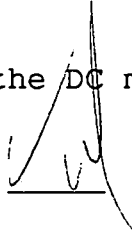
SUBJECT: Minutes for DC Meetings on the Gulf Crisis from

1. **Intelligence Briefing:** The four SCUDS reported by Embassy Kuwait have not been confirmed ^{1.4(c), 1.4(d)} [REDACTED]

-- Civil air routes to take the Soviets out of Iraq will be via Turkey to Baghdad. (§)

-- 1.4(d) [REDACTED] (§)

-- 1.4(c), 1.4(d) [REDACTED] Saddam made it clear he is holding westerns as hostages against an attack. (§)

2. **UNSC Update:** The Military Staff Committee has concluded and agreed to the terms of reference for the multinational quarantine force. At 5:00 p.m. the Sanctions Committee will meet to discuss violations. Foreign Minister Shevardnadze and Secretary Baker will issue instructions to their Perm Reps tomorrow. At the Saturday session, there will be ad ref changes to the text of the resolution. Larry Eagleburger will meet with the Columbian Foreign Minister. (§)

3. **Kuwait Retaliation cable:** Being worked by the lawyers. (§)

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4. **Congress:** There will be a briefing in Room 450 of the OEOB with the President and the leadership of the Foreign Affairs/Relations Committees, Armed Services Committees, and Intelligence Committees. A Congressional leadership delegation will travel on September 1. Senator Lautenberg is already there. (§)

5. **Egyptian Division for Saudi Arabia:** There are logistics problems in supporting the division in country. Secretary Baker is talking with Saudi Foreign Minister Prince Saud and Bob Gates with Egyptian Ambassador El Reedy to discuss the logistics support needed in untry that will have to come from somewhere. There apparently are three issues associated with this deployment: political, lift and theater support. (§)

6. **Saudi Arms Sales:** The memo is being redone. (§)

1.4(e), 1.4(d)

8. **Libyan IL-76s:** Seven Libyan IL-76s have flown to Baghdad between August 14 and 21, three via Damascus, two back from Baghdad and one returned to Damascus. A message should be sent to Syria. (§)

9. **Divert Ports:** Of the Gulf States, Oman only has agreed. Egypt has also agreed and said vessels can be towed into their waters. (§)

10. **Refugee Assistance:** \$1 million is being provided in emergency food aid. We should solicit help from private organizations, like Americares. (§)

11. **Jordan:** Nothing to report. (§)

12. **Larger Compensation Group:** We should add Brunei, Taiwan and Korea to the donors list. Compensation should be both short term and long term. We need to consider both beneficiaries and donors. The Steering Group will meet at 10:00 tomorrow to consider these questions. (§)

13. **Convoy:** It has not reached Baghdad yet. Iraq is doing daily videos with the hostages. Saddam is making appearances as is his spokesman as part of his public diplomacy effort. We need to think about 747 widebodies to lift hostages out of Iraq. (§)

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14. **OPEC Meeting:** We should consider sending a guidance cable to them. Iran production is usually 3. One million barrels a day. It is at 2.9 million barrels now. It has been 3.4 million for a few months before. 3.2 million would provide a little more flexibility. (§)

15. **The Multinational Force for Saudi Arabia:** National Security Advisor Scowcroft will call the French and the British. DoD is sending their paper to State. (§)

16. **Lift:** As of August 27 there will be 22 foreign ships available, 41 by September 2 and 60 by September 23. These include Korea, Japan, Belgium and Denmark. (§)
