The purpose of your meeting is to get interagency agreement on whether manpower limits made in the CFE IA talks can be changed only by consensus of the 22 states or unilaterally if a consensus cannot be reached in a reasonable time period. The discussion paper circulated to Deputies is at Tab A.

Background

The CFE IA negotiations have reconvened in Vienna after a period of "no business as usual" while we resolved the dispute over CFE. Meanwhile, NATO has been developing its opening proposal. Our objectives for CFE IA are political -- primarily to keep the Germans from being singularized on manpower levels. Our approach has been to make political declarations about our intended manpower levels which would not be legally binding. The Germans and other allies have pressed for a more formal approach. In particular, they want the manpower limits to be changed after the initial agreement only by consensus of the 22 states.

In April there was interagency consensus that we could accept revisions by consensus if the allies agreed that the U.S. could declare a manpower level that will be significantly above the number of troops we actually plan to keep in Europe. That consensus broke down in Washington in late April, and further development of the CFE IA revisions procedure has been on hold within NATO since then.

OSD and JCS want to retain the right to revise manpower limits unilaterally if consensus cannot be reached in a reasonable time period. State does not want to reopen the issue with the Allies and thinks that this would be a major issue with the Germans. State does not think that the document would have to be sent to the Senate for ratification. ACDA would like to revise limits unilaterally, but if they cannot be revised unilaterally, thinks that the agreement should be sent to the Senate for ratification.

Factors to Consider

1. Acceptability to the Allies. State will argue that this is reopening a "done deal" and that the allies will strongly object. State's argument is overwrought, but the question is nonetheless important. The Germans and French made a joint demarche in Washington last week asking, inter alia, that "the revision procedure should not undercut the validity of agreed manpower limits." Their concern appears to be less with singularity than with the political importance of continuing to pursue "real" arms control.

2. Congress and ratification. If national declarations can only be changed by consensus, some will argue that CFE IA is an obligation to limit our forces which requires Congressional approval. This is not a legal argument about whether or not we have to send the agreement to the Hill, but a political issue about how much the Congress would care if we did not send it forward and at what cost we could prevail.

3. U.S. flexibility for reinforcement. If we are able to sustain a declared manpower level for the U.S. that is significantly higher than our planned level in Europe, this issue will not have immediate military significance. OSD will argue that we are not at all sure that we can sustain such a high declared ceiling during the course of the negotiation.

Our view is that, **whatever is decided about revision procedures, this agreement should not be sent forward to the Congress for its approval.** It is unverifiable, will place unequal limits on the parties, and, in our view, will continue to be a political document. We should continue to keep CFE IA as a low-profile negotiation with limited political objectives.

You should let State and OSD take the lead in arguing the merits of the case for and against revisions by consensus. If it seems appropriate, you might suggest a revision procedure which would make a time-limited revision conference automatic, and if consensus cannot be reached at the revision conference, the political commitments to abide by the ceilings would expire.

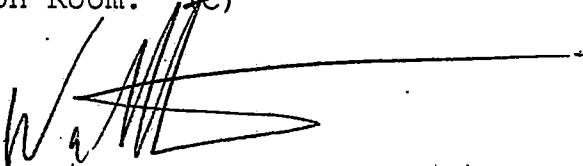

PATENTS

Sec. 32.²⁶ All research within the United States contracted for, sponsored, cosponsored, or authorized under authority of this Act, shall be provided for in such manner that all information as to uses, products, processes, patents, and other developments resulting from such research developed by Government expenditure will (with such exceptions and limitations, if any, as the Director may find to be necessary in the public interest) be available to the general public. This subsection shall not be so construed as to deprive the owner of any background patent relating thereto of such rights as he may have thereunder.

POLICY FORMULATION

Sec. 33.²⁷ The Director is authorized and directed to prepare for the President, the Secretary of State, and the heads of such other Government agencies, as the President may determine, recommendations concerning United States arms control and disarmament policy: *Provided, however,* That no action shall be taken under this or any other law that will obligate the United States to disarm or to reduce or to limit the Armed Forces or armaments of the United States, except pursuant to the treaty-making power of the President under the Constitution or unless authorized by further affirmative legislation by the Congress of the United States. Nothing contained in this Act shall be construed to authorize any policy or action by any Government agency which would interfere with, restrict, or prohibit the acquisition, possession, or use of firearms by an individual for the lawful purpose of personal defense, sport, recreation, education, or training.²⁸

NEGOTIATIONS AND RELATED FUNCTIONS

Sec. 34.²⁹ Under the direction of the Secretary of State—
(a) the Director, for the purpose of conducting negotiations concerning arms control and disarmament or for the purpose of exercising any other authority given him by this Act, may (1) consult and communicate with or direct the consultation and communication with representatives of other nations or of international organizations and (2) communicate in the name of the Secretary with diplomatic representatives of the United States in this country and abroad.³⁰

(b) the Director shall perform functions pursuant to section 2(c) of the Reorganization Plan 8 of 1953³¹ with respect to providing to
