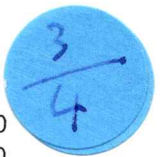

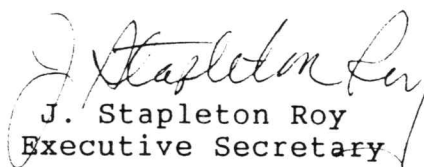

Heads of State Correspondence Summary

PRES NOTED SUMMARY

President Endara of Panama - June 4, 1990
(Received June 21)

President Endara commends you for your vision and attitude as a genuine statesman who has known how to respond with intelligence and sound judgement in this new era of world relations. He hopes that Panama will aspire to a decorous and useful position in this changing world and offers his support and good will to the U.S.

President Mitterrand of France - Not Dated
(Received June 20)

President Mitterrand acknowledges your May 24 letter concerning relations with China. He notes that the human rights situation in Vietnam is no worse than in China and asks that you consider a more open attitude towards the Vietnamese association with the International Financial Institutions (IFI).

(NSC staff comment: The 1989 State Department Report on Human Rights paints a very bleak picture on Vietnam. Moreover, the major condition to a change of U.S. policy is premised on Vietnam's participation in a comprehensive peace plan for Cambodia - which has not been forthcoming.)

PRES NOTED SUMMARY

The Summit of Washington and Camp David opens new hopes for a stable world at peace, where the creativity and genius of man can better dedicate itself to achieve the welfare and progress of our peoples. With the end to the cold war and a renewed relationship between the superpowers, the world breathes fresh airs of a transcendental change which augurs a new era in world relations. It does not matter that there still remain issues to resolve, such as the independence of the Lithuanian people, the role of a reunified Germany, or the rights of the Palestinian and Israeli peoples; the important thing is that the process of negotiation which was announced at Malta has begun in earnest now and will be converted in a permanent process to achieve the mutual understanding and a greater closeness tomorrow and always.

In the name of the people and the Government of Panama, please receive our recognition for your vision and attitude of a genuine statesman who has known how to respond with intelligence and sound judgment to the historic moment which is being lived not only by the United States and the Soviet Union but also by the nations of all continents.

Panama aspires to occupy a decorous and useful position in the world which is being created, and you and the American people can count on our support and good will.
