Minutes

Mr. Gates: We are here to discuss two subjects about which I am uniquely ill informed. Perhaps the easiest way to deal with this would be for you, Phil, to lay out the problem. (U)

First, Brent got a memo from Secretary Skinner regarding the massive increases in insurance premiums for carriers serving the Middle East. In the case of Riyadh, the rate went from \$16,000 to \$160,000 per flight. For Tel Aviv, the rate went up to \$60,000. The airlines have come in for war risk insurance. OMB is concerned about potential liabilities. We thought at one point about having the carriers go back to the insurers. But all this has become complicated by the likely issuance shortly of a Notice to Airmen (NOTAM). So we need to get together on these questions. (C)

Mr. Brady: Title XIII provides that the USG is the insurer of last resort. There must be a finding that continued service in an area is in the national interest. The determination is good for 60 days. The current determination has been renewed several times and expires on February 8. Thus far, we have issued only

one policy. The FAA has come out with rates that have allowed the carriers to shop around and obtain commercial insurance at competitive rates. After January 2, there was a real spike in the rates. (U)

Pan Am has stopped service to Riyadh and Tel Aviv. TWA and other carriers are in daily, if not hourly, contact with us about insurance. The carriers that want coverage include TWA, Tower, Evergreen (a charter operator carrying medical supplies), Federal Express, Florida West, and 2-3 others. (U)

The U.S. Ambassador to Israel has expressed concern about the termination of air services to Israel. As you indicated, Bob, Secretary Skinner's personal concern arises from the sharp price spikes. He wants a policy determination. We are ready to write policies for whatever purposes are approved. They could be written for coverage up to midnight on January 14. TWA has already indicated it will stop service after January 13. (Ø)

Mr. Eagleburger: We are only talking about coverage up to January 15, right? (U)

Admiral Jeremiah: What's the scope of the exclusion area for the NOTAM? (Ø)

Admiral Fitzgerald: It will cover all Southwest Asian countries including Israel. The NOTAM will be based on the possibility of hostilities and will be issued before January 15. (Ø)

Mr. Eagleburger: 50,000 American citizens are in Israel. Flights out are fully booked. On balance, we ought to issue policies until January 15 to give Americans a chance to get out. (Ø)

Mr. Diefenderfer: If it's just one-way, that's okay. But a lot of these planes are going out to the region full. It doesn't make sense for people to be traveling there and our insuring them. (Ø)

Mr. Brady: A number of carriers have reduced flights. (U)

Mr. Gates: Some have stopped service altogether. According to my information, Lufthansa and British Airways have just stopped service. (U)

Mr. Eagleburger: They will stop tomorrow. (U)

Mr. Brady: There have been no terrorist threats since August 2. Intelligence points to the likelihood of terrorist activity at the outbreak of hostilities, but we expect there will be a hold on terrorist acts until January 15. (Ø)

Mr. Gates: Nothing has changed in that regard. We will continue to assess the costs and the benefits. (Ø)

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Mr. Kerr: We may find ourselves shortly in a difficult situation. (Ø)

Mr. Gates: We can review matters on a day-to-day basis, taking into account terrorist reports. (Ø)

Mr. Brady: Under our standard policy, we can cancel on 3 days' notice. We could cancel the policies even more quickly. (Ø)

Mr. Gates: You don't have to wait for a loss to cancel, right? (Ø)

Mr. Diefenderfer: Our liability ends then. (U)

Mr. Brady: TWA wants to know what's the holdup. Do we have authority to issue? (Ø)

Mr. Diefenderfer: We could issue up through January 15 with a three-day cancellation notice. But we ought to clean up the list of eligible countries which now includes Yemen, Iraq, and Jordan. (Ø)

Mr. Gates: We ought to yank Yemen and Iraq off the list. (Ø)

Mr. Brady: 11 countries are identified. (U)

Mr. Eagleburger: In my judgment it's only fair to offer such coverage given the number of U.S. citizens who want to get out. (Ø)

Mr. Gates: But if we are taking out 40 people, for example, and taking in 20 to Sanaa, it doesn't make sense. (Ø)

Mr. Wolfowitz: There is a big scare in Israel, a fear of the country being carpeted with SCUDs. (Ø)

Mr. Gates: What happens when we issue the NOTAM? (Ø)

Mr. Eagleburger: No one can fly after January 15. (Ø)

Mr. Gates: But the NOTAM is not a ban to travel. (Ø)

Mr. Diefenderfer: No, but we just won't provide insurance. (Ø)

Mr. Selin: We have issued advisories for people to get out of Yemen and Jordan. (Ø)

Mr. Brady: We don't have any applications for insurance coverage for these countries. (Ø)

Mr. Diefenderfer: Evergreen is carrying medical supplies from New York to Bahrain and Saudi Arabia. (U)

Mr. Gates: My sense of the group is that we are agreed to provide insurance coverage up to the issuance of the NOTAM or the

effective date of the NOTAM. There should be the right to cancel on 3 days' notice and with even shorter notice on safety grounds if we have, for example, intelligence reports of possible terrorist activity. (Ø)

Mr. Eagleburger: We will scrub the list of countries covered by the program. (Ø)

Mr. Gates: If everyone agrees, we can proceed ahead. I will want to run this by Brent Scowcroft. Because of obvious sensitivities, we should not mention the possible issuance of a NOTAM at this time. (Ø)

You will chair a DC on War Risk Insurance at 4:30 this afternoon. The facts, as best we can determine them, are:

- TWA is only carrier flying into Tel Aviv. It says it is losing \$400/seat due to insurance costs. Lufthansa and BA have stopped service due to high insurance costs.
- there are many people, presumably including Americans, who can not book flights out of Tel Aviv, Amman and Cairo due to insufficiency of planes. EmbassyTel Aviv is requesting permission to drawdown dependents; if approved, this will encourage non-official Americans to leave.
- TWA and charter companies (Tower, Evergreen) are willing to continue service if U.S. provides war risk insurance.
- To date, requests for war risk insurance have covered only the hull, not passengers.
- DOT has offered, with State, OMB and NSC concurrence, war risk insurance since August; only one flight has been covered. In other cases, airlines used our premium proposal to bring commercial insurers down.
- The \$1 billion figure in Skinner's memo assumes a fully-loaded 747. Most planes flying in the region are 737s or A310s; \$250-350 million is a better estimate of potential liability.

There appear to be two basic options:

- (a) Continue policy of offering war risk insurance

Pro: scheduled and charter flights will continue, at least until carriers make their own decision to cease flying for safety reasons.

Con: USG faces potentially large liability until first covered plane goes down.

(b) Discontinue offering war risk insurance

Pro: no financial liability for USG

Con: prohibitive commercial coverage will cause airlines to stop service, stranding Americans and others who want to get out of Middle East.

May be seen as another signal that hostilities are imminent.

USG will have to charter planes to get Americans, and probably other nationals, out of Middle East. This will be logistically complicated and expensive.

A variant of (a) would be to include a rider allowing the USG to terminate the coverage within a specified number of days. Currently the coverage is good for one month.

Skinner Request on War Risk Insurance

Florence/Wilma:

Please ask the General to raise the war risk insurance issue (Skinner memo) with Eagleburger when they see each other at 11:00 a.m. The inter-agency system has ground to a halt as State, DOT, OMB and NSC toss the ball to each other. I have spoken with Janet Hale at OMB; she said decision is foreign policy call. DOT has told State that there is no point in U.S. airlines going back to the insurers to ask them to lower rates.

FYI: There are news reports, which State and DOT say are credible, that many people who wish to leave the Middle East can't because airlines can't get insurance. State staff believes that at some point USG will have to charter airplanes to get U.S. citizens out if we can't provide coverage to U.S. airlines.
