HLM OBJECTIVES

INTRODUCTION

The EC members of COCOM, at a minimum, can be expected to press for a COCOM core list for the 1990s. Even if COCOM, including the USG, commits to this exercise, completion of a technically complete COCOM core list will take months of legal drafting and negotiation. In the meantime, all COCOM members are interested in adopting COCOM reforms for Eastern Europe and the Soviet Union within the context of the existing COCOM International List.

Phase I: Short-Term Objectives

- o Adopt revised licensing procedures for Eastern Europe and the Soviet Union within the context of the existing COCOM International List ("IL"):
 - Conclude Computer, Machine Tool and Telecommunication proposals and COCOM negotiations prior to HLM.
 - Decontrol to all destinations the 39 IL entries up to the technological threshold known as the "China Greenline" with certain modifications.
 - Apply differential licensing treatment to Soviet Union and Eastern Europe for 16 Intra-COCOM Trade Exclusion List entries and all other IL entries not related to the China Greenline.
 - Consider other total or partial decontrol of other selected IL entries.
- o Establish COCOM consensus on German unification.

PHASE II: Long-Term Objectives

- o USG should propose a COCOM "Core List" either individually or in partnership with other COCOM allies.
 - USG Core List should include input from JCS, CIA, PCC and the USG's Segment A (semiconductor) or other streamlining proposals pending at COCOM.
- o Adopt COCOM workplan to conclude Core List negotiations.

Implementation

- o 4/27: Conclude USG Phase I/Phase II policy.
- o 5/1-30: Bilaterals to build consensus for USG two-phase proposal.
- o 6/1-2: Refine USG negotiating strategy for HLM.
- o 6/6: HLM

GDR COCOM Transitory Line

During the transition between now and the unification of Germany, the German Democratic Republic is in an exceptional situation which requires an immediate answer by COCOM.

1. The exceptional situation of the GDR

The situation of the German Democratic Republic differs in several ways from that of the European COCOM proscribed destinations:

a) The GDR elections of March 18, 1990 show that the people of the German Democratic Republic are pressing for rapid unification. COCOM needs to find an answer for the interim between now and unification by which the territories of the German Democratic Republic and Berlin (East) will become part of an all-German export control system.

The German Democratic Republic depends for its internal stability on rapid economic success. Migration from East to West Germany will continue to offer an alternative not open to nationals of other CMEA countries. If the exodus (350,000 in 1989, 150,000 so far in 1990) should regain momentum it would jeopardize the viability of the German Democratic Republic and it is at the same time an enormous political burden on the Federal Republic of Germany.

The Government of the Federal Republic of Germany is happy to see that businesses in the Federal Republic and other western nations are preparing an extraordi-

nary number of joint ventures and new investments in the German Democratic Republic. They will entail transfers of much needed state of the art technologies into the GDR.

The economic and monetary union envisaged for the Summer of 1990 at the latest, will expose GDR manufacturers to the competition of the technologically advanced manufacturers of the free world. A substantial surge of unemployment needs to be avoided by raising the technological level of the East German manufacturing sector to the West German level with the help of state of the art technology, which is, however, partly COCOM controlled. Anything less would not be accepted in the German Federal Parliament or by the general public in Germany.

b) The German Democratic Republic has traditionally been the Soviet Union's most important supplier of technology. Nearly 70 percent of GDR exports go into the CMEA area, 55 percent thereof to the Soviet Union. 63 percent of GDR exports to the USSR are made up by machines, industrial, transportation, electrical and electronical equipment. These are the same areas in which the GDR will in the future have to compete on free world markets and cooperate with Western partners.

The German Democratic Republic cannot abandon the Soviet market where it enjoys competitive advantages: reputation of products, similarity of technical standards, traditional channels of distribution, and knowledge of the Russian language. On the other hand, many GDR products will for some time not be competitive on free world markets. Abandoning the role of technologi-

cal supplier of the Soviet Union in the traditional areas would mean much higher unemployment.

c) The intra German border is rapidly becoming more and more open. The Berlin Wall is likely to come down altogether fairly soon. With the establishment of an economic and monetary union, intra German export controls will probably be suspended in the near future. Technology transfers via West Germany to East Germany will be hardly controllable. This confronts the German Federal Government with an unmanageable task if the scope of controlled items were not to be reduced drastically and in a very short timespan.

2. Conclusions to be drawn

a) COCOM controls vis-à-vis the German Democratic Republic might be maintained only if reduced to a minimum. A very limited number of goods and technologies that are to remain subject to case-by-case review by COCOM should be enunciated in a very short core list, a proposal for which is contained in Annex 1. Beyond this core list, there should not be any restrictions on exports to the German Democratic Republic on COCOM level.

The German Democratic Republic for its part would commit itself not to re-export goods and technologies imported from COCOM member states without the prior approval of the country of origin. The competent authorities of the GDR in first talks on March 23, 1990, declared their readiness to enter into such an agreement pending approval by the newly elected Government. The

German Democratic Republic could continue to export its indigenous production and technologies.

b) For the German Democratic Republic cooperation to be credible the GDR would have to institute an export control system with sanctions for violations. There is already a general legal framework which can be adopted rapidly by way of decree (for instance, to introduce high penalties for violations). The German Democratic Republic has enforcement personnel available which will have to be trained; enforcement will be eased by a close cooperation with the Federal Agency in Frankfurt. The set of rules enumerated in the draft attached as Annex 2 has been discussed on March 23, 1990 in East Berlin.

The Western partner of a joint venture would undertake to assure through his controlling rights in the venture, that transferred Western goods and technologies will not be retransferred to proscribed destinations.

c) The Federal Republic of Germany will allow exports covered by the remaining core list only after COCOM clearance. To the extent that export controls are not possible at the intra German border, export controls will be enforced at customs offices inside the Federal Republic of Germany, where already now a big part of exports is cleared, at the manufacturers' or exporter's premises and by increased company checks. Clearance of licenses through COCOM as far as still needed should, as a rule, not require more than four weeks, for instance, in case of re-export.

d) The well functioning of the GDR transitory line will depend on sufficient subsequent progress in the

ongoing list reviews in the priority sectors of telecommunication, machine tools and computers. Controls over GDR exports to proscribed destinations will thus be limited and facilitated.

Draft SCOM Core-List of Technologies
Requiring COCOM Controls as follows

1. Electronics and precision instruments

- Super-computer (IL 1565 partially),
- Electronic computers and related equipment for aircraft, helicopters, launch vehicles specially designed for military use (IL 1565 partially),
- Radar equipment, other than radar for purposes such as air traffic control (IL 1501 partially),
- Inertial navigation systems, inertial equipment, gyroscopes and accelerometers above China Green Line only (IL 1485 partially),
- acoustic or ultrasonic systems, specially designed for positioning surface vessels or underwater vehicles, or for detecting or locating underwater or subterranean objects or features above China Green Line only (IL 1510 partially),

2. High performance gas turbines

- Test facilities and equipment for the design or development of high performance aircraft and specially designed components, accessories and specially designed software therefor (IL 1361 partially),
- Technology for industrial gas turbine engines (IL 1372),

3. Submarine technology

- Submersible systems and specially designed components therefor (IL 1417),
- Deep submergency vehicles and autonomous submersible vehicles (IL 1418),

4. Laser technology

- Technology for equipment containing lasers above China Green Line only (IL 1522 partially),

5. Stealth related technology and space flight

- Filament winding machines and tape-laying machines (IL 1357 sub item a and b),
- Space craft and launch vehicles (IL 1465).

I. Declaration by the Government
of the German Democratic Republic
on Export Controls

1. The Government of the German Democratic Republic, represented by the Minister for Foreign Trade, declares its commitment to ensure that goods and technologies from countries listed in the Annex and designated by the the governments of such countries as requiring controls are devoted exclusively to civilian purposes and shall not be re-exported without prior approval of those governments.
2. In this connection the Government of the German Democratic Republic declares that it has sufficient control personnel available and intends to train them in a manner suited to the said responsibilities.
3. If so requested by the suppliers in the countries listed in the Annex, the competent authorities of the German Democratic Republic shall issue official end-use certificates which confirm for the authorities responsible for licensing exportation from such countries, that the goods and technologies shall be ensured civil end use in the German Democratic Republic.
4. Authorities and importers in the German Democratic Republic shall permit representatives of suppliers in the countries listed in the Annex, on a case-by-case basis as needed, to inspect on-site in the German Democratic Republic the goods and technolo-

gies designated as requiring controls so as to convince themselves of use conforming to the stated purpose. If requested, verification procedures can include authorities of the countries from which the goods and technologies have been delivered.

5. The companies in the German Democratic Republic, through official industry awareness programmes, shall be instructed on the commitments which result for them.
6. The Government of the German Democratic Republic will enforce all measures necessary for invoking sanctions against offending companies and persons in the case of a violation of the control provisions.

II. Declaration by the Governments of the
Federal Republic of Germany and of the
German Democratic Republic

1. Both Governments will work together to facilitate their control systems.
2. The Government of the Federal Republic of Germany declares its willingness to inform regularly the Government of the German Democratic Republic of the development of its control policy.
3. The Federal Ministry of Economics of the Federal Republic of Germany and the Ministry for Foreign Trade of the German Democratic Republic, agree to

set up a permanent working committee for questions concerning controls. The committee shall organize the cooperation of the two respectively competent authorities and the exchange of information on violations or suspected illegal activity.

For purposes of control procedure, the competent authorities of the German Democratic Republic will treat products, whose production has incorporated development and manufacturing knowledge that derives from countries listed in the Annex and that requires controls, as products from such countries.
