HUMANITARIAN AID TO BOSNIA-HERCEGOVINA

Even as UN resolution 757 imposes stiff sanctions on Belgrade for its aggression in Bosnia, the problem of getting urgently needed humanitarian assistance to over one million refugees and displaced persons in Yugoslavia remains urgent.

In addition to calling for a comprehensive trade embargo on Serbia and Montenegro, UNSCR 757

"Demands that all parties and others concerned create immediately the necessary conditions for unimpeded delivery of humanitarian supplies to Sarajevo and other destinations in Bosnia and Hercegovina, including the establishment of a security zone encompassing Sarajevo and its airport and respecting the agreements signed in Geneva on 22 May 1992."

Currently, the only aid reaching Sarajevo comes via informally organized shipments originating largely from Croatia. Both the UNHCR and ICRC have suspended operations in Bosnia because of the dangers posed by irregulars and both organizations have reportedly refused to accept armed escort. The Izetbegovic regime has repeatedly asked for international assistance. The UN was to begin negotiations today to open Sarajevo airport for the delivery of aid, but UN efforts to broker cease-fires in Bosnia have not proven successful.

Our objective should be to get aid into Bosnia. Our strategy would be based on using the UN resolution as the authorizing mechanism, CSCE as the facilitating mechanism, and NATO as the implementing mechanism.

The following suggests elements of one approach using this strategy:

- Highlight UNSCR 757 and the repeated requests of the Bosnian government for humanitarian aid as the basis for the operation.
- The U.S., together with the Russians and Europeans, deliver a simple demarche to Belgrade that we intend to bring humanitarian aid into Bosnia and that we expect the Serbs to respond positively by [unblocking Sarajevo airport and withdrawing forces from the surrounding hills] [respecting the UN-brokered agreement to open the airport]. In our message, we would underscore [the language of the NAC and NACC communiques] [our intent] to use whatever capability is required to ensure that humanitarian assistance is brought

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in (conveying the strongest possible message that we intend to exercise right of access to deliver this humanitarian aid).

- CSCE would then call on NATO to plan, organize, and execute the delivery of aid.

Undertaking the Operation

Because the delivery of humanitarian aid could occur under benign, hostile, or generally uncertain conditions, we would need to evaluate specifically what we are prepared to do under these various circumstances. In other words, we would not simply decide whether or not to support an initiative to bring humanitarian assistance to Bosnia by force, if necessary. Rather, we could decide to support [or not] such an initiative under certain circumstances, while adopting a different approach under others, or even choosing not to support any initiative under others circumstances still.

- Hostile conditions: The worst case. Serbian forces actively oppose delivery of aid. NATO [or other executing agency] must decide how to answer the 'or else' question, including the possibility of using armed force to see that the aid gets in.

- Uncertain conditions: Belgrade and Karadzic agree to cooperate but say they cannot fully guarantee behavior of irregulars in surrounding area.

- Benign conditions: Belgrade cooperates with UN demand to open the airport and demonstrates cooperation as many more unofficial convoys make it to Sarajevo. UNHCR and ICRC begin to resume operations in Bosnia.

Requirements

- Strategic transport aircraft (C5B; C141)
- Medical supplies, food, other supplies
- Support facilities for aircraft loading
- Support troops in Sarajevo, as required
- Air superiority/ground attack aircraft, as required

Issues

Under what conditions we will be operating? Can we influence them?

What should be our response given our estimate of these conditions?

How should we answer the 'or else' question?

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What, if any, role should the U.S. play?

Advantages of U.S. Participation

- Demonstrates U.S. concern for victims of aggression
- Supports Izetbegovic regime in Sarajevo
- Serbian regime a nearly perfect adversary; totalitarian, aggressive, (communist), defiant in face of international condemnation
- May aid growing domestic opposition to Milosevic
- May help keep Croatia out of Bosnia by enfranchising it in the aid effort
- May help ensure successful operation: U.S. commitment to this operation will be a sobering factor to Milosevic; the Serbs could very well blink. Operation could succeed early and establish a 'beachhead' for others (ICRC/UNHCR) to resume their operations

Disadvantages

- Worst scenario could be entirely likely. Results in an extremely dangerous operation. U.S. soldiers could get killed.
- Aid may get to airport but not beyond. Distribution impeded. Operation could appear gimmicky and token.
- Europeans may be reluctant to follow-through. U.S. could be left with greatest responsibility for operation by default (after having taken rhetorical lead).
- Attacks on aid shipments may resume after a period of initial cooperation -- NATO [executing agency] faced with decision whether to continue or withdraw.
- May be difficult to limit scope of operation once early success is achieved.

The End Game: Reaching Our Objective of Delivering Aid

We can determine the appropriate endpoint for the operation in a number of ways:

- Determine ahead of time a level of aid [or time period] to be delivered
- Bosnian government assumes responsibility for the operation, says "thanks for the help"

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-- UNHCR/ICRC assume responsibility for the operation

Orchestrating the Airlift

1. Bosnian government repeats plea for humanitarian aid (we have this already)
2. Citing UNSCR 757, U.S. begins discussions in Perm3/5 for a airlift of humanitarian
3. U.S. initiates discussion in NAC/NACC on possibility of using NATO as executing agent
4. U.S. initiates discussion in CSCE
5. CSCE supports idea of airlift; asks NATO for help to execute
6. NATO considers operation, timetable, distribution of responsibilities

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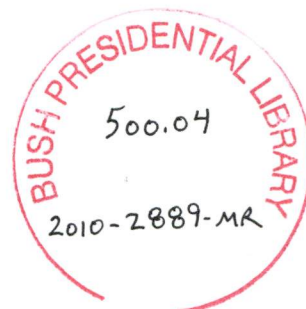

Summary of Conclusions

1. The situation in Bosnia continues to deteriorate. There has been no appreciable let up in the violence. The UN has been unsuccessful in its attempts to deliver humanitarian aid to Sarajevo or open the airport. (Ø)

2. An early readout on sanctions indicate that states are generally falling into line. (b)(1) and State will explore other ways (UN/EC monitors, CSCE observers, blockade, etc.) we might pursue to enforce compliance. State will examine ways to tighten up transshipment practices as well as a strategy for addressing compensation issues that may arise. (Ø)

3. A small group was tasked to examine the general issue of humanitarian relief to refugees of the crisis in Yugoslavia and the specific problem of delivering humanitarian aid to Bosnia. The group would evaluate the various conditions under which any humanitarian effort would occur including the potential need to

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use force to ensure unimpeded access for the aid. It would also explore alternative ways for getting aid into Bosnia beyond an airlift into Sarajevo airport. Similarly, the group will examine whether establishing refugee camps outside Bosnia (in Croatia, Slovenia or Macedonia, for example) would help alleviate the growing refugee problem. (Ø)

4. State is exploring ways in CSCE to get an increased international presence in Kosovo. State and CIA will also develop IWs and other steps that may help prevent the conflict from spreading into this region. (Ø)

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
