SUBJECT: Status of Preparations for SNF Negotiations

The purpose of this memo is to give you a brief report on the status of our internal preparations for SNF negotiations, which we are committed to starting after the CFE agreement is signed.

Arnie chaired an interagency meeting Friday, July 27 to discuss a work program for developing initial U.S. positions on the major issues we will have to address first. Based on the discussion and agreement at that meeting, an NSC tasking memorandum (Tab I) was sent to all agencies requiring the formation of interagency task forces (led by the primary agency concerned) and the drafting of papers dealing with the principal issues. Task forces have been formed and the first drafts of the required papers have been circulated. We plan to hold NSC-chaired reviews of the task force work, starting this week, to prepare issues for senior level decisions. The first big issues are likely to be related to how to handle air-delivered systems and nuclear artillery, geographic zones for various systems included, and allied owned (especially French and British) systems.

We have agreement in NATO to use the U.S.-chaired Special Consultative Group (SCG) as the primary mechanism for consultation among Alliance members on SNF issues. We have notified NATO that we will convene the first meeting of the SCG in September (probably the week of the 17th or shortly thereafter because of other NATO meetings already scheduled before then). That meeting of the SCG provides a bench mark for our preparations. It would be logical to present to our allies at that point a comprehensive briefing on Red-Blue data, our views on likely Soviet objectives and approaches, and a draft work program. Later meetings would address tougher issues, such as what systems should be included and geographic zones.
