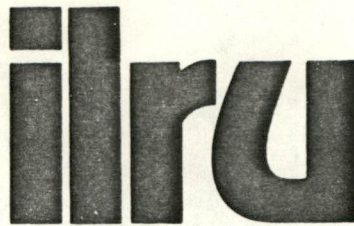

Dear Mr. Frieden:

We have just completed arrangements for the Developmental Disabilities Planning Council Conference on New Options for New Mexico in Alternative Community Residential Programs. I am enclosing the conference brochure. The conference will last approximately two days, from the evening of March 13 to noon on March 15, rather than the 2½ days we discussed earlier. Can I assume we will cover your consultation fee of \$200 per day for 2 rather than 2½ days?

The conference will open with an address by Gunnar Dybwad on Thursday evening. On Friday and Saturday, you and other invited speakers will be presenting. We are scheduling speakers for an hour's presentation, to include time for a few questions from the audience. Following his or her presentation, each speaker will meet with those participants desiring an opportunity for additional discussion. After your small group meeting, which will coincide with a presentation by another speaker, you would join the large group to participate in the on-going discussion. On Saturday morning (11:00 - 12:00) we have scheduled a wrap-up hour of discussion among all the speakers to address issues that have surfaced during the conference related to New Mexico's particular needs. The conference will end at 12:45 p.m. on Saturday with the last 45 minutes devoted to a participant exercise, so that you would be able to leave by noon.

As you will note in the brochure, we have listed the topics we would like you to address: models of residential and non-residential community programs for the physically handicapped; serving the severely physically handicapped in the community. I hope these topics are general enough to give you leeway to present on issues you feel most relevant.

During our planning, a number of people mentioned that your video-tape presentation shown at a workshop last year in Texas gave an excellent overview of programs. Would you want to use this video-tape presentation? If so, would it be best utilized as part of your presentation, or should it be available as part of the audio-visual program which will be on-going throughout the conference?

An hour may not be sufficient to permit showing of the video-tape and presentation of additional material you would like to cover. We do have some leeway and could schedule you for a somewhat longer time-slot. You may wish to coordinate in some way with Howard Moses who will be presenting on independent living programs in Kansas. We intended that you would address broad conceptual issues related to serving the physically handicapped in the community, while Howard Moses would focus in more detailed fashion on the issues and problems faced in developing and implementing residential programs in rural Kansas.

If you decide to use the video-tape, I will need to know specifics about the equipment needed. And if you feel you will need more time to present, or that coordination with Howard Moses is appropriate, we can schedule for this.

I am gathering together material which describes New Mexico's resources and community services to provide you with background on New Mexico. I am also gathering background material to be included in a participant's package. Any suggestions you have for articles (of a conceptual or programmatic nature) which you feel would be especially useful to an audience that may have limited knowledge of community programs serving the physically handicapped would be appreciated.

In addition, we will be showing films and slide shows recommended as outstanding either in describing the need for community services, from a consumer's or his family's viewpoint, for instance, or in describing an exciting existing program. Do you have suggestions?

A reservation has been made for you at the Four Seasons Motor Inn in Albuquerque (see brochure) for March 13 and 14, 1980. The detailed conference schedule will be mailed to you along with the material on New Mexico.

Please contact me if you have any questions at this time, or if any recommendations for material to be included in the participant's package, or audio-visual material come to mind.

- Thursday, March 13, evening: Banquet and introductory session.
Gunwar Dybwad will speak on philosophical foundations and historical context of the deinstitutionalization movement. To be followed by a report on the status of community residential services in New Mexico and an overview of the conference goals and activities.
- Friday, March 14, all day: Panel presentations by guest speakers.
Questions and discussion.
- Friday, evening: Film and slide presentations.
