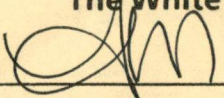

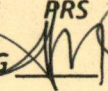

PAKISTAN DEMOCRATIC ELECTIONS

Sec. xxx.

(a) The Congress notes that national elections are scheduled in Pakistan for October 24, and until that date it will not be possible to assess whether the change in government initiated by dismissal of the ruling party will be completed in full accord with democratic principles, nor whether the new government will pursue policies on such crucial issues as nuclear proliferation in accord with the requirements of U.S. law and policy. The Congress appreciates that under an interim government Pakistan has been responding to the crisis caused by Iraq's invasion of Kuwait in an exemplary fashion, and emphasizes the importance of continued close cooperation with Pakistan in responding to that crisis. The Congress reaffirms that it is of fundamental importance to United States national security interests to avert a nuclear arms race in South Asia, and in that regard calls upon the President to renew his efforts to forge a multilateral consensus on nuclear non-proliferation in South Asia, with the assistance and support of other permanent members of the Security Council. The Congress further reaffirms the unwavering commitment of the United States to democratic principles and urges the Government of Pakistan to carry out its elections for National Assembly in full accord with these principles.

(b) No assistance shall be furnished to Pakistan and no military equipment or technology shall be sold or transferred to Pakistan, pursuant to the authorities contained in this or any other Act, unless the President certifies in writing to the House and Senate Committees on Appropriations that the Government of Pakistan has held timely, free, fair and internationally monitored National Assembly elections, open to the full participation of all legal parties in Pakistan. Upon such a certification, the requirements of Section 620E(e) of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, shall be suspended for six months: Provided, That during such six month period, not more than \$105 million appropriated by this Act under the heading "Economic Support Fund" may be made available for Pakistan, and not more than \$114 million appropriated by this Act under the heading "Foreign Military Financing Program" may be made available for Pakistan. Prior to the completion of the six month period, the President shall report to the House and Senate Committees on Appropriations, and to the House Foreign Affairs and Senate Foreign Relations committees, on progress towards regional nuclear non-proliferation in South Asia.

1. Paragraph (a) describes factors leading to the legislation. It is in the same form as Section 620E(a), which described the Congressional considerations in enacting the original Symington waiver authority for Pakistan, but does not refer or tie into that provision in any way.

2. Paragraph (b) creates a new democratic elections restriction on aid to Pakistan, and the possibility of relief from the Pressler amendment for six months if this restriction is satisfied.

-- The restriction is that the same programs covered by the Pressler amendment will not be permitted unless the President certifies as to the fairness of Pakistan's elections. This means that the new provision will bar all assistance until the elections, so there is no need to address whether the Pressler amendment would require the same result. It also means that if the certification on democracy cannot be made after the elections, the cut-off in U.S. programs could continue to be explained on that basis. (Because the scope of the new prohibition and Pressler would be the same, however, even if the Pressler standard could be met U.S. programs could not be resumed in the absence of a certification on democratic elections.)

-- The required elements of the Presidential certification on elections is modelled on section 574(b)(2) of the current Senate version of the Foreign Operations Appropriations bill (attached). The one difference is a deletion of the requirement to certify that "all candidates" of all legal parties be able to participate in the elections. This is because some candidates may be ineligible for appropriate reasons.

-- Once the Presidential certification on elections is made, assistance is no longer barred by the new provision, and the requirement for a certification of non-possession under the Pressler amendment is suspended for six months. This means that unless there is another bar to assistance (e.g., a coup, illegal procurement for the nuclear program, etc.) the full range of programs covered by the Pressler amendment could be carried out for six months.

-- However, the draft would limit use of FY 91 funds for ESF and FMF during the six months to 50% of the amounts planned for Pakistan for the fiscal year.

-- The draft would also require a report on progress towards regional non-proliferation in South Asia before the end of the six months.

-- The draft does not impose any new nuclear conditions on programs for Pakistan.

The purpose of today's meeting is to review the results of the Administration's consultations with Congress on the Pak nuclear program and to decide what we do next in view of the October 1 suspension of Pakistan's aid program. As you noted yesterday, while some of the congressmen appeared to be sympathetic, they were short on ideas for dealing with the problem. State will provide a debrief of their discussions, and a proposal for where we go from here. Much of the meeting ought to focus on the substance for follow-up efforts, both with the Hill and with the Paks and their neighbors.

ISSUE: Assuming we want to resume Pakistan's aid programs because of the serious implications of not doing so at this particular time, there are two options: 1) temporary legislative relief to get us through elections and into the initial months of a new Pak government, or 2) a 614 waiver.

DISCUSSION: On temporary legislation, Obey and others have indicated they may be willing to consider this option so long as restoration of Pakistan's aid programs is tied to Pakistani elections on October 24. We would like the legislation for six months, to take us through early next year which would give us time to work the issue with a new Pakistani government and with a new Congress early next year. A continued aid suspension until elections are held would have minimal effect on Pakistan's program.

If Congress is unwilling or unable to pass such legislation, the President could issue a 614 waiver that would allow us to continue up to \$50 million of Pakistan's aid programs this fiscal year. That would at least buy us some time to work the issue when Congress reconvenes, either later this year or early next. The waiver also could be linked to the successful conduct of elections in Pakistan.

RECOMMENDATION: The interagency should continue to work with the Hill on temporary legislative relief linked to the conduct of successful elections in Pakistan. If we are unable to obtain such relief, we should advise Congress that we plan to use the President's 614 waiver authority to continue Pakistan's aid programs on a limited basis until either certification or longer term legislative relief can be obtained.

ISSUE: We also agreed to continue our broader regional discussions on this issue.

DISCUSSION: You should ask State for a readout of Secretary Baker's discussions with the Indian and Soviet foreign ministers.

RECOMMENDATION: Based on those discussion, we should consider sending a letter to Prime Minister Singh (and possibly Gorbachev) on this matter.
