Iraqi Aircraft in Iran

- o The United States welcomes and appreciates the assurances of the Government of the Islamic Republic of Iran that all Iraqi aircraft now in or that will enter the sovereign territory of the Islamic Republic of Iran will be detained in Iran until the end of hostilities.
- o These assurances are consistent with Resolution 678, in which the Security Council requested all states to provide assistance to coalition forces. Also, as you know, under Article 2, paragraph 5, of the Charter of the United Nations all members of the United Nations are obligated to refrain from giving assistance to any State against which the United Nations is taking preventative or enforcement action. Obligations under the U.N. Charter prevail over any other obligations of a State under other international agreements, in accordance with U.N. Charter Article 103.
- o To seek further clarification of the circumstances of the recent entry and landing of a number of Iraqi aircraft in the territory of Iran, the United States wishes to raise a number of questions. In raising these questions, the United States is in no way questioning the assurances and commitments of the Islamic Republic of Iran as to its stated intention to hold the Iraqi aircraft until the end of hostilities. The questions stem from the natural concern of a government with military personnel at risk.
  - Does the assurance by the Islamic Republic of Iran that the Iraqi aircraft will be detained by Iran mean that the aircraft will remain in Iranian control until Iraq complies with the resolutions of the United Nations Security Council?
  - Does the Islamic Republic of Iran plan to position the Iraqi aircraft in a manner open to verification by national technical means?
  - Does the Islamic Republic of Iran plan to make the Iraqi aircraft inoperable in a way that is easily verifiable? For example, by parking them closely together, facing in opposite directions with wing tips overlapping or nearly overlapping, or by removing wing flaps, tires, or cockpit canopies?
  - Does the Islamic Republic of Iran intend to erect physical barriers at the airfields where the Iraqi aircraft are located and to post guards to ensure that no Iraqis will have access to the aircraft?

- Did the Iraqi combat aircraft enter Iran with ordnance and with ready-weapons of destruction?
- What does the Islamic Republic of Iran plan to do with the Iraqi pilots and other military personnel who entered Iran with the aircraft?
- Did all or any of the Iraqi military personnel now in Iran enter Iran under orders from the regime of Saddam Hussein? Did any enter Iran to escape from the war or defect from the regime of Saddam Hussein?
- o We understand that some of the Iraqi aircraft in Iran have moved to locations different from their original landing points. We would appreciate learning why these changes in location were made.

Condition of Islamic Sites in Iraq

- o The regime of Saddam Hussein has claimed that coalition forces have damaged religious sites in Iraq sacred to the world of Islam.
- o This charge is untrue and is yet another example of Saddam Hussein's readiness to distort realities and to play with human emotions for his own ends.
- o There is no evidence that Iraq's four major Shia mosques--Karbala, An Najaf, Samarra, and Kadhimiya--have been damaged by coalition bombing of military targets.
  - As of January 24, 1991 the Karbala mosque was undamaged and, as of January 27, the An Najaf mosque was undamaged.
  - The golden mosque at Samarra, as of January 21, was undamaged, as was the Kadhimiya mosque, located in a northern suburb of Baghdad, when it was observed on January 27.
- o There are legitimate military targets, placed there by the Iraqis, within several miles of the four mosques, including:
  - An air warning radar about two-and-one-half milies away from An Najaf.
  - A power plant about six miles away from An Najaf.
  - An Iraqi military compound about one-half mile away from Kadhimiya.
- o As we have informed the Islamic Republic of Iran, coalition forces are doing all possible to avoid civilian, religious, and historical targets in Iraq.

- o We can only hope that Saddam Hussein will do the same. However, after his actions in creating the oil slick we can not rule out that he might undertake actions against persons or religious and cultural sites in an attempt to blame the coalition for these actions.
- o The United States would be interested in receiving any information the Islamic Republic of Iran may be able to provide on the condition of the religious and historical sites in Iraq.

HARM Missile

- o With regard to the HARM missile that you reported fell into Iranian territory, the United States has no intention to threaten the security or to infringe in any way upon the sovereign territory of the Islamic Republic of Iran.
  - The landing of any U.S. ordnance in Iran would be purely accidental.
  - Given the information provided, we have been unable to develop any further information on the circumstances of the missile.

Please give this additional information to Bob before the DC.  
Thanks.

Bob:

A couple of points relevant to items on the DC agenda today:

(1) State may raise Jordan's accusations of attacks on civilian transport (esp. oil trucks) in Western Iraq. This has become a very grave matter in Jordan, prompting Parliamentary outcry, a call to Roger from the King asking that he inform the Highest Levels about it, and -- more troubling -- GID concern about anti-American actions (first time they have shown that level of worry). JCS explanations of this incident (at night, blacked out convoys, off the main road, in a SCUD area) are not wholly convincing, since the Jords, the news media, and our Embassy have all heard from truckers and travelers that the attacks were in broad daylight on the main highway, a prime conduit for among other things refugee egress from Iraq. At the same time, what we could say that would satisfy the Jordanians would probably be too limiting to our military.

(2) Re the Assad call. You should know that Pat Tyler (NYT, Pentagon beat) is looking into a story that JCS has proposed the Pres call Assad, followed by ED Djerejian going in with talking points, to ask for "U-2 routes to do DBA along the border" (sic). He probably won't print the story unless he learns the call has actually happened, which of course he may do from whoever gave it to him in the first place. Kinda diminishes the ardor of even the most committed Syrio-philos on your staff from pushing this one...

Robin, could you please pass the following message to Bob from Philip for his 1600 Deputies meeting?

Bob:

Although not on the formal agenda, it is possible that someone may raise the issue of Dutch and German Patriots for Germany and/or Israel. If it comes up, here's the situation:

-- We have asked the Dutch to provide additional Patriots to Turkey for Malatya/Erhac, without specifying number of fire units. (Ozal specifically asked for more Patriots for Malatya and DOD decided this was the best use for remaining Dutch Patriots.) Baker raised this with van den Broek and a cable was sent last night to follow up with the Dutch MoD. Meanwhile we hear the Israelis still want Dutch Patriots as military equipment, not a Dutch unit deployment, even if we do not give them anti-missile capability. The Israelis may be trying to capitalize on the political climate to gain lasting improvements to their general air defenses.

-- We have worked out an agreement under which the Germans will transfer two Patriot fire units to Turkey over the next few months as a permanent equipment transfer, not a Bundeswehr unit deployment. But now the Germans have also agreed to give Israel Patriots, again without anti-missile capability, just as a gift to Israel's air defenses.

In both Germany and the Netherlands we are hearing murmurs that the transfers to Israel may interfere with transfers to Turkey. In both cases we have tried, and are trying, to make clear that the countries should follow through for Turkey. If they can then also help Israel, great. We recommend sticking with this policy, and it might help if the Israelis were also aware of it -- given our prompt efforts to meet their assessed immediate needs.
