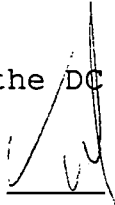
SUBJECT: Minutes for DC Meetings on the Gulf Crisis from

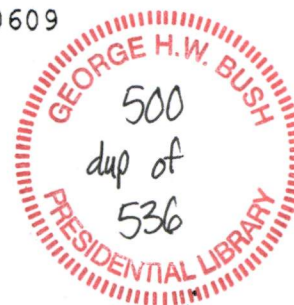

Minutes

1. For the Kaifu letter, we need numbers on money for the peacekeeping force, weapons of mass destruction special commission, refugees. It should be recast into a proposal form suggesting that we count this against their Desert Storm contributions shortfall. It should be coordinated with the interagency. (§)

2. We still have not received a response from Iran on our offer of assistance. (b)(1) thinks Iran is overestimating the numbers of refugees. ICRC and the intelligence supports Iran's numbers. We should ask the UNHCR to assess the problem. (§)

3. Guidance on emergency funds: State believes \$450 million is available. In the next few weeks we don't want to constrain the relief effort, so we should be prepared to use a supplemental to replenish these accounts. What about the timing on a supplemental? (S)

We should tap into existing accounts for now, and come up for a supplemental later when we have a better idea of the scope of U.S. assistance in conjunction with other international efforts. (S)

4. On the legal implications of the ceasefire acceptance for continuing combat air patrols (CAP), until coalition forces are out, there is a strong basis for continuing defense actions (suppression of Iraqi aircraft) that are a threat. After the withdrawal, CAP would be used to protect the airdrop under international law. Once relief organizations are conducting the relief operations, it will be harder to do under UNSC resolution 688. (S)

On zones, UNSC resolution 678 advocates use of all means necessary to establish peace and stability in the region. We should emphasize the activity and not the geography. It is better to deal with a situation de facto rather than codify with UN formality. In the south we have established the demilitarized zone. In the north, with the UN effort and international airlift, Iraq has been warned off. (S)

We should encourage UN humanitarian organization to go inside Iraq. We should get the UN, ICRC out beyond the DMZ in the south. We need to consider how much time before the airlift stops and US forces stay in the DMZ. Until the refugee situation clarifies, and for a few days more while the international organizations move in, perhaps for another week or two. UNIKOM troops can move into the south within 24 hours. We need to get the UN and ICRC into the north quickly, and to expand their operations in the south. (S)

There are four camps outside the DMZ with about 2500-2700 Iraqis in each. In Raffah there are some 5000 people near Saudi Arabia. In Safwan there are 5000 outside and 11,000 inside. UNIKOM will take 7-10 days to fully deploy. Is a message to Iraq still needed, and if so, it should be focussed on potential Iraqi activities and not zones. (S)

5. On supplies and flights, the French are flying into Iran. More U.S., UK and French flights are being flown into Iraq. 86 tons of supplies have been delivered. A U.S. supply train is moving to Incerlik from Italy. We are paying transportation costs from the U.S. to Europe and asking in Europe for them to transport from there to UN relief organizations. DoD is looking at the availability of excess supplies. European Command is the central coordinator. They need agency liaison officers to assist. (S)

We are setting up a hub near the Turkish triborder area that will be resupplied by rail and truck. The supplies will be moved from there to the camps by helicopters. Medical teams are ready to move. A hospital has been identified for shipment. (S)

The Turks need to be energized to support with their armed

6. U.S. private volunteer organizations want permission to go into northern Iraq. We could team them with U.S. forces informally with the ICRC and UN people. (S)

7. In the south, there is the question of access by Iraqi police forces to displaced persons. We need to make it clear to Iraq that interference with UN operations won't be tolerated. (S)

8. The routine redeployment of U.S. forces is continuing. There will be some U.S. troop presence in the DMZ until the refugee situation clarifies. (S)

9. We need to determine whether the UN has the capability to sustain this effort over a long period of time. We also need to keep Kurdish militants away from refugee camps. We should also send a message to the Turks that we are doing all this to keep their refugee and Kurdish problems from getting worse, so they should help. (S)
