PRES NOTED SUMMARY

Budapest, " " November 1990

Dear Mr. President,

On our return from the visit to the United States, my wife and I wish to express our sincere thanks to you and Mrs. Bush for the very special attention and warm hospitality you showed to us. We were very deeply impressed and honoured by your goodwill, which at the same time expressed the solidarity of the American people with the aspirations of the Hungarian people and their sincere desire to help us.

It is my hope that the United States of America and the Republic of Hungary have become historical allies.

The experiences of my visit and the substantive talks conducted with heads of the American Administration have convinced me that the Republic of Hungary, which has set itself the lofty goal of consolidating the democratic achievements, and its freely elected Government can continue to count on the selfless support of the American people. Never in the course of history have the official relations between our countries been so extensive. The results of my visit have demonstrated that the possibilities for the further development of our relations are inexhaustible.

It is my firm conviction that with the support of the United States and Western Europe we have a good chance of achieving economic advancement and creating internal political stability. The recent political crisis in Hungary, the taxi-drivers' blockade, has finally made people aware of the gravity of the crisis and at the same time has also drawn the attention of the Western world to the social tension I have so often stressed and which is inevitably accompanying the transition to a market economy. The main reason in my opinion is that the developments connected with the Gulf crisis have made the stability of the Hungarian economy extremely fragile.

I would like to thank you, Mr. President, for the many-sided medical assistance you were so kind as to offer for the restoration of my temporarily deteriorated health. I will take advantage of the possibility if it should become necessary. However, I trust that the excellent doctors treating me here in Hungary have been successful, as I am practically able to handle a full load of work. (As was officially announced, my illness has been diagnosed as non-Hodgkin's lymphoma and not leukemia as some news agencies have claimed.)

Once again thanking you for the cordial welcome, allow me, Mr. President, to express my hope that we will continue our valuable talks in the near future either in Budapest or somewhere else should the occasion arise. Please also permit me to come back on some aspects of the problems of this region in a separate letter at a later stage.

The President: Helmut! How are you, my friend? (U)

Chancellor Kohl: Very good, thank you. Are you in California?
(U)

The President: Yes, out doing some politics, just ahead of our
Congressional elections. (U)

Chancellor Kohl: Good luck. (U)

The President: Thank you very much. I am calling on a couple of
things. First, I was very pleased with your reaction to Saddam
Hussein's propaganda ploy with the hostages. He is handing these
people out. Your strong position sets the right example. (U)

Chancellor Kohl: I will not give in. Tomorrow we will discuss
this at the EC Summit. I will make sure we arrive at a just
principle, and also ensure that all of us ask for the release of
all hostages, not just our own nationals. Any idea how things
are going? (U)

The President: We believe that the sanctions are starting to
work, and now more than ever we need to stand united and firm for
an unconditional withdrawal. (U)

Chancellor Kohl: I am wondering whether we shouldn't
internationally increase the pressure concerning the hostages.
(U)

The President: I agree -- perhaps through the UN. And the UN should take action on reparations. He is holding hostages and also embassies. (C)

Chancellor Kohl: I wonder tomorrow at the EC Summit if we could make some urgent statement demanding the immediate release of all hostages. (C)

The President: That's a good idea. On another matter, we are trying to keep the Israel matter separate from the issue of the Gulf, in order not to break up the coalition we have on the Gulf issue. Saddam Hussein is trying to mix the two together. My concern is that if the EC calls for a conference on Palestine, it will have the result of breaking the coalition on the Gulf and of emphasis being shifted to an old issue that has been around for a long time. Of course we have to resolve that issue as well, but we should not mix it up with the Gulf. (C)

Chancellor Kohl: I won't do it. Once we have gotten over the Iraq crisis, we have to take the next step and do something about the Palestinian Question. (C)

The President: Exactly. I am not ruling out an international conference, but not now. (C)

Chancellor Kohl: I'll represent matters tomorrow accordingly, in the way we have talked. At a later time we will have to tackle the Palestinian Question. (C)

The President: I agree. One other thing: following our telephone conversation, I sent a letter on the Uruguay Round. I know it is complicated for you, but I hope you will look into it. We have to have agreement at that Round. (C)

Chancellor Kohl: I got the letter today, George. I read it with a great level of attention. My position is that we Germans are very interested in a successful GATT round -- interested because we are big exporters, interested for reasons of the Third World, and also interested because we support free trade. Our problem is that the issue has to be resolved within the EC. Today we talked about this with the British Foreign Secretary. I told him we will have to work hard on that in November, because there is no way to delay the December deadline. The issue is very difficult for us because of difficulties for German farmers, but I am going to try to arrive at a sensible middle ground. I will give it my personal attention. Last night there was a meeting in Brussels of the six Christian Democratic heads of government in the EC. We agreed that the six of us would work together. But

we don't want to do this in Rome. We have to make preparations. But I am fully aware of all your problems and will surely call you within the next 10 days. (C)

The President: Thank you. I think we are thinking broadly together. I don't know where we stand on my trip, but I look forward to seeing you soon. (C)

Chancellor Kohl: I am looking forward very much, too. I will see you soon, and before that I will definitely be in touch. (C)

The President: Thank you.

DEAR HELMUT,

CONGRATULATIONS AGAIN ON YOUR SPLENDID AND HISTORIC VICTORY.
I ENJOYED OUR CONVERSATION ON SUNDAY.

LET ME THANK YOU ONCE MORE FOR YOUR WONDERFUL HOSPITALITY
DURING MY VISIT TO SPEYER AND LUDWIGSHAFEN. I WAS GLAD TO HAVE
THE CHANCE TO JOIN YOU IN CELEBRATING GERMAN UNITY AND ALSO TO

I WANT TO FOLLOW UP ON OUR DISCUSSION ON THE URUGUAY ROUND,
BECAUSE THIS IS ONE MATTER THAT CANNOT WAIT. I KNOW THAT THESE
ISSUES, ESPECIALLY AGRICULTURE, ARE SENSITIVE FOR THE COMMUNITY
AND FOR YOU PERSONALLY, BUT WE ARE NOW AT A POINT WHERE WE MUST
BREAK THE DEADLOCK SOON OR RISK A FAILURE OF THE URUGUAY ROUND.

WE SHOULD NOT UNDERESTIMATE THE STAKES. A FAILURE OF THE
URUGUAY ROUND COULD CAUSE A FAILURE OF THE WORLD TRADING SYSTEM.
THE ECONOMIC PROSPERITY OF OUR COUNTRIES AND THE ECONOMIC
VIABILITY OF THE NEW DEMOCRACIES AND THE DEVELOPING WORLD ARE

THREATENED. WITH TIME RUNNING SHORT. GERMANY AND THE UNITED STATES NEED TO TAKE THE LEAD IN PREVENTING THIS.

ON OUR SIDE, WE ARE TRYING TO MOVE IN A POSITIVE DIRECTION. LAST WEEK I SIGNED A FARM BILL CALLING FOR THE ELIMINATION OF AROUND \$13 BILLION IN SUBSIDIES OVER A FIVE YEAR PERIOD. THIS IS TIED THROUGH LEGISLATION TO OUR ABILITY TO ACHIEVE A POSITIVE OUTCOME IN THE URUGUAY ROUND. WE DO NOT WANT TO REINSTITUTE THOSE SUBSIDIES BUT WOULD HAVE NO CHOICE IF THE ROUND FAILS. AND I MIGHT ADD THAT OUR FARMERS ARE AS AGITATED AS GERMAN OR FRENCH FARMERS ABOUT THIS ISSUE.

WE KNOW THE EFFORT IT TOOK THE EC TO PUT FORWARD A POSITION ON AGRICULTURE, BUT WHAT IS ON THE TABLE NOW IS FAR REMOVED FROM WHAT WE AGREED AT HOUSTON WOULD BE NEEDED TO BRING THE ROUND TO A SUCCESSFUL CONCLUSION. AT A MINIMUM, THE EC NEGOTIATING POSITION MUST INCLUDE SPECIFIC COMMITMENTS ON MARKET ACCESS, INTERNAL SUPPORTS, AND EXPORT SUBSIDIES. ANYTHING LESS WILL PRECLUDE AN AGREEMENT.

FRANCOIS AND I HAD A GOOD DISCUSSION OF THESE ISSUES IN PARIS, BUT HE GAVE NO SPECIFIC ASSURANCES. INDEED, I HAVE JUST LEARNED FROM OUR TRADE REPRESENTATIVE THAT THE FRENCH POSITION ON

AGRICULTURE APPEARS TO HAVE HARDENED, AND THAT THIS IMPASSE COULD BLOCK PROGRESS IN OTHER AREAS AS THE FINAL WEEK OF TALKS BEGINS IN BRUSSELS. THE DEADLOCK CAN BE BROKEN ONLY BY EC AGREEMENT TO REDUCE EXPORT SUBSIDIES AND TO BEGIN TO OPEN UP EC MARKETS. YOUR LEADERSHIP WILL BE THE KEY, AND I HOPE YOU CAN TAKE STEPS AS SOON AS POSSIBLE TO PERSUADE THE COMMUNITY, ESPECIALLY FRANCE, TO UNBLOCK THE COMMISSION'S NEGOTIATING POSITION AND AGREE TO REAL COMMITMENTS IN THE THREE AREAS I MENTIONED.

I APPRECIATE YOUR PERSONAL INVOLVEMENT IN THIS, HELMUT. BAR JOINS ME IN SENDING WARM REGARDS TO YOU AND HANNELORE AND OUR THANKS FOR YOUR KIND HOSPITALITY. AGAIN, WE ARE ALL DELIGHTED

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT TO CHANCELLOR KOHL VIA SKIPPER CHANNEL
(TO BE SENT AFTER THE PRESIDENT'S 12/2/90 TELCON WITH KOHL)

Dear Helmut,

Thank you again for your splendid hospitality during my visit to Speyer and Ludwigshafen. I was glad to have the chance to join you in celebrating German unity and also to have a more extended discussion than we have had for a while.

I want to follow up on our discussion on the Uruguay Round, because this is one matter which cannot wait. I know that these issues, especially agriculture, are sensitive for the Community and for you personally, but we are now at a point where we must break the deadlock soon or risk a failure of the Uruguay Round.

We should not underestimate the stakes. A failure of the Uruguay Round could cause a failure of the world trading system. The economic prosperity of our countries and the economic viability of the new democracies and the developing world are threatened. With time running short, Germany and the United States need to take the lead in preventing this.

On our side, we are trying to move in a positive direction. Last week I signed a farm bill calling for the elimination of around \$13 billion in subsidies over a five year period. This is tied through legislation to our ability to achieve a positive outcome in the Uruguay Round. We do not want to reinstitute those subsidies but would have no choice if the Round fails. And I might add that our farmers are as agitated as German or French farmers about this issue.

Francois and I had a good discussion of these issues in Paris, but he gave no specific assurances. Your leadership will be the key, and I hope you can take steps as soon as possible to persuade the Community, especially France, to agree to real commitments in the three areas I mentioned.

I want to follow up on our discussion on the Uruguay Round, because this is one matter which cannot wait. I know that these issues, especially agriculture, are sensitive for the Community and for you personally, but we are now at a point where we must break the deadlock soon or risk a failure of the Uruguay Round.

We should not underestimate the stakes. A failure of the Uruguay Round could cause a failure of the world trading system. The economic prosperity of our countries and the economic viability of the new democracies and the developing world are threatened. With time running short, Germany and the United States need to take the lead in preventing this.

On our side, we are trying to move in a positive direction. Last week I signed a farm bill calling for the elimination of around \$13 billion in subsidies over a five year period. SUBJECT: Letter to President Hraoui of Lebanon

Purpose

To send a letter reaffirming U.S. policy toward Lebanon and support for the Taif process, via our new Ambassador, Ryan Crocker.

Background

Political and security conditions have improved in East Beirut now that Aoun is out and the militias are pulling back. Accordingly, we are considering returning our Embassy. A small security team is heading out to evaluate whether conditions will permit arrival of our new Ambassador, Ryan Crocker, so that he can present credentials to President Hraoui. Subsequently, another judgment would be made about whether conditions permit reestablishment of the Embassy. We expect Crocker to make the trip for the credentials presentation within the next several days.

Return of the U.S. Ambassador will be very important symbolically in Lebanon, since many Lebanese -- particularly Christians -- felt that we abandoned Lebanon. A letter from you to President Hraoui that Crocker could deliver would heighten the impression that we are back in business, in support of the Taif process of national reconciliation that is underway. Reaffirmation of this role, and the specific language of the letter on our policy goals and support for Taif, would counter the argument that the United States has ceded to Syria a free hand in Lebanon.

SIGNED

With Aoun's ouster and the militias' pullbacks, political and security conditions have improved in East Beirut to the point where we can consider returning our official presence. Accordingly, State very soon will insert a small security team to evaluate the situation. Based upon their evaluation, the new U.S. Ambassador, Ryan Crocker, would arrive to present credentials to President Hraoui. Subsequently, together with the security team, Crocker will make recommendations about whether conditions permit the reestablishment of an Embassy. We expect Crocker to make the trip for the credentials presentation within the next several days. (State's proposed restaffing plan for the Embassy is at Tab II for your information.)

Return of the U.S. Ambassador will be very important symbolically in Lebanon, since many Lebanese -- particularly Christians -- felt that we abandoned Lebanon. A letter from the President to President Hraoui that Crocker could deliver would heighten the impression that we are back in business, in support of the Taif process of national reconciliation that is underway. Reaffirmation of this role, and the specific language of the letter on our policy goals and support for Taif, would counter the argument that the United States has ceded to Syria a free hand in Lebanon.

State has cleared the letter at Tab I. For Crocker to carry the letter, we need authorization from the President's party as soon as possible.

RECOMMENDATION

That you sign the memo to the President at Tab I, suggesting he sign the letter to President Hraoui at Tab A.

SUBJECT: Eagleburger Memorandum on Arms Sales to Taiwan

Larry Eagleburger has sent you a detailed info memorandum on two changes he has tentatively approved in how the Taiwan arms sales ceiling is calculated. He would like you to call him with your agreement informally.

I do not urge you to plow through the detailed but well-argued memo. The essential changes are:

- Changing the practice of arbitrarily reducing the ceiling for Taiwan by \$20 million each year in order to increase our flexibility in accounting for actual sales fluctuations.
- Removing spare parts and support services from the Taiwan entry in the annual Congressional Presentations Document (CPD), placing them in another part of the CPD called , "classified totals."

We should be able to weather successfully any Chinese response to these changes. As we discussed earlier, and as Larry recommends, we should not brief the PRC about this in advance.
