Robert Gates opened the meeting by stating that most of the recommendations of the PCC probably did not require discussion because they were obvious remedies to a serious problem and should therefore be implemented quickly. The seven items that required discussion were:

Mr. Gates asked that other than the topics he originally listed, could he assume that we had agreement to implement the remaining suggestions in the PCC paper? (There was general affirmation.) Regarding the resource question, Mr. Gates suggested that the types of things considered in spending the first \$1 million were not a problem because they were all things that obviously should be done. (There was general agreement.) However, he questioned what would actually be gained for \$6.7 million in public access control or \$3 million in CT training.

Mr. Kimmitt asked who swallows the \$1 million expenditure? (U)

Mr. Gates said reprioritizing seems most likely. We defer to State's Bureau of Diplomatic Security to rearrange its expenditures to shift funds from other areas because the threat has become greater in the Philippines. (Ø)

Mr. Kimmitt said that if we move above the \$1 million level, reprogramming within the Bureau of Diplomatic Security would be impossible. We would need to look at other sources in the 150 account. (Ø)

SUBJECT: Review of Philippine Security Policy (S)

(S) In response to your request at the National Security Council's Deputies Meeting on the subject policy, the Agency for International Development supports, with the provisos discussed during the meeting, the conclusions and recommendations of the Policy Coordinating Committee on The Terrorist Threat to U.S. Interests in the Philippines.

(S) With regard to reducing U.S. official presence, I note the recommendation to accelerate efforts to reduce the U.S. official presence, in conjunction with a review of Mission staffing. I want to emphasize that with the recent and expected substantial increases in U.S. economic assistance and our determination to protect against corruption and deal with pipeline concerns, I see a very strong need to at least marginally increase A.I.D.'s current field staff. The staff is already alarmingly lean in relation to the large program for which we must be accountable. We will, of course, attempt to keep such increases to a minimum.

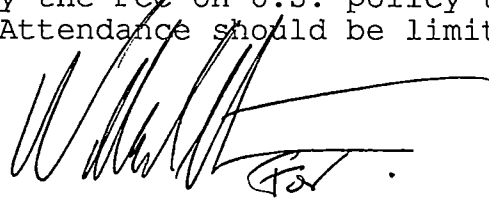

SUBJECT: Security Enhancements - The Philippines

During your inter-agency meeting on May 26, a paper was distributed which addressed some security proposals. As I mentioned at that time, the paper did not properly address security enhancements requested by the post and supported by DS.

The assessment of the threat should be the driving force to determine the level of security support that should be provided to the post. We believe that the security environment in the Philippines will continue to deteriorate. Future NPA attacks against selected USG personnel are considered highly probable, with special focus upon military personnel perceived to be connected with the counterinsurgency effort (such as Colonel Rowe), purported intelligence personnel, and senior diplomatic personnel. Additionally, the possibility of NPA attacks against USG facilities and residences cannot be precluded. The JUSMAG compound itself was subject to a grenade attack by unknown perpetrators (probably either JRA or NPA) in April 1986 and the April 9 attack against the U.S. communications facility on Mt. Cabuyao could indicate that facilities, as well as personnel, might again be considered viable targets. DS therefore believes that measures appropriate to counter attacks against both personnel and facilities should be implemented.

As you know, following the fatal attack on Col. Rowe, the post forwarded to the Department a package of approximately 23 security related requests which it felt would address not only its immediate security needs, but also its long-term needs.

Several of the post's requests were supported immediately by DS from available funds or resources. Several other requests remain outstanding because of funding problems. We have reviewed the outstanding requests and believe the following are realistic and responsive to the immediate and long-term threat in The Philippines.

Personnel Resources

Five (5) FSN Contract Employees \$30,000
This represents the annual cost of hiring 5 individuals under personal services contracts to run counter-surveillances on frequently used routes.

Increase Local Guard Complement by one hundred (100)-\$300,000
Post proposes to use these guards to enhance local guard coverage of residences. This is an annual cost.

Residential Security Enhancements

Upgrade the Physical Security of JUSMAG Residences \$225,000
This would be used to enhance the security at existing JUSMAG residences or for new residences, if JUSMAG would become part of the Embassy's leasing program. The latter is recommended in that there's more stability in the Embassy's program and the costs for residential security would not be reoccurring.

Enhanced Communications

Secure Voice Communications Capability \$255,000
There have been several incidents of our current non-secure radio communications systems being monitored by outsiders. This is a very obvious vulnerability to post's protective security program. These funds would allow for the procurement of 42 portables, 14 mobiles, 3 repeaters, and 4 base stations.

Post also requested 2 transceivers which would allow the Embassy security staff to communicate directly with helicopter pilots who arrive regularly at the Embassy. We are attempting to determine if this equipment may be obtainable on a long-term loan basis from DOD.

Armored Vehicles

Procure Two (2) LAVs \$40,000
Post requested 2 FAVs to be used by the 5 contract employees

doing counter-surveillance work. The cost for two FAVs would be \$260,000. We are indicating to post that LAVs are adequate for the function.

Procure Two (2) LAV Shuttle Vans \$60,000
Post is currently using unarmored shuttles to move employees (20-25 people at any one time) to and from work. The current vehicles are too light weight to handle armoring.

Modification to Existing LAVs \$125,000
Some of the existing LAVs at post need to be modified to incorporate new LAV armoring technology. The post has 25 such vehicles (16 State vehicles and 9 other agency vehicles). These modifications include replacement of the windshield armoring and armoring of the sail areas.

Facility Security

Public Access Control (PAC) \$6,700,000
If as anticipated, the security situation continues to deteriorate, the NPA's modus operandi could very well shift from attacks on vehicles to attacks on our office facilities. Pending at both the Embassy and the Consulate in Cebu are long planned PAC projects. These projects are not currently funded in either FY-89 or FY-90.

Anti-Terrorism Assistance (ATA) Program

ATA Training \$3,000,000
ATA training for Philippine security forces is budgeted for \$1,300,000 in FY-90. Although the benefit in terms of the protection to our personnel and facilities is indirect, we estimate that we would be able to increase the level of training if the additional funds become available.
