Minutes

Brent Scowcroft: Thanks and welcome to those who are not usual Deputies Committee members. This is a little unusual. It is an unusual task. We are undertaking a major overhaul of intelligence requirements and priorities. (U)

The dramatic changes in the world bring into question the way we have been doing our targeting for the past forty years. We've

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had a particular focus on the USSR. We need to evaluate how the changes have affected the requirements. The Intelligence Community needs to remodel its operations over the next decade and a half. (U)

If we do this right, it will set patterns for the future. If we do it wrong it will also set the patterns. In the past, top-level policy people have handed off these kinds of tasks down the line and have not personally focused on them. Let's try to make it a thoughtful, serious process, analyzing what your agency needs from intelligence. Don't turn it over to the intelligence shop. Let's keep the focus on policy needs. (U)

We have a fairly short suspense. The goal is to affect the FY 1993 budget. We will need some delay in the budget. We need to move fast. By 15 February we want a set of top-level requirements in priority order. (U)

I really want the policy people to do it too. I want your own priorities of policy and how they will change over the decade. Don't do it pro forma. We'll get an initial list in the middle of January. We want to keep it simple and straightforward. (U)

Now we need to talk about any comments or changes that you might have on the Terms of Reference. They were general on purpose and we want to stimulate discussion. Each one of you should personally monitor this and make sure that things you get really matter. (U)

Jonathan Howe will take over when he gets here, but I will continue to monitor your progress. This is really important. (U)

Now, for any comments. (U)

Arnold Kanter: I have two questions. Is there going to be any substructure to the DC, something like a PCC to refine these issues? My second question has to do with each of us stipulating our policy priorities leading to intelligence priorities, then we'll integrate the intelligence priorities but not necessarily the policy priorities. (U)

Brent Scowcroft: I think you're going to have to integrate both. Only then will the intelligence priorities make sense. (U)

Bill Working: On the first question of substructure, we don't intend to have a subgroup, but rather will get the inputs from the departments and agencies and I will mash them together. We may need a subgroup at some later point. (U)

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John Robson: Would we benefit in the creation of our first submission by some interaction of those with common subjects? Can we establish some general groupings that we can build the requirements in. (U)

Brent Scowcroft: I should have said earlier that we will have a couple of meetings before January 15 to work out the process and problems that might come up. I don't have any problem with general groupings. What we want to do is get your preliminary ideas and get back together. (U)

David Jeremiah: The NITs are organized by topics. Would you like it organized in that fashion? (U)

Brent Scowcroft: It might be useful to follow, but I don't want to be bound by it. (U)

Paul Wolfowitz: Customer surveys like the NITs don't get very high level attention because most of us think they don't make a difference. It may be useful to give the DC an input on how these requirements will be made into programs. The product may be too abstract to be of use. A set of requirements is hard to translate into investments. (U)

Brent Scowcroft: I've done it many times. I know the problems with abstract requirements. (U)

Andy Card: It may be we need two lists. One for where we are today, and where we want to be tomorrow. You do that for each of the three categories. I fear that everything will end up in category 1. (Mr. Card's remarks evidently refer to the categories: critical, valuable and not needed, which are mentioned in the Terms of Reference.) (U)

Arnold Kanter: Is there an extant example of how you want this? (U)

Robert Howard: I have a copy of the Foreign Intelligence Requirements Categories and Priorities. It is very detailed. Is that what you want? (U)

Brent Scowcroft: I want to know what are your fundamental priorities in the world out there. What's needed now that wasn't needed before? I want something from policy to help the Intelligence Community restructure. (U)

Robert Howard: A strawman paper for going from here to there would be useful. It would have the baseline of current priorities and where the emphasis is changed. It would also describe the general program impacts. (U)

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Arthur Rothkopf: I expect that we will say that the traditional areas of intelligence are still important to us. We may be adding, not dropping, topics. (U)

Brent Scowcroft: But you don't have to try to cover all possible fronts where you could be doing things just to cover all contingencies. (U)

Henson Moore: We work with intelligence mostly on the Defense programs. We may want to use it differently in the future. We may see an opportunity to define new requirements and relationships. One of our requirements may be to declassify more of the intelligence so that we can use it better. (U)

Brent Scowcroft: I was thinking about Bob Howard's notion of a strawman. That may not be a bad idea. (U)

John Robson: I think it is important to develop something so we avoid a total free form process. Some segmentation of the gathering process. (U)

Richard Kerr: I want to stay out of the requirements side, but maybe it's important to help you look at the end-game. I can imagine that we will need 150% of today's capability, a 50% increase, to meet all of the interests when we translate them to resource and programmatic terms. Two things would be helpful. What the DC could give us is where the major thrusts of policy will be different from today. And, secondly, to tell us which things may be less important in the future. I was talking to Secretary Baker the other day and he said that we shouldn't worry so much about COCOM and technology transfer issues anymore. That's the kind of input that we need. (S)

David Jeremiah: Let's make a distinction between technical intelligence and technology transfer. I might agree on the technology transfer point, but we still need technical intelligence. (S)

Brent Scowcroft: We spend a lot of time and resources on things that may not be so important any more. We used to know exactly where the threat was coming from and we could concentrate on that. The Soviet Union. (U)

David Jeremiah: From our standpoint, we need to look at a wide area and be able to focus instantaneously. We don't know where the next threat is coming from anymore. (U)

Brent Scowcroft: Now such problems as proliferation produce a very different requirement. It may be harder for intelligence. (U)

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David Jeremiah: Come January 15 we are likely to have to make order out of chaos with these requirements. (U)

Arnold Kanter: We need to go off and think about January 15, what's required, and exchange some ideas. (U)

Brent Scowcroft: Yes. Look at how you want to approach this thing. (U)

Bill Working: Some brainstorming early on may prove to be more valuable than a hard structure. (U)

Brent Scowcroft: Why don't we reconvene in two weeks and see what we've got. (U)

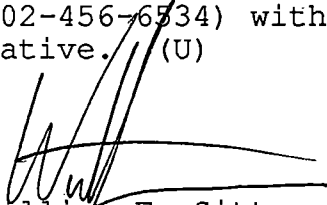

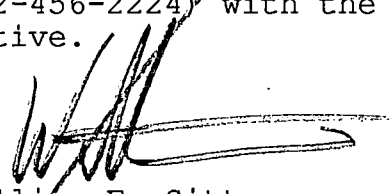

SUBJECT: Intelligence Capabilities: 1992-2005

The end of the Cold War and collapse of Soviet Communism already have radically altered the international landscape. The dramatic changes in U.S. defense planning and our new nuclear initiative reflect the Department of Defense's recognition of these changes and a forward-looking restructuring of priorities and programs.

Many new, non-Soviet issues have assumed greater importance for the Intelligence Community in recent years, issues such as terrorism, narcotics, proliferation, economic intelligence, technology transfer, and others. Inevitably, however, the Community's primary mission and first priority has remained the Soviet Union, Soviet and Warsaw Pact military forces, and Soviet foreign activities. The collapse of the Soviet Empire and the extraordinary uncertainties in its wake will result in new demands for intelligence information on the former Soviet Union,

but should lead also to an intensification of effort in key non-Soviet areas already being addressed. New issues for intelligence attention are being suggested routinely.

CIA and the Intelligence Community have their roots deep in a Cold War that is now over and the threat of a Soviet military that is now struggling at home to preserve its very existence, to avoid its breakup into multiple republic armies. We are in transition from watching Soviet operational readiness to wondering about the control of Soviet nuclear weapons. The Soviet Union and Eastern Europe have been transformed, the Warsaw Pact dissolved, and Soviet activism abroad (especially in the Third World) dramatically curtailed. There is growing interest here at home in our intelligence services tackling new issues and problems. Together, these developments urgently require a top to bottom examination of the mission, role and priorities of the Intelligence Community.

The first step in this effort will be a comprehensive identification by policy departments and agencies of their anticipated intelligence information and support needs to the year 2005. This will require the projection of international developments as well as policy issues, problems and opportunities well into the future. In the first phase of the review, your intelligence organizations (where they exist) should not be involved. Instead, policy officials in your department or agency should develop for your personal consideration and approval the principal intelligence requirements for your organization into the next century. This is not a detailed requirements process. Rather, it is an identification of the categories of political, economic and military information needed for diverse issues and regions of the world. This includes intelligence needed to support our military forces. Beyond the traditional areas of interest, we need to consider intensified intelligence efforts in some global problems and new efforts in others. For example, will we need more and different intelligence information on international aspects of the environment, natural resource scarcities (such as water), global health problems, international research and development efforts, and so on? What kinds of economic intelligence do we need? At the same time, what information are you receiving now that you will not need at all or where you can accept far less detailed knowledge?

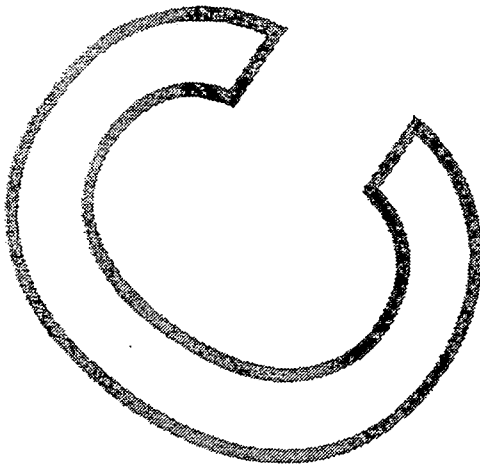
The Deputies Committee should prepare terms of reference for this review, and, at its conclusion, integrate and prioritize the requirements of all departments for NSC review and my approval. Departmental requirements should be forwarded for Deputies Committee review and integration by January 15, 1992. The integrated requirements report should be ready for NSC review by February 15, 1992.

Subsequent to approval of a policy-based mission and priorities report, the Director of Central Intelligence will identify resources available to address these priorities, resources not relevant to the new requirements and thus available for reallocation, and gaps where new resources may be needed. Based on the results of this analysis, the DCI should also provide to the NSC his recommendations for structural changes in the Community, organizational adjustments, possible new legislation, and alternative budget proposals needed to address the new requirements to the year 2005. These recommendations should be forwarded to the NSC by March 20, 1992.

Senior policymakers traditionally have neglected their critical role in setting intelligence priorities and requirements. The revolutionary world of today and tomorrow, the huge uncertainties we face, the constraints on our resources, and the need to plan well ahead all make it imperative that each of you take a personal interest in this effort.

The Intelligence Community today is being asked to cope with issues ranging from traditional Soviet military forces to the environment, from economic competitiveness to AIDS. We must establish the proper role, mission and priorities for U.S. intelligence in this changed and changing world. Otherwise, our capabilities will spread too thin to satisfy even the highest priorities and our inability to plan and invest long-term will leave us with inadequate intelligence assets to protect our vital interests and our security.
