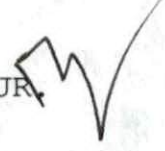
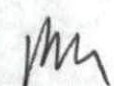

SUBJECT: Proposed New U.S.-Mexican Border Crossing

The President sent you a note asking for background information on a proposed new U.S.-Mexican border crossing at Santa Teresa, New Mexico (Tab A). He got a call from Senator Domenici on this issue.

New Mexico has no major border crossings into Mexico, but does have small ones at Columbus (a town of less than 1000 inhabitants) and Antelope Wells, which is even smaller than Columbus. Most New Mexicans cross at El Paso.

New Mexico wants an additional border crossing, and members of the New Mexico congressional delegation have been active on this issue. We have discussed this idea with the Mexicans on a number of occasions over the past several years. Two sites have been considered -- one at Sunland Park, about six miles west of El Paso, and the second at Santa Teresa, about 13 miles west of El Paso. The Mexicans originally preferred Sunland Park because it would be easy to connect Sunland Park with roads on the Mexican side that already serve the El Paso crossing. The New Mexico delegation prefers Santa Teresa reportedly because they expect rapid commercial and residential development in that region.

Last year, the Mexicans agreed to a new border crossing at Santa Teresa, our preferred location. The State of New Mexico put up temporary buildings at the site, while the Mexicans have built a permanent structure. On the Mexican side, however, the only road leading south from Santa Teresa is an unpaved one, considered by some to be unsafe, especially for night driving. We don't want to open the new crossing until the situation is corrected. While the Mexicans have promised to pave the road, work has not begun because the Mexicans have other, higher priorities.

Domenici and other members of the New Mexico congressional delegation have been in regular contact with U.S. Ambassador Negroponte and other Embassy officials in Mexico City, as well as with Mexican Ambassador Petricioli in Washington and other Mexican officials. Ambassador Negroponte has raised the issue with high-level Mexican officials on a number of occasions, most recently on January 7. We understand that Senator Bingaman has written President-elect Clinton asking that he raise this issue with President Salinas during their meeting January 8 in Austin.

We talked to Embassy Mexico today to brief them on Domenici's call to the President. Ambassador Negroponte plans to raise this issue with the Mexicans again over the weekend or on Monday. We will keep you informed.

Dear Mr. President,

Thank you so much for your Christmas present. It is a wonderful photo that will always remind me of the unique experience I have had in serving you the past two years. As you directed I did not open it until Christmas morning. I was thrilled as was my family, especially my mother who couldn't believe that the President of the United States would send her son a Christmas gift. For that moment of happiness given to my mom I will be forever grateful.

It has been an honor and a privilege to serve you and your family. Your cooperation and consideration have certainly made my job easier. Words cannot describe the feeling of being associated with such a decent and dedicated person as yourself who truly exemplifies the principles that have made this country great. I know that each and every member of the detail has the highest respect and admiration for both you and Mrs. Bush. The manner in which you both have treated our agents have never been less than first class. I have witnessed this repeatedly since my first assignment to your detail as a candidate in the campaign of 1980 and continuing on through your Vice Presidency and Presidency. From the standpoint of the Secret Service you will be a tough act to follow!

We spoke on Air Force One in November about how you had lifted the burden of Vietnam from this country. I feel very inadequate in attempting to express how gratifying it was that you, and only you, included Vietnam veterans in your praise of the men and women who served in Desert Storm. It was a magnificent period for our armed forces and you expanded the triumph to include us. Not much was written about that but be assured that each veteran who heard you had a tear in his eye. I sincerely hope that history will remember you for what you did for the Vietnam veteran. We will never forget!

As a result of my strong feelings on this I would like to make a personal request. I have two medals that belong to Vietnam veterans and I am asking you to carry them with you from The White House to the Capitol on January 20, 1993.

The first and most important one is a Purple Heart awarded to my brother-in-law, Bill Ellis. Bill was an infantryman in the 5th

Mechanized Infantry Division. He was wounded in December, 1968, at the DMZ and spent seven months in a VA hospital. He is now fully recovered and a strong supporter of you and your principles.

The second medal is a Bronze Star with "V" device that was awarded to me on August 12, 1969, for action at Loc Ninh. I have not looked at it for over 20 years. Both Bill and I lost good friends in combat, as you did, and we feel that it would be an honor for us and all who did not return if you would carry these with you on your ride to the Capitol. To know that these medals accompanied you, The President of the United States who recognized the sacrifices and restored the pride of the Vietnam veteran, to the ceremony which continues our democratic process would be overwhelming. To me, because that President is you, George Bush, it would be even more special.

Thank you, Mr. President, for all you have done for the United States of America and may God richly bless you and your family in the coming years.

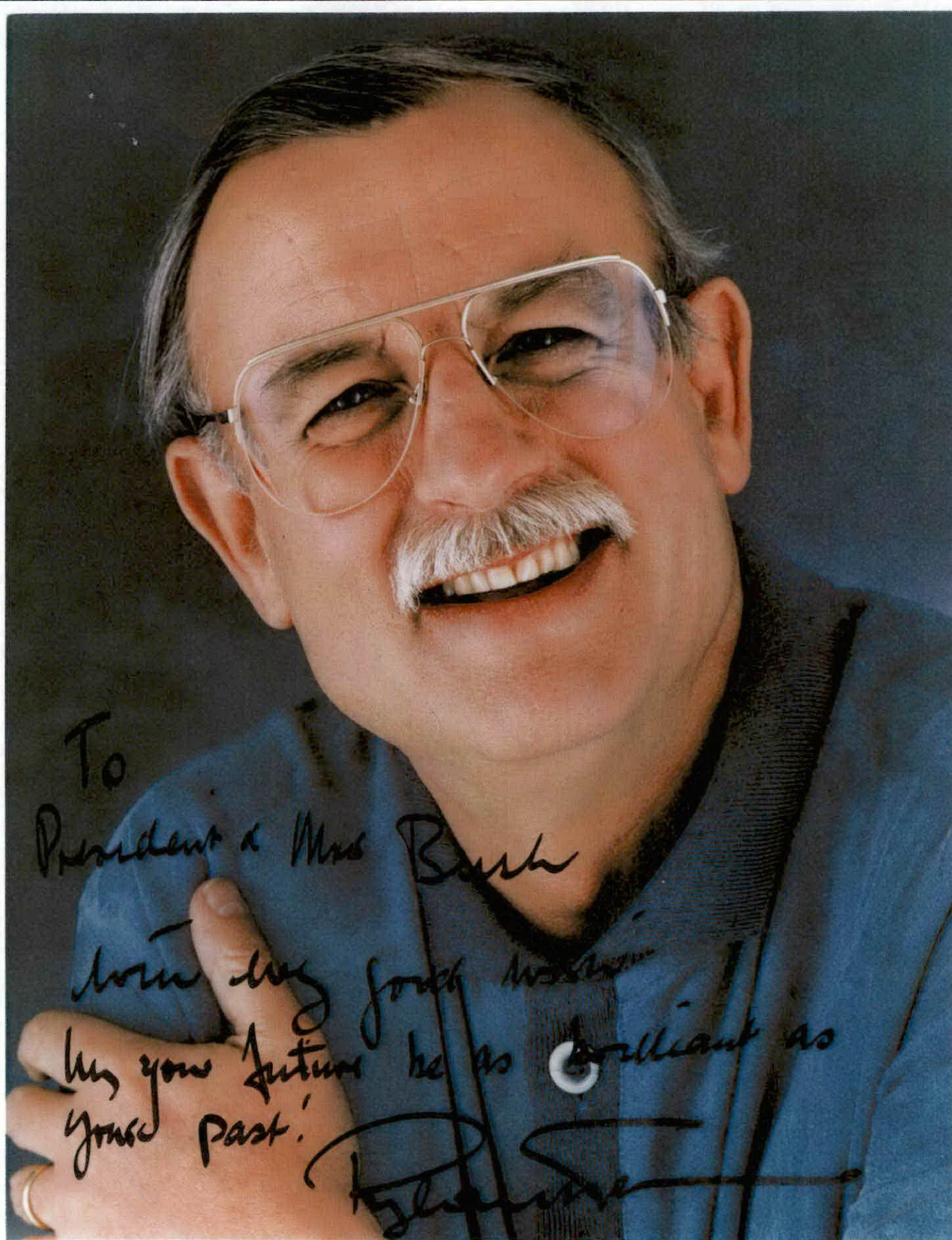

Also, please advise the Office of Independent Counsel of the specific steps taken by The White House to secure all materials responsive to this Subpoena, state when the steps were taken, and provide

copies of any written directives regarding document preservation and/or how to comply with this Subpoena.

D. The terms "materials," "documents," "records," or "files" as used in this Subpoena mean any recording of information, however made, whether formal or informal, and specifically include the original copy of the subpoenaed material, specifically including without limitation any altered, annotated, changed, or re-drafted forms of the following materials:

F. The conjunctions "and" and "or" are to be construed interchangeably in the manner that gives this Subpoena for documents the broadest reading.

G. If The White House or any official or employee of The White House has knowledge of any requested document that has been lost, destroyed, or discarded, please identify to the extent possible each such document and provide an explanation of the loss, destruction, or discarding (including identification of each person authorizing or having knowledge of the loss, destruction, or discarding).

H. If The White House or any official or employee thereof has withheld or withholds from production any relevant documents, files, or records, on the ground of the privilege against self-incrimination or any other privilege,

identify the person or entity asserting such privilege and what privilege is asserted. In the case of the invocation as to any relevant document of any privilege other than the privilege against self-incrimination, list each such document by date, type, addressee, author (and if different, the preparer and signatory), general subject matter, and indicated or known circulation. In addition, indicate the privilege asserted with respect to each such document in sufficient detail to facilitate a determination of the validity of the claim of privilege.

I. SUBJECT: President's Reference to Chinese Proverb

Bob Blackwell reports that during yesterday's briefing at the White House on Gorbachev's prospects, the President made reference to a Chinese proverb that conveyed the sense of standing aside while something important happened.

You might want to tell the President that the proverb in question, a favorite of former Chinese Premier Zhou En-lai's, is xiu shou pang guan. In Chinese it is written

袖手旁觀

The literal translation is bury your hands in your sleeves, stand aside and observe. (When a Chinese official covers his hands with his long sleeves, his hands become useless; he cannot act.) The proverb is usually translated in English as stand idly by.

Although the proverb is usually used in the negative to mean that one must not stand idly by or fail to act, the President yesterday used it in the positive to mean that one should stand idly by, there being no appropriate course of action. Zhou En-lai would have understood.
