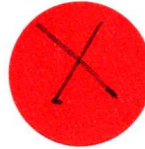

Eric reports that the interagency coordination process on Desert Storm burdensharing has broken down because of serious disputes among the agencies about the leadership and mandate of the group you asked be established at the meeting on January 24. Consequently, we have made little or no progress since then in confirming the data for 1990. According to the other agencies, Treasury wants to run the whole show, including policy formulation which is the responsibility of your group. Under these circumstances, State, DOD and OMB are not cooperating. DOD is not attending the meetings Treasury has called and is not sharing its data on costs.

Against this background, we understood Kimmitt may propose NSC chairmanship of a technical working group to carry out the work on the grounds of NSC "impartiality."

We need to clear up this matter today, and it's probably best to let each agency speak their piece first before you lower the boom.

The suggested agenda then is:

- Mandate and Responsibility of Technical Group
- Status of 1991 Contributions for Desert Storm with particular focus on Japan (i.e., the debate about whether Japanese funds are for the U.S. military or the MNF).
- Possible Approaches to Other Countries
- Coordination of Hill Testimony

A Treasury fact sheet on burdensharing is attached at Tab I. I will have it ready for distribution, but did not do so in advance because of the interagency disputes and the inherent references to them in the paper.

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Gulf Military Financing: Unresolved Issues

- Shaded numbers in attached table highlight issues.
- Saudi 1990 commitment: Total of \$2.8 billion includes an estimated \$1 billion for en route transport expenses since start of second deployment. DOD would prefer to show \$1.8 billion.
- Japan 1990 commitment: \$1.7 billion amount is the approximate US share of the total Japanese commitment of \$2.0 billion. It excludes about \$0.3 billion which has been allocated to other purposes. The process by which this allocation was done is not clear and needs to be clarified to avoid further problems with the Japanese \$9 billion commitment.
- In-kind 1990 disbursements: Amounts are based on DOD valuations. No consistent methodology for valuation has been shared with other agencies.
- 1990 disbursement pipeline: It is not clear that US agencies have adequate information about the current status of these items.
- Japanese 1991 commitment: Although the Japanese commitment was \$9 billion for the US, Japan now has switched signals and indicated that some will go to other countries. Efforts are underway to clarify/resolve this matter.
- US 1991 contribution: Table implicitly assumes that US appropriation request will be made for \$5.5 billion, which is 10% US share of \$55 billion in assumed incremental costs for the first quarter of 1991. This needs to be firmed up.
