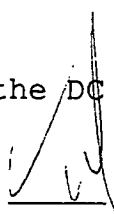
SUBJECT: Minutes for DC Meetings on the Gulf Crisis from

Minutes

1. The three Iraqi tankers still are unlocated. U.S. ships and aircraft are operating below the southern Kuwaiti border. (§)
2. On air interdiction, the British have submitted a draft that is proposing all appropriate measures be used but not to endanger passengers. (§)
3. Counselor Update: (§)
 - 1200 private citizens in Kuwait (plus 19 at the Embassy)
 - 8 diplomats (plus 19 men) in Embassy Kuwait
 - 335 private citizens in Iraq (84 detainees, 23 at residence)
 - 9 diplomats plus 51 from Embassy Kuwait in Embassy Baghdad

4. In response to Iraqi explosions of EC and U.S. diplomats, three Iraqi diplomats will leave here. (§)
5. Food ships intercepted: The U.S. Navy boarded two such ships and Australia will board a third. (§)
6. The Iraqi UN delegation will not be allowed a special flight to fly Tariq Aziz to New York and will be restricted to travel within 25 miles of the UN. (§)
7. The Saudi pipeline to Jordan has been cut because Jordan owes \$48 million in oil payments. The Japanese could be asked to help. There is still \$20 million in unobligated FMS funds for Jordan. (§)
8. VOA is getting broadcast time on Radio Moscow. (§)
9. On the refugee situation, there are 2 million in Kuwait and Iraq still, with one million out. 40,000 are left on the Jordan border. (§)
10. The proposed Yemen resolution would confirm the UN Sanctions Committee's authority under Article 50 on sanctions compliance for those countries that are hurt by the crisis. (§)
11. Consideration of war crimes against Iraq should include reparations. (§)
12. Medical shipments to Iraq and Kuwait should be humanitarian donations not commercial sales. (§)
13. According to the Wall Street Journal, the Defense Department has prepared a paper on long term ground presence in the region, particularly Army and Marines. This is disturbing and not helpful given regional sensitivities. DOD denies it but will look into it. (§)
14. The paper on options for Iran will be done tomorrow. (§)
15. An analysis is being done on how to contain Saddam unilaterally and multinationally, both now and post-crisis. (§)
16. We should be looking at sanctions on sanctions breakers. (§)
