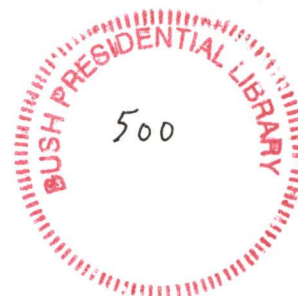

Minutes

Mr Gates: While we do not have a precise handle on the specifics, the questions are clear. There is a big issue, a little issue, and a non-issue. The big issue is what do we do about the withdrawal of Soviet equipment from Europe. The little issue is whether we calculate destruction requirements for CFE at

signature or at entry into force of a CFE treaty. The non-issue concerns the resubordination of aircraft from the Soviet Air Force to the Soviet Navy. The PCC has met on this issue and passed it to us. I would like to ask Dick to talk about what the community knows about these withdrawals, your assessment of motives and magnitude. Is it your sense that the Soviets are going to let nature dismantle and destroy this equipment -- uncovered without cosmoline, parked without protection and no long term treatment for storage? Then I would like to ask OSD what we have done so far on our side on equipment withdrawals. (Ø)

Mr. Kerr: I will pass around a map with the locations of new storage East of the Urals and some pictures. Since January 1989 we've seen large amounts of equipment move East of the Urals, including tanks, artillery and armored combat vehicles. They are generally storing it by type of equipment. Some has been moved into units east of the Urals. Some older equipment has been moved into the ATTU, and we have some limited evidence that there have been small sales. We have a good report on sales through their embassies to third world countries including all this and Treaty Limited Equipment. (S-NF)

Ambassador Bartholomew: Sales? That's great. I said this morning in front of Biden that I was not aware of any sales. (Ø)

Mr. Kerr: As far as numbers go, on 1 January 89 we held a figure of 41,000 Soviet tanks in the zone. The Soviets have declared that they have taken 15,000 out. We have accounted for 9,200 ^{(1.4(c))} ~~_____~~ If the Soviets are being truthful, they have 26,000 ^{(1.4(c))} ~~_____~~ tanks in the ATTU as of 1 July. The current CFE limit for the sufficiency rule is 12,000. That means they have 14,000 to go. They are half way there. (S-NF)

Mr. Gates: We were talking destruction of 30,000 before, and now we're talking 15,000 and shrinking. We could end up trying to sell CFE on the basis of destruction of 30,000 tanks and we may only get 5-6,000 by November. (S-NF)

Mr. Kerr: As for ACVs, they were at 45,000. Thus far we've only seen several hundreds moved out. They have a long way to go to get to the 18,000 sufficiency limit. On artillery, they had 50,000 on 1 January and the Soviets have claimed that 21,000 have been taken out. We have seen 13,000 ^{(1.4(c))} ~~_____~~ There is a 9,900 sufficiency limit. They have 19,000 to go. As far as storage is concerned, the Soviets are used to storing things and not destroying them. I'd like to turn to ^{(1.4(c))} ~~_____~~ to explain how they are storing this stuff. (S-NF)

^{(1.4(c))} ~~_____~~ Some of it is covered with canvas. Some of it is in sheds. As indicated on the map, the area where they are storing this equipment is largely a dry cold area. We checked with our forces in Alaska. They tell us that dry cold is the best storage climate for preventing rust and minimizing damage to

the equipment for the short run. (S-NF)

Mr. Gates: Several years ago the IC concluded that the 12 billion dollars worth of equipment that Khadafi has in the desert is junk. What's the difference? That's dry and hot. Is it the sand? Is it that cold and dry protects? (S-NF)

1.4(b) [REDACTED] We are seeing minimum maintenance and no exercising with this equipment. (C)

Mr. Gates: Is there any infrastructure? (C)

1.4(b) [REDACTED] There are some new sheds and concrete pads. (C)

Mr. Kerr: As to why they are doing this, first it gives them some options about what to do with it. It also may be cheaper to relocate it than to destroy it. (C)

Mr. Gates: We have an immediate issue, but we also have a longer term problem on the hill. We have a CFE treaty which we have sold in part on the grounds that this stuff will be destroyed and instead it is behind the Urals, having been moved by the Soviets before a CFE treaty. (C)

Mr. Kerr: We do think that it is easier to bring this stuff up to standards than to produce new equipment. (C)

Mr. Gates: In the medium term, we need to get a strong intelligence picture in terms of the reconstitution of this equipment. Will they be able to get this stuff out in 4-6 months or how fast will they be able to bring it back? (C)

Mr. Kerr: When they did it in the Far East, they originally brought equipment out of depots. We could take a look at how much trouble they had then. (C)

Ambassador Bartholomew: What is this barred area on the map? (C)

1.4(b) [REDACTED] That's the desert. (C)

Mr. Gates: You might also check why the analysts concluded that Khadafi's equipment had turned to junk in the desert. (C)

General Carns: As far as aircraft are concerned, we keep stuff out in Arizona in the sand and pull it out and use it again. (C)

Ambassador Bartholomew: But can we say that clearly without some kind of reasonable, proficient maintenance this is a wasting asset, that 2 years from now it will be junk, or don't we have that confidence? (C)

General Carns: For tanks, they wouldn't be any good; artillery is another story. (C)

Ambassador Bartholomew: Do we have evidence that they are not using covers? (C)

Mr. Gates: As I understand it, we don't have information whether or not they do. (C)

Ambassador Hanmer: It doesn't take much to bring a towed artillery piece up to speed. Self-propelled is different. (C)

Mr. Kerr: We haven't found all of this equipment
We expect the numbers confirmed to grow to the number which the Soviets have acknowledged. (S-NF)

Ambassador Wolfowitz: When Gorbachev made his announcement he said they would destroy one half and convert one half. (C)

Mr. Gates: They started backing off from that within a week after he said it. (C)

Ambassador Bartholomew: We have to be clear here. The Soviets have broken no agreement by doing what they are doing. (C)

Mr. Gates: Paul, what have we done on our side? (C)

General Carns: We have taken 900 M60A1 tanks out of Europe. 700 went to Egypt, 60 went to Morocco, 30 to Tunisia, and 110 back to the United States. (S-NF)

Ambassador Wolfowitz: The Egyptians have agreed to destroy one of their Soviet tanks for each one that we have given them. (C)

General Carns: We have taken out 1206 M113 APCs back to the CONUS. 591 have gone to the Guard. 576 are in an improvement program, and 39 have gone to training centers. We have taken out 117 M109A2 artillery pieces, 4 of which will eventually go to Korea, and we have taken out 38 UH-1 helicopters. As far as aircraft are concerned, we have done some swapping out, bringing in old A-10s and RF-4s and bringing the newer ones back to the States. (S-NF)

Mr. Hadley: As far as APCs are concerned, NATO is below the ceiling. We won't be at parity. There is an entitlement. (C)

General Carns: 80 of the artillery pieces are being converted under the howitzer improvement program, but they won't be going back to Europe. (S-NF)

Ambassador Bartholomew: The only one I knew about was the tanks. (C)

General Carns: That's the only one we coordinated with NATO. (C)

Ambassador Bartholomew: Or with the State Department. (C)

General Carns: Same thing. (Ø)

Ambassador Bartholomew: Our explanation to the public on the tanks was that the tanks were not part of TOE, but were surplus to our needs. (Ø)

General Carns: That is correct. It was a cost savings to leave them in Europe. (Ø)

Ambassador Bartholomew: That they were not from POMCUS or units, and we did not touch our normal TOE. (Ø)

General Carns: We did do some swapping out. (Ø)

Ambassador Bartholomew: But the 900 were surplus to TOE. (Ø)

General Carns: But the M113s were out of units and perfectly good equipment. (Ø)

Ambassador Bartholomew: But we have not altered our normal tank number. (Ø)

General Carns: The new numbers which we will give to NATO will show 390 lower for tanks and 1206 net lower for ACVs. (S-NF)

Mr. Hadley: We have already given the Alliance 2 numbers for tanks and told them that these tanks would be removed. These are a result of one-for-one replacements. They were just left there in Europe. (Ø)

Ambassador Bartholomew: But this is not the case for APCs and artillery? These were not in the data base for reductions? (Ø)

General Carns: The new data will show lower numbers, that is correct. (Ø)

Mr. Hadley: That's not entirely true. In the HLTF(R) exercise for force planning, we agreed to adjust our APC number down by 1206 to create headroom for other allies after CFE was signed. The only difference is that we have gone ahead and done it before treaty signature. (Ø)

Ambassador Bartholomew: And our APC number is what? (Ø)

Mr. Hadley: 5640, for the U.S. (S)

Ambassador Bartholomew: So roughly 1/5th have been taken out. (Ø)

Mr. Kanter: Are there plans for further withdrawals? (Ø)

Ambassador Bartholomew: I told Biden that the tanks were surplus to requirements and not part of CFE, and I guess that is correct. But this data. . . (Ø)

Mr. Gates: Reg, you might see your lawyer when this meeting is over. (Ø)

Ambassador Bartholomew: Lawyer, hell, my priest. What are your projections through the end of November and until EIF, say in June 1991? That is a key question for what we do here. And we will need it divided that way. Of course, as this data which you have presented becomes known, the French proposal will develop more steam. Do you have any projections on further restructuring. (Ø)

General Carns: There will be no further withdrawals except for one-for-one swaps. (Ø)

Ambassador Wolfowitz: We do expect some cuts in the budget. (Ø)

Ambassador Hanmer: At what level? (Ø)

General Carns: 50,000 is in the works now, within one year of enactment. (Ø)

Ambassador Wolfowitz: Our end strength will be coming down fast, and will likely go lower in Europe. (Ø)

Ambassador Hanmer: But they don't need to take their hardware with them. (Ø)

Ambassador Wolfowitz: There will be pressure to do this smoothly. (Ø)

General Carns: There is no restriction on withdrawal after signature. (Ø)

Ambassador Bartholomew: At the moment destruction is calculated as of entry into force. The data exchanged then will determine the destruction base. But, the French, with some support, are pressing for the exchange of information at signature to be the destruction base. (Ø)

General Carns: That is not a problem. (Ø)

Mr. Gates: There are two options in the PCC paper. The first, more bluntly stated than is usually the case, is to do nothing, which is persuasively argued. The second tries to get more information on the nature and magnitude of the problem through information exchange. It would, in a sense, document what is going on. Reg, the PCC did not have a recommendation, do you have a view? (Ø)

Ambassador Bartholomew: We have a State view, which I guess I agree with. (Ø)

Mr. Gates: This could be a dramatic moment. We have one State position. (C)

Mr. Kerr: Which he may agree with. (C)

Ambassador Bartholomew: This is a hard call. We started out with a destruction figure of 30,000. Now it is more like 15,000. (C)

Mr. Gates: And heading toward 5,000. (C)

Ambassador Bartholomew: It would be tough to just watch it until it gets to 5,000. And tanks are the cutting edge of the problem. That fact militates against doing nothing. So does the allied problem. Already there is concern there and it is growing. We could go bilaterally with an information exchange, I guess, but it will be a real hornets nest. (C)

Mr. Gates: That is likely to take as long as CFE to negotiate. (C)

Ambassador Bartholomew: I am worried about the time it will take and slowing down the negotiations. It will also focus more attention on the problem. An information exchange would be non-binding. Back dating TLE destruction would be tough, and so would notice of entries. (C)

Mr. Gates: Isn't the idea of option 2 that it might buy us something in the ratification process? (C)

Ambassador Wolfowitz: Isn't it the reverse, that it might hurt us in ratification? (C)

General Carns: I think it is the reverse. (C)

Ambassador Bartholomew: It may get us nothing. On the other hand, the data would show us the scope of the problem and then we could decide what to do then. (C)

Mr. Gates: Dick, you were highlighting the numbers and the disparity in the numbers we have seen and the numbers they claim to have withdrawn. You are highlighting the verification uncertainties. If we take an ideal case, which we never have, we are talking here about a document that will take several weeks to negotiate. It will be September or October before there is an agreement, and by then only the frosting will be left. We will have a document that only deals with 10 percent of the problem. (C)

General Carns: And it will do nothing for you. They can still pull out what they want and just inform you that they've done it. (C)

Ambassador Bartholomew: We do have ongoing information exchange.

It may not be as tough to do it in that context. It would reduce the administrative burden and so forth. (Ø)

Mr. Clarke: Back dating notifications and disposition would help on our verification problem. (Ø)

Ambassador Bartholomew: We don't want to constrain our own force adjustments, and we want to meet allied concerns. The spin off of this issue is with non-circumvention east of the Urals. Thatcher and the French will be even more concerned than they are already. (Ø)

Mr. Gates: My guess is that no leaders have focussed on the numbers, either Mitterand or Thatcher. (Ø)

Ambassador Bartholomew: I would wager that the top levels have not focussed. In France this is not a Quai thing. (Ø)

Ambassador Wolfowitz: It had a high profile with de Brichambaut. I can't see how we can go forward with the treaty without raising it with the Soviets. We can theorize about why they are doing it. But it would be valuable not to do a data exchange, but to take a look and see that they are not maintaining it. The odds are that they are not maintaining it. (Ø)

Mr. Gates: It is not clear from the paper exactly what we would propose with option two. (Ø)

Ambassador Bartholomew: The parameters are there. A non-binding data exchange on equipment of a treaty limited type. The locations from and to, and the point of exit as of a certain date in the past and for future withdrawals. Notice of exit might be a problem. (Ø)

Mr. Gates: And on site inspection to confirm this? (Ø)

Ambassador Bartholomew: No. Information exchange only. (Ø)

General Carns: We don't want to open the CONUS to inspection of our stuff. (Ø)

Ambassador Hanmer: That won't solve the problem. And if there is no basis to cause a change, then we should not do this and risk not concluding a CFE treaty. (Ø)

General Carns: We might be better off.... (Ø)

Mr. Gates: We will need to word anything like this very carefully. We don't want to imply that they should be keeping this stuff in Eastern Europe. (Ø)

Ambassador Hanmer: They wouldn't be precluded from taking this out of Eastern Europe. (Ø)

General Carns: There are reasons for them not to do any of this at all. (C)

Ambassador Bartholomew: Wait. The Soviets are getting their asses kicked out of Eastern Europe and are cutting their forces. CFE gets them something for that. (C)

General Carns: And they have lost Eastern Europe and want to keep higher levels of TLE for themselves than they will be able to under CFE. (C)

Ambassador Bartholomew: It is important to be clear on this. The issue is whether the Soviets are interested in CFE. They will seek a higher level for themselves in CFE. Let us not be in the mode that they have leverage. This is an important political piece for Gorbachev. We don't need this damn thing any more than he does. (C)

Mr. Gates: If we can work this out promptly, we are better off with data with the Soviets. First, we need to make clear that we are monitoring a problem that we want to encourage, but at the same time, it is troubling too. Second, the useful part is that data might help the intelligence community in the midst of this turmoil to track this stuff. It might give us some road map in order to decrease the uncertainty they are causing. If we limit that uncertainty we are 51 to 49 better off. (C)

Ambassador Wolfowitz: Perhaps there is a different way here. Maybe this stuff is not maintained or covered or associated with force structure. And we can know which stuff there is, the main tank parks. The idea would be to visit and see it. (C)

General Carns: That implies inspection beyond the ATTU. (C)

Ambassador Bartholomew: That is a strategic decision to break the ATTU line, a very serious move. (C)

Mr. Gates: The alternative is to ask and be willing if things are withdrawn outside the CFE area to do our best to monitor without OSI and then add value to the thing by agreeing not to maintain it so that it turns to junk. (C)

Ambassador Hanmer: Our 1200 APCs won't be turning to junk. (C)

Ambassador Bartholomew: It will be very hard to demand a commitment from him that does not infringe on the CFE agreement and breaks the ATTU line. (C)

General Carns: He will have the right to do the same on our equipment. (C)

Ambassador Bartholomew: We need to take a strategic look at this. Reserve stocks can't be mobilized quickly. How will this change our warning time? (C)

Mr. Kerr: There's one thing that it does do. It gives us targets for warning of force reconstitution. (Ø)

General Carns: But warning time is shortened. (Ø)

Ambassador Hanmer: It does give politically usable evidence. (Ø)

General Carns: There will be a significant difference. This is a different warning problem entirely. (Ø)

(4)(c) (Ø)

Ambassador Wolfowitz: Gorbachev has made a big deal on 10,000 tanks destroyed or converted. We should ask him about his promise. Second is exchange of data to find out if destruction requirements have disappeared. Third, politically this is too big a thing to do nothing. We should discuss with them what is going on and have them explain it. (Ø)

General Carns: Would this be bilateral? (Ø)

Ambassador Wolfowitz: Don't know. (Ø)

General Carns: Otherwise we fuel the French fire. (Ø)

Ambassador Bartholomew: Haven't we already had a general exchange of data on TLE in the negotiations? (Ø)

Ms. Wilson: All countries have exchanged data informally on artillery. We just got the other armor definitions agreed and informal data exchange based on those definitions should begin shortly. (Ø)

Mr. Gates: It seems that we are agreed that there is merit in addressing this issue with the Soviets. We have got a big problem. It is a paradox, but a problem. Our approach with the Soviets is that this has the potential to be a serious problem in the ratification process. When we reached agreement on these ceilings, we thought one of the big points would be destruction. The speed of withdrawal, with which we have no complaint in principal, will leave a smaller percentage to be destroyed. This creates real problems in a political and military sense. Before this becomes a big political issue, we would like to talk about it and see what to do about it. That's as far as I get. If we are all sympathetic with the idea of going to the Soviets, maybe we should ask the PCC how they would construct what we would ask them to do when we approach them. We have a problem here with the potential to screw everything up and be their problem -- particularly with the French and British. And they have an interest in having the 370,000 codified in CFE. (Ø)

Ambassador Wolfowitz: We need to keep all of this in perspective. They were going to destroy 30,000 and now they will destroy 15,000. That's still a lot. (Ø)

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Mr. Gates: And headed toward 5,000. (Ø)

Ambassador Wolfowitz: Even 5,000 is pretty big. 15,000 is a big number of tanks. Second, with the sufficiency rule at 12,000 tanks, that means 8,000 fewer than they figured earlier. Whatever happens, they are losing their Allies. On net, unless the number goes very low, it is hard to argue against wrapping up CFE. We would be very hard against anything that would derail CFE. (Ø)

Ambassador Bartholomew: Good God, yes. (Ø)

Ambassador Wolfowitz: We may have a real reconstitution problem, but we may not have such a problem. We should keep our options open. (Ø)

Ambassador Hanmer: I'd strongly support the course set out by Bob. We also need to think about how and when to build backfires on the Hill, so that they are aware of what is going on. (Ø)

Mr. Gates: We should say up front that we don't want to do anything to delay CFE. We should go as fast as possible with CFE and ensure speedy ratification and support of other countries. All are agreed with the idea of an initiative and having the PCC flesh out what to say to the Soviets and what we want them to do in that context. (Ø)

Ambassador Bartholomew: I'm glad I'm not on the PCC. We've punted the issue back to them. (Ø)

Mr. Gates: They did it to us. (Ø)

Mr. Kanter: I thought that there was only one-way freedom to punt. (Ø)

Ambassador Wolfowitz: We need to be careful about what we do to ourselves. The numbers on our side are small, nothing like their magnitude. (Ø)

Ambassador Bartholomew: I would subscribe to what Paul just said. There is a distinction here between politics in Congress and in NATO and the substance. If, at the end of the day, we have to choose between no CFE or CFE with fewer reductions and with equipment East of the Urals, the weight of the argument is to sign CFE. (Ø)

General Carns: But it is a different CFE. (Ø)

Ambassador Bartholomew: It is a CFE which accomplishes the goals which were set for it. (Ø)

Mr. Gates: What kind of timeline should we set for this work, given that it is too tight already? (Ø)

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Ambassador Bartholomew: This is important. Paul is right. We may not destroy as much as we thought in CFE, and our regeneration time may not be as much as we thought. But CFE will remain of value. (C)

Mr. Gates: The PCC should begin this work, and eventually it will go to Principals. We do have a problem here, but it should be kept in perspective, kept in context. All have said that whatever we do, we should in no way delay CFE, but we should do something. Given the modest contribution of anything we do, it should not delay CFE and we shouldn't pay anything for it. (C)

Mr. Kerr: Maybe we should offer to buy the stuff. (C)

Ambassador Hanmer: We fought Vietnam with World War II hardware. (C)

Mr. Gates: But the Soviets have a different approach to maintenance. (C)

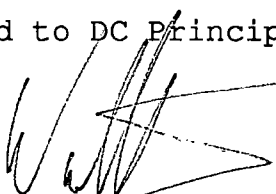
