THE PRESIDENT HAS SEEN

TALKING POINTS FOR THE PRESIDENT'S MEETING
WITH THE CONFERENCE OF PRESIDENTS
OF MAJOR JEWISH ORGANIZATIONS

- I am glad to have this opportunity to meet with you again. Let me say at the outset that U.S.-Israel relations remain strong and close. We have a solid friendship based on shared values and goals--democracy, a secure Israel, peace in the Middle East.
- It is essential to maintain Israel's strength through economic and military assistance. Now I know you've heard a lot of speculation about this recently--but just read my budget. Our aid request for Israel is \$3 billion for FY91.
- We're hard at work on the peace process--one based upon Prime Minister Shamir's proposals. We think there is a good chance to get to a meeting of the three foreign ministers soon, setting the stage for a historic meeting between Israelis and Palestinians.
- Let me reassure you. No one is going to pressure Israel to sit down opposite anyone it does not want to--including the PLO.
- Moreover, we are pushing Arab governments to support this process--by repealing the odious "Zionism is Racism" resolution, by ending the economic boycott of Israel, and by stopping efforts to get the so-called "state of Palestine" into UN agencies.

- Let me mention another development of enormous importance, Soviet Jewry. For years everyone of us in this room worked to open the gates for Jews to be free to leave the Soviet Union.
- For Israel, the result is of historic importance, and as friends of Israel, the United States and my Administration want to share in helping Israel absorb its new citizens. But our ability to help will depend upon Israeli policy. It is U.S. policy that our money cannot be used, directly or indirectly, to resettle people into the territories occupied by Israel in 1967.
- It would be a terrible irony that this should become an issue between us after American Jews, successive U.S. administrations, and Israel worked so hard to give these people their freedom. We must work to insure this does not happen. I ask for your help.
- There is the related issue of settlements. My view is simple: settlement activity makes it tougher to pursue the peace process. It should stop. We have a real chance to make lasting peace in the Middle East. This must remain our priority.

As you know, President Bush is scheduled to meet with the leaders of the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations this Monday, February 5, at 1:30 p.m. It is important that he use the occasion to underscore our objections to Israel settling people in the occupied territories. It is also important to keep in mind that this meeting comes less than 48 hours before the Likud conference in Israel. Needless to say, we should try to avoid saying anything that will give ammunition to those trying to undermine the peace process.

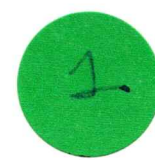

Deputy Foreign Minister Netanyahu: The collapse of the Soviet empire is good news for Israel. (U)

Robert Gates: It could create some bad news too. (U)

Deputy Foreign Minister Netanyahu: True. It could create regional instability. (U)

Robert Gates: It is also producing great anti-semitism. (U)

Deputy Foreign Minister Netanyahu: You're right. It is all tied to Soviet emigration, which I wanted to talk with you about. The Arabs are confusing the issue. They have long campaigned to stop immigration to Israel. Their efforts started with the British in 1922, surfaced again in 1936 at the time of the first intifada, and they tried again in the early 1950s. In 1982 they passed a UN resolution opposing immigration; Fatah created a special committee on it. Now they have reacted to the Prime Minister's statement. They say they are focusing on the [occupied] territories, but they keep getting it wrong. They are exaggerating the problem of displacement [of Arab families]. The Arabs are trying to use the 1/2% that are going into the territories to stop the other 99-1/2%. Claims that we have a policy of directing people to the territories are wrong. Incentives are as much or more to direct people elsewhere, to development towns. You have to decide what your policy will be. If you follow the lead of the EC -- that Israel should offer no encouragement for settling them in the territories -- then there will be no problem. But we hope you do not go so far as to ask us not to allow settlement, which we cannot do. We have a policy

of free choice now; our effort to direct people into the development towns was a mistake. The Arabs are confusing the issues, and are using immigration and settlements to get at the territories. (C)

Robert Gates: I am not aware that there is any conflict between us regarding immigration per se. My understanding is that we disagree over settlements. And there is no disagreement between us over Soviet immigration. (C)

Deputy Foreign Minister Netanyahu: I fear people will use the 1/2% to get at the 99-1/2%. I hope there is no U.S. parallel to what the Europeans have done. Immigration to Israel is the lifeline of Zionism. Indeed, it is our two governments that have the greatest stake in Gorbachev's future. I am worried over the rise in anti-semitism in the Soviet Union. My concern is that people want to stop emigration and use it to affect the political process. (C)

Robert Gates: You are right to want to move the maximum number of people out of the Soviet Union as soon as you can. I remain pessimistic regarding perestroika. There is a window now; no one knows how long it will last. As we have seen, a lot of good can happen, but we need to move to exploit this opportunity. As we saw in 1975 when Jewish emigration slowed to a trickle, things can change for the worse quickly. As for the Soviet Union itself, I see Gorbachev as having four basic problems:

- Political reform has far outrun economic improvement, and there is no evidence that the economy will catch up;
- the nationalities issue, where Gorbachev does not have time to create a voluntary federation and where there is no political culture of voluntary association;
- he has destroyed the party and existing structures before developing replacements, resulting in chaos and despair; and
- the history of Russia suggests a cultural backwardness that will make any reform process difficult. In short, Gorbachev is moving too fast politically and not fast enough economically. (C)

Deputy Foreign Minister Netanyahu: For Israel, the number one issue is Jewish emigration. We already have benefitted from the lifting of the political embargo. The Soviets will sooner or later resume diplomatic relations with us without preconditions. We will restore relations with all of Eastern Europe except Albania. The Arab political boycott is increasingly failing. Israel now has relations with some 80 countries out of 160; in a few years we will have relations with 130. The Arabs see the tide of history not moving in their direction. The demographic impact of immigration, the end to Israel's political isolation, the loss of Soviet backing -- all are hurting the Arabs and

causing trepidation in the Arab world. They will try to mount increasing pressure to stop immigration and ram through the idea of a PLO state. (S)

Richard Haass: I agree that both the immigration and the political trends offer a great opportunity to Israel. But our concern is that Israel could squander both, by settling people in the territories occupied in 1967 and by not moving forward on the peace process. (S)

Deputy Foreign Minister Netanyahu: The demographic and political realities are such that you cannot stop the immigrants going to Jerusalem. As for the peace process, we have a plan, but for people on the West Bank, not Tunis. We see the campaign of terror by the PLO as the biggest threat to the process. This terror now accounts for 2/3 of the fatalities of the intifada. The PLO is not interested in elections but in the selection of PLO puppets. People in Israel will go along with elections so long as they are seen as real and not just approving a PLO slate. A successful election will require security so that there is no terrorism. We want to see the extension of democracy in the territories. We see this as the key to conflict resolution. There will be support in Israel for a real election. (S)

I also wanted to talk about something else. Russia will not become another Soviet Union. The era of the superpowers mutually policing regional arrangements is gone. Below the five or so great powers there will be many others with real strength. There is a real problem of proliferation in the Middle East. As we have seen, many lack inhibition; the Iran-Iraq war is a premonition. Iraq might have used nuclear weapons against Iran if we had not attacked them in 1981 and if they had developed nuclear weapons. We are entering a less stable world. The United States will retain an interest in oil and the sea lanes. There is also Islamic fundamentalism to worry about. We need as a result to rethink strategic cooperation. We need new terms of reference for a changed world, a world without a Soviet superpower. We need to reorient strategic cooperation to these tasks and encourage new concepts. The pressure to cut resources will grow, but there is a lot that we can do for one another. (S)

Robert Gates: This is all worth thinking about. The world will certainly get more complicated. I wish I could say that our effort to slow proliferation was more successful. Indeed, proliferation has become the best argument for SDI. I am also worried about what is taking place in the Soviet Union and the danger of instability there. Morale in the armed forces is low, and they have made few preparations for demobilization. Soviet military leaders are complaining publicly. All this raises some real command and control issues. (S)

Richard Haass: I am glad to hear what you say about strategic cooperation. For too long we have focused on programs and ignored concepts. Both countries could benefit from some rethinking. (S)

Benjamin Netanyahu ("Bibi") usually plunges into a meeting with gusto. With you, he could cover any one of a number of points, including developments in the Soviet Union and Eastern Europe, Soviet Jewish immigration to Israel, U.S. assistance to the resettlement of Soviet Jews, and terrorism (i.e., PLO transgressions of its commitments).

We doubt that Netanyahu will dwell on the peace process, since Arens is holding it closely. If, however, he does raise the issue, then you should observe that most of the pieces in the puzzle appear to have come together for a foreign ministers trilateral, leading to the Israeli-Palestinian dialogue. We would like to see Israel moving expeditiously to give us a green light for the trilateral.

It is important to leave him with a clear sense of our position -- and the President's personal views -- on Soviet Jewish immigration and settlement activity. The logic chain is as follows:

- The United States welcomes the opening of the doors in the Soviet Union. We want to share in this historic moment with Israel, the destination of many emigrants.
- However, we oppose any settlement activity in the territories occupied since 1967.
- We do not think that anyone, particularly Soviet Jews, should go to these areas and we will not contribute any resources for resettlement of Soviet Jews that could be used beyond the "Green Line" of pre-67 Israel.

-- The best thing would be for Israel to stop settlement. Another step would be to state that none of these immigrants will be settled in these territories.

If Netanyahu raises the Leahy/Kasten bill to provide \$400 million in Housing Investment Guarantees (HIG) for Soviet Jews, then you should respond that we would like to support assistance to Israel, but these other policy considerations are equally important to the President. We will, at a minimum, oppose any aid that could be used to fund their settlement in the territories occupied in 1967.

Finally, Netanyahu will probably hammer away again at the PLO's involvement in terrorism, possibly asserting that a senior Palestinian Islamic Jihad leader is operating in Amman, Jordan. (The Palestinian Islamic Jihad claimed responsibility for the Ismailiya bus attack earlier this month). If Bibi mentions this, you could put your intelligence hat on for a moment and observe to him that Israel has adequate ability to make its concerns known directly to Jordan.

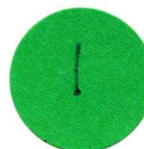

SUBJECT: U.S. Statements on Jerusalem

We have made the following statements concerning Jerusalem in the aftermath of your statement March 3 about U.S. policy that there should be no new settlements in the West Bank or East Jerusalem:

- The March 5 White House statement after the Reich phone call stated that "The President also made clear U.S. support for Jews as well as others to live there in the context of a negotiated settlement."
- The March 13 letter to Teddy Kollek did not specifically speak to the issue of Jews living in Jerusalem, but noted that "We did not approve of the status quo before 1967; in no way do we advocate a return to it now."
- -- The March 20 letter to Rudy Boschwitz said that "No peace that I can envision would deny Jews the right to live anywhere in this special city of Jerusalem."
- Jim Baker wrote to Representative Mel Levine March 22 that "Clearly, Jews and others can live where they want, East or West, and the city must remain undivided."

The difference between the language in the Levine letter and the other statements is the absence in the former of any qualification of the right of Jews to live anywhere in Jerusalem in "the context of a negotiated settlement" or implicitly "peace." Our goal at this point ought to be to discourage the notion that the administration is speaking with two voices, but to do so in a manner that does not undermine our position in the peace process.

There is a distinction here between the status of the city, the right of anyone (Jews and Arabs) to live there, and application of that right in the run-up to negotiations. The basic elements of our position are: Jerusalem should not be divided and its

final status should be decided in negotiations; in advance of those negotiations, no party should prejudice them by unilateral acts. In this sense, while we agree to the right of Jews and others to live anywhere in the city, the exercise of that right can present problems for the peace process, e.g., when Jews move into "settlements" built on confiscated or expropriated Arab land in East Jerusalem.

The issue, therefore, is how to bridge the formulation in the Levine letter with what we have said previously. There are three options:

- Let the dust settle: If we leave the statements as they are, the problem is that the Baker-Levine exchange comes out looking more forthcoming than the White House statements. Furthermore, the concern in the Jewish community may not abate, with the problem that attention will stay on this issue instead of on the peace process where it belongs.
- Echo the Levine letter language: This would be a step back for the Administration, one that would be met with outrage in the Arab world. (I even doubt it would fully soothe Israelis or their backers in this country given their almost existential mistrust of this administration.) Also, if we articulate an unqualified right for Jews and others to ~~live~~ live anywhere in Jerusalem, this could be interpreted in the future as acceptance of the status quo in East Jerusalem.
- A compromise: We could state that "Because it has long been our policy that Jerusalem must remain united and undivided, with its eventual status to be decided in negotiations, it follows that Jews and others have the right to live anywhere in the city. At the same time, we believe that interests of peace ought to be paramount. No party (including the government of Israel) should do anything in advance of negotiations that would prejudice either getting to those negotiations or their outcome."

I favor this last approach. That said, we should not delude ourselves. It will not end the debate, for it will not satisfy those who want nothing less than an unqualified statement of support for the right of Jews to live anywhere in a Jerusalem forever controlled by Israel. Still, it should calm things somewhat and narrow the gap between our stated position and that of Jim Baker's in a manner all should be able to live with.

If we decide to make a further statement on this issue, there are several ways to go about doing it. We could answer an outstanding letter from Seymour Reich on the subject. You could address the issue in remarks to the press, perhaps in response to a question we would encourage someone to ask. Or, Jim Baker could make such a statement, and you could endorse it.

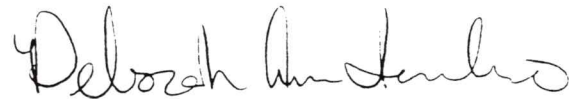

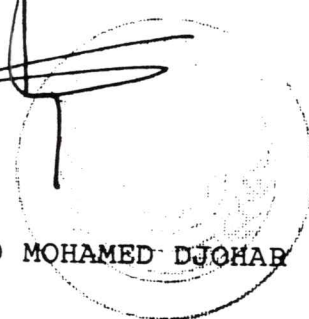
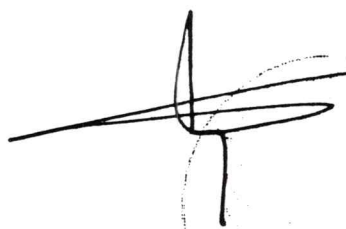

- Your Majesty, I wanted to ring you to express my thanks for the kindness you showed to Senator Dole (and my Labor Secretary) and his colleagues. As always, the Jordanians were great hosts!
- In talking with Bob about his trip, it seems to have helped to ease the tension a bit in the area. I think everyone should do the maximum to cool down rhetoric.
- We are telling the Iraqis that they also must work to create an environment in which our relations can improve; the recent events have hurt, but we can still recover if they help. We are not engaged in a conspiracy against Saddam, but we are justifiably concerned with his words and actions.
- I have just received your letter of April 9. I appreciate your thoughtful remarks. These are very serious matters, and I hope to send you a considered response soon.
- I know, Your Majesty, of the Arab sensitivities on this score; and, I know of Jordan's special interests. Rest assured, I also know what our policy has been since 1967. My views on this subject are firm.
- Things are going slowly in Israel. Just the same, I think the best approach is to be careful and restrained while they get their act together, and then we want to press forward with the peace process. The key is to keep the focus on moving to peace negotiations.

SUBJECT: Telephone Call to King Hussein of Jordan

We understand that the President would like to telephone King Hussein this weekend to thank him for the courtesies shown to Senator Dole and colleagues during their visit.

A call would be timely for several reasons. King Hussein wrote to the President on April 9 concerning Israeli settlement activity (Tab B). As you know, King Hussein has been greatly worried over the possibility of Soviet Jews moving into settlements anywhere in the territories occupied in 1967. In addition, Hussein expects to visit the United States for some U.N. business in late September/early October; he has given very strong hints that he would welcome an opportunity to see the President around October 2-3.

It would be useful for the President to address these issues in the phone call. In particular, we suggest that the President invite the King to Washington during his early October visit. Regarding the letter on settlements, we suggest that the President say that a considered reply will be forthcoming soon, but that he is very conscious of the sensitivity of the issue for the Arabs and for Jordan in particular.

RECOMMENDATION

That you sign the Telephone Call Proposal to the President at Tab I.

TALKING POINTS FOR CALL TO EGYPTIAN PRESIDENT MUBARAK

--Hosni, I just wanted to call and wish you a very happy birthday. Both Barbara and I wish you all the best in the year to come.

--I am glad your birthday has come along now, as I wanted to speak to you in any event. It has been too long since our last conversation.

--Thank you for your recent letter. [note: letter dealt with Iraq, Jerusalem, Egyptian proposal for ridding Middle East of weapons of mass destruction] I will be responding soon.

--I would be very interested in getting your assessment of Assad and your visit to Syria.

--Assad has been quite helpful in getting the hostages out. I would appreciate hearing anything you might have to add on this.

--Otherwise, we remain committed to reviving the peace process as soon as we have an Israeli government to work with. Until then I am afraid we will have to be patient.

--I gather you are heading off in a few days to both Beijing and Moscow. I would love to have your impressions when you return.
