 - ICBM modernization
 - SDI
 - They are part of a larger issue of deterrence defense & strategic stability being dealt w/ in overall strategic review
- These issues singled out for budget reasons.

- ICBM issue has been w/us for over a decade
 - The heart of a issue is whether or not at least a portion of ICBM force should be ^{more} survivable & if so, how best to do that
 - Triad has existed to complicate Sors attack plans & hedge against failure
 - hitting ICBM leg wither celebrates that
 - while a prob does not warrant crash prog, abolishing triad is high risk
 - To maintain ICBM & promote strat. stability 2 progs are proposed
 - You have been briefed on a characteristics of RG & SLCM
 - The overwhelming discriminator is cost
 - If no cost differential, most would choose SLCM
 - But cost differential is large
 - 5.8 vs 23.6 for same # of warheads.
 - What does RG give
 - w/warning, good survivability
 - But requires several hours to generate

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- SICBM
 - ~~Must~~ Requires tactical or mutually no warning, depending on base location (Don't need decision now)
- Other differences (Hard no soft cost figures)
 - Flexibility of targeting (no BM single) w/o ^{SKP} BM
 - Distributing warheads (attractive targets)
 - SDI (Boost phase intercept vs decoys)
 - ~~Hot~~ production line
- Political
 - MX never very popular on Hill
 - Sold in '83 thru SICBM
 - Same attitudes remain tho diminished

- Decision required for budget = ^{can't get RG} RG don't end c
 - RG: SICBM or a mix. argument as ICSBM survival
 - Thinking not urgent w/in a FYDP, cost is equal, mix is twice as much

- Total cost of SICBM + mix about same

- SDI - There are really 4 options ^{Each has sub-options}
 - Defense dominant world - ^{we're pointing in that direction w/ 1st phase}
 - Protect point targets - ^{usual deployment options sub-options}
 - Accidental or 3rd world launch
 - R+D until we know more ^{the decision for budget purposes can be made}
- Today, all we need focus on is a major branch points - of which there are a main ones
 - ABM Treaty relevance, not here for today ^{is}
- The current prog points toward a def dominant world, w/ phase I deployment rising

- That prog (41 bil / 69 / 157) could be skipped
 - Or "trilliond pebbles" concept w/ or w/o layered defense
- A major branch point would be ICBM defense - cutting back on space based ^{upon} research 30/38/82
- A different branch system would be accidental layering
 - Maybe w/ in 100 launcher constraints of ABM Treaty
 - Near term. Cut back on much of a far out research 30/-/51
- Technology prog only
 - Do not point toward deployment
 - Explore tech, but w/o protected spending to exploit any promising breakthroughs.
- There is, of course, a high political content to SDI
 - You have expressed yourself in previous hearing terms about it.
 - Supporters of SICBM + SDI tend ~~not~~ to be mutually exclusive
 - ~~Some fear that~~ - Democrats vs Republicans
- Almost any budget figure you come up w/ can support any of a major alternatives
