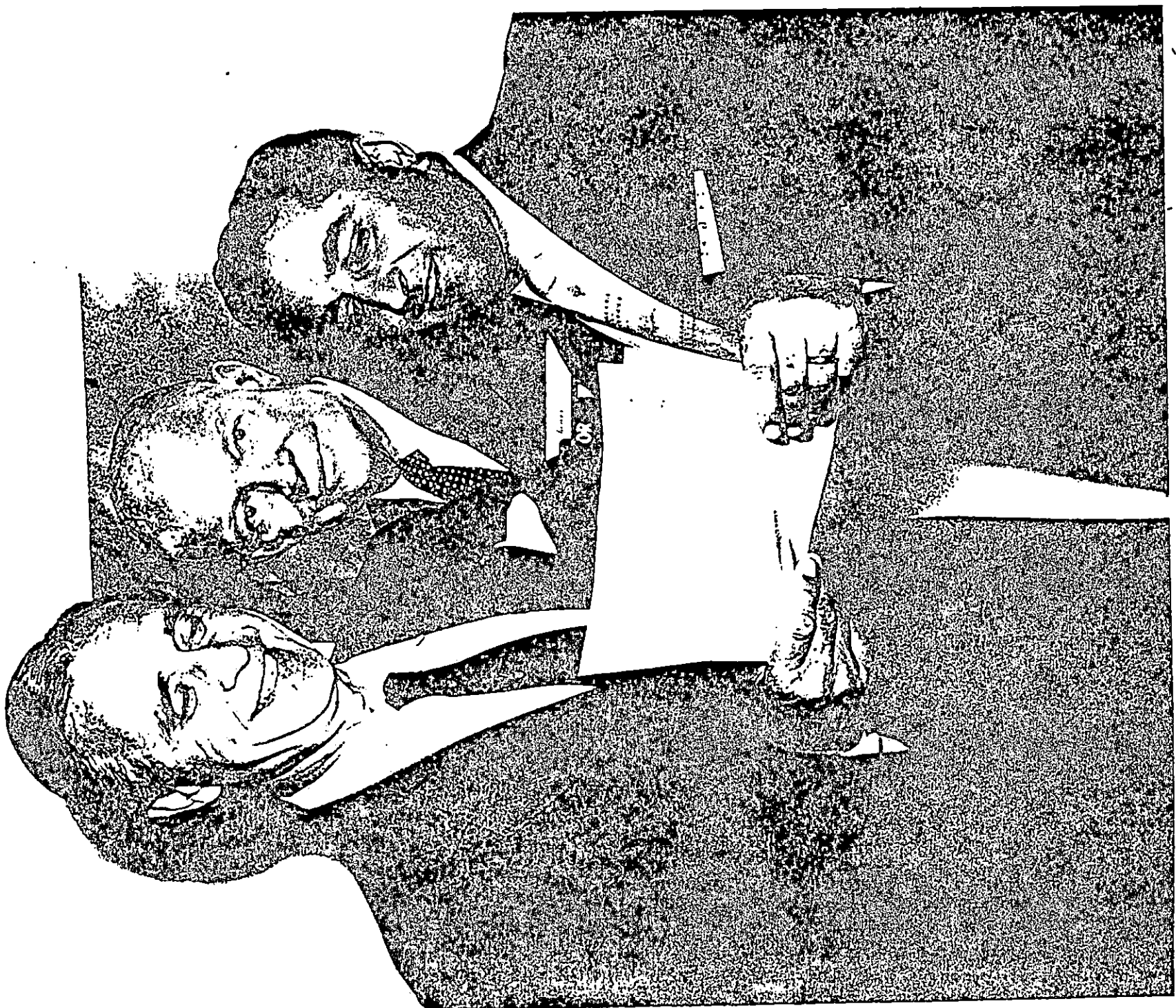

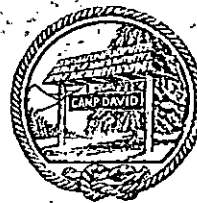

THE CLINTON-GORE TICKET: NEW DARLINGS OF THE AMERICAN LEFT
Ticket Hides Behind "Moderate" Facade

Campaign '92

During the Democrat convention in July, former nominee GEORGE MCGOVERN predicted that once the election is over, Clinton and Gore will shed their moderate image and govern as liberals. Further evidence of the public facade was the conspicuous absence from the convention floor of House Speaker THOMAS FOLEY, Senate Majority Leader GEORGE MITCHELL and House Majority Leader DICK

GEPHARDT. Clinton has further assured voters that he's no "Washington insider" and is not beholden to "the big money, special-interests or congressional liberals." But behind the scenes, Clinton has quietly asked top-gun Congressional liberals to craft an ambitious legislative package to be enacted within 100 days of his inauguration. Consider these components of Clinton's economic plan:

➡ Clinton is proposing \$154 billion in new taxes over four years, based mostly on "soak the rich" schemes targeted to taxpayers making more than \$200,000 each year, and a strengthening of IRS collection capabilities. The Clinton plan provides for an additional \$220 billion in federal spending, \$50 billion of which is to be sent to corrupt big-city mayors with failed bottomless-pit spending programs. Clinton's program calls for an 81 percent increase in taxes over those proposed by WALTER MONDALE and MICHAEL DUKAKIS combined. Clinton's projected spending would top Mondale/Dukakis' proposed expenditures by more than 188 percent.

✓ ➡ Clinton chose Senate insider AL GORE as his running mate, he says, because Gore represents the "future." But Gore was listed by the National Taxpayers Union as the Senate's biggest spender in 1989 and 1990. Gore's lifetime Senate Service rating by the American Conservative Union is 11 percent -- the lowest of any currently serving Senator in his region -- and lower than even such liberal stalwarts as JOE BIDEN (16 percent), JAY ROCKEFELLER (12 percent) and GEORGE MITCHELL (13 percent). Clinton's supposedly moderate running mate does well on the liberal ratings. Americans for Democratic Action (ADA) assigned Gore a 75 percent rating. The AFL-CIO's Committee on Political Education (COPE) rates Gore with an 87 -- higher than GEORGE MITCHELL and even Minnesota's goofy PAUL WELLSTONE, who scored 83 percent.

✓ ➡ While pinning down Clinton's record is more difficult than that of Gore (like JIMMY CARTER, Clinton presided over a small southern state), he has made some policy moves that give Americans a peek at how he would govern as president. During Clinton's tenure as governor of Arkansas, bureaucracy grew by 16 percent (the nationwide figure was 13.5 percent growth). Arkansas ranks third in the nation for the highest unemployment rate. Taxes in Arkansas increased by 89.6 percent under Clinton. Poverty increased by 14 percent (the percentage of people living below the poverty line in Arkansas is the third highest in the nation). State spending increased by 92 percent under Clinton, in contrast to a 43 percent spending increase by the federal government during the same period.

Clinton-Gore: A Nightmare if Victorious

Should he become President, Clinton will rely heavily upon Gore as his point man for legislation in Congress. In upcoming stories, we'll detail how Gore has fallen in with radical environmentalists in recent years (under a Clinton-Gore Administration, a strong emphasis on this part of the leftist agenda can be expected). If Democrats capture the White House, the full machinery of the Justice Department's bureaucracy will fall behind the persistent efforts of Congressional persecutor LAWRENCE WALSH to jail Republicans for Iran-Contra, Iraqi policy and a host of other "crimes." One last point: Clinton's wife and close advisor Hillary has close ties to the American left, and is expected to make ELEANOR ROOSEVELT seem tame. She is a supporter of CISPEs, a radical left booster of guerilla movements in Central America during the 1980s.
