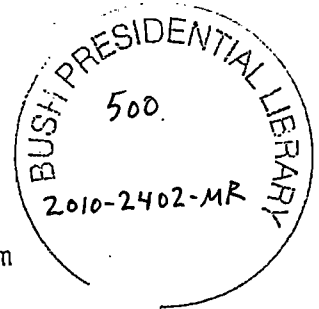

It was agreed that:

- Force Contributions for UNOSOM II: The US should continue to build support for force contributions to UNOSOM II, working with the UN. The US should seek to have the UN answer our request for comments on potential UNOSOM II contributors. (S)
- New UNSCR Resolution: We seek to have a new UNSC resolution passed as soon as possible. Consultations with the Secretary General's staff will begin Wednesday. Secretary Eagleburger will be asked to call the UN Secretary General Thursday to urge him to push forward with a new UNSC Resolution next.

- The Core Group will meet to address several textual problems with the resolution including: whether it explicitly mentions chapter seven, what it says about rules of engagement, whether to call for disbanding militias, the assessment issue, and war crimes. (S)
- US Role in UNOSOM II: The State/DOD team will brief the UN on tentative finding considering US contribution to the UNOSOM II. A memo describing this contribution is requested. (S)

- Funding: We believe that UNOSOM II should be an assessed operation and that the US should be able to deduct the costs of its contributions to UNOSOM II from our assessment. State will continue to seek contributions to the UNITAF fund. DOD will provide an estimate of how much we have spent (and will spend) supporting other contingents. (S)

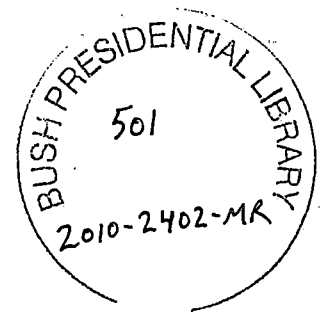

Admiral Howe: I want to welcome especially Bob Oakley. We are very proud of the job you have done. We couldn't have gotten where we are without your skills. We are glad you are going back. [Applause] (U)

Ambassador Oakley: For once, I have been fascinated by the way the military and the civilians have come together. The mix and the background is right. We have experiences and talk about Vietnam and Lebanon, and how to do it right this time. (U)

Admiral Studeman: Violent crime remains a serious problem in Mogadishu and elsewhere. 14(c)(b)(3) Aideed has ordered surveillance of U.S. personnel at the airport, port and Embassy. (S)

Coalition representatives visited the cantonment areas and we have a map showing where Aideed's forces have placed vehicles and weapons. Ali Mahdi's forces have also placed material in one cantonment, but continue to hold back weapons. Unmounted machine guns were absent from the weapons and they are being held in reserve. (S)

14(c) [REDACTED] Jess representatives have agreed to no arms in the city of Kismayo. You know about the mass graves near Kismayo and now there is evidence there may be a third site. (S)

We will need to worry about the zone between Kismayo and Bardera where Morgan's forces may be trapped. We also have Aideed forces near Galcaio, with SSDF forces to the west. No coalition forces are there yet, and there is some concern that Aideed may be massing forces to move. 14(c) [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] There is a report that six Ethiopian soldiers died in a fight with Islamic fundamentalists near Yet. 14(c) [REDACTED]

Admiral Howe: On wanting to fly the UN flag. This is an old issue, although we have not seen a public statement from UN officials on that. (TS)

General Leland: That came out as we negotiated a resolution. (S)

Admiral Howe: They have assigned security to the Paks there. This comes from people around Boutros-Ghali, not people in Mogadishu. (S)

Mr. Wisner: I called Boutros-Ghali on Sunday at midnight. He said don't worry. The press had made a big deal of it, but he didn't think so. (S)

Admiral Howe: If we are asked to fly the UN flag, we want to consider it since it would fit our strategy of transition. (TS)

General Leland: The key thing is who the forces work for, and that is the USG. They can fly the flag. (TS)

The operation continues to go smoothly. We are in phase three, the stabilization phase. Eight sectors have been established. A lot of more heavy equipment is beginning to arrive by sea. The ships are now bringing in aviation. There will be more

helicopters. This will allow them to aggressively patrol the whole area. They will be more aggressive going after weapons. (S)

There are 19 allies there. ^{14(d)} [REDACTED] There are 20,000 Americans in the AOR. I have a handout which shows the 19 nations there, what they have, and when they will arrive if they are not already there. Page 2 is our best cut of who the peacekeepers are. The first column says 4500 are already there. (S)

Admiral Howe: The French? (S)

General Leland: The last reading was that they were not staying. This may be a function of how much we will stay. (S)

Ambassador Oakley: What about the Moroccans? (S)

General Leland: Since they are not on the second chart, I assume not. (S)

There is a lot there. There is a scheme in the eight sectors to have allies there. The eight will reduce to four and then we will transition. (S)

Ambassador Oakley: We have to deal with the anomaly around Galcaio. (S)

Admiral Howe: Will it be hard? (S)

Ambassador Oakley: No. Johnston is supremely confident. It will be the same method as Baidoa and Bardera. I think this has been approved by Hoar, and is an essential part of our negotiations with the UN. (S)

Mr. Wolfowitz: As we look at a long-term exercise, it is not a big number. (S)

General Leland: The assessment is that 20,000 is certainly adequate, and it could be done with less. (S)

Ambassador Oakley: The French will be very useful, and so could the Moroccans. (S)

General Leland: There are a few dominant contributors. (S)

Ambassador Oakley: Are the Germans off or on? (S)

General Leland: I understand they are on. (S)

Admiral Howe: You don't have the U.S. (S)

General Leland: Yes. If we have 2000-3000. (S)

Our limit is now 24,000 and we may never get there. (S)

Admiral Howe: The sooner we can withdraw the better. (S)

Mr. Wolfowitz: If these numbers turn out to be a facade, we will be holding the bag. (S)

Admiral Howe: This is soft. (S)

Mr. Wolfowitz: Very soft and it may not be up to a year or two. (S)

Ambassador Oakley: Boutros-Ghali is worried about troop contributors but must pin it down. (S)

Admiral Howe: We should be pushing the UN on it. (S)

Mr. Clarke: The Indonesians and Koreans said they would contribute if asked. (S)

Admiral Bowman: Twelve countries with 15,000 troops are considering. (S)

Admiral Howe: What is important is the duals -- coalition and UNOSOM II. We need to put a high priority to getting them in. (S)

Ambassador Oakley: Johnston feels comfortable with French, Italians, Indians and Pakistanis as the main contributors, and moving further north will need a couple more. It is almost an unmanageable job with all these bits and drabs. But if we can these the ones to stay there, it will work. (S)

Mr. Wolfowitz: The French are there only as long as we are. (S)

Admiral Howe: (S) (S)

Mr. Wolfowitz: We want some clear long-term commitments. (S)

Ambassador Oakley: Johnston is trying to work it out. (S)

Mr. Wolfowitz: We need to sign people up now. (S)

Admiral Howe: Ed, can you in your contacts with Lanxade, ask about this? (S)

Mr. Wisner: It will be tough to get it, but it will be a problem if we encourage someone to stand up unless the UN is willing to invite them. (S)

Mr. Clarke: All the countries on the list were shown to the UN. (S)

General Leland: Our list is people who are committed, but not necessarily to the UN. (S)

Mr. Wisner: Until Boutros-Ghali is committed to a package, he won't commit to a country. I can't imagine that the Secretary General will say no to the French. We should be careful thereafter to work with the UN. (C)

Ambassador Oakley: Boutros-Ghali raised it with Johnston, and we can go back to the people in New York. (C)

Admiral Howe: It seems like a conversation we had a month ago. (C)

Let's concentrate on the de facto idea. (C)

General Leland: We will bring people in. The vast majority of those who will stay will be there by the end of the month. (C)

Admiral Howe: The timing of this meeting was keyed to the Addis Ababa conference. Now, we are chomping at the bit, Addis is finished, and how do we bring the resolution forward? (C)

Mr. Wisner: Addis isn't over yet. The Somalis are still meeting under the watchful eye of the Ethiopian president. This follows a Bob Oakley model to get the Somalis in a room together. But we don't have high hopes. (C)

The next issue is where we are with the UN and a resolution. I wrote several recommendations in a cable I sent from Geneva after meeting with Boutros-Ghali. I have talked to him or his people three times since then. It will be hard to nail down. My recommendation is that we pursue it carefully. Our team should go to New York tomorrow and go over the resolution carefully. We should have the elements go to capitals of the Security Council members and the troop contributors. Then Larry Eagleburger should try to call Boutros-Ghali on Thursday to tell him what we are doing. We have some signals to advance blurring the difference to have as much overlap between phase one and phase two as possible, so the Somalis cannot play off the U.S. and the UN. I cannot say we have overcome the doubt in Boutros-Ghali's mind that the situation is in order and we are linked to the new Administration sufficiently. (C)

Admiral Howe: I think it is being used to shove the issue down the road. I don't think it is a real problem. (C)

You say to go to the Perm 5 and the troop contributing countries. Is this after Eagleburger calls? (C)

Mr. Wisner: Tomorrow evening, and then have Eagleburger tell the Secretary General what we are doing. By Monday/Tuesday we should have reactions in and then can evaluate going to the resolution, a Chapter 6 resolution. (C)

Mr. Clarke: If it is Chapter 6, we are limited by law to a maximum of 1000 serving under the UN.

Mr. Wisner: Can't we duck that with a U.S. commander? (C)

General Leland: Yes. If it is politically necessary, we can say it is under UN command. We just need an exception from Congress. (S)

Mr. Clarke: That will take time. (S)

Admiral Howe: Anything more on tactics? (S)

Mr. Wisner: I have nothing to add. Now is the time to do it. I warned the Secretary General. His people are divided and he is on the road. We haven't heard the end of the story. (S)

General Leland: On walking the line between 6 and 7, we may need tougher ROE than under the current draft. We need to work with you. (S)

Ambassador Oakley: If the Somalis sense that the new force will have the same constraints (S) (S) The same with command. It has to carry over in a seamless way. (S)

Admiral Howe: What is the problem with the ROE? (S)

General Leland: It reads like a peacekeeping resolution. (S)

Ambassador Oakley: The resolution won't spell it out enough. Discussions with the Security Council and the troop contributors have to make it clear. (S)

Admiral Howe: I agree with you, and we need to nail it down. (S)

Boutros-Ghali probably recognizes this is a new way the UN has to proceed. (S)

Mr. Michel: If you are going to go out to capitals, could you remind them that there is also reconstruction ahead? (S)

Mr. Wisner: The road in Somalia is long and many steps follow. The UN will have to support it. Perhaps we should put it in the context of a flow of support. (S)

General Leland: In Boutros-Ghali's report, he talks about the need to take action against the threat of return to violence, etc. (S)

Admiral Howe: Let's have the Core Group look at the resolution, and try to have a cable cleared and out tomorrow. (S)

Mr. Howard: Does it allow for financing by assessment? (S)

Mr. Wisner: Yes, but there is a question about U.S. forces. If we don't have them under the UNPA, we can't get paid for them. We would pay for our forces and their 30 percent. (S)

Mr. Clarke: Under Chapter 7 there is no UNPA, but also no precedent for an assessment. We should discuss it with the UN. (S)

Admiral Howe: You should discuss it with them tomorrow. (S)

Mr. Wolfowitz: Paragraph 2 of the resolution, demanding disbandment of all bands and paramilitary forces, implies that force will be used to do this. (S)

Ambassador Oakley: The practical implications are horrendous. (U)

Mr. Wisner: I am sure it could be written in a less confrontational way. (S)

Ambassador Oakley: It creates a confrontation with these people, and it is difficult to do by force of arms. (S)

Admiral Howe: Let's have the Core Group really scrub the resolution. (S)

Mr. Wolfowitz: The next question is that expanding UNOSOM II is based on a report. Is that where the ROE are? (S)

Mr. Clarke: There is no report yet. It doesn't exist. (S)

Mr. Wisner: We may have to take that out and force a report to be made. (S)

Mr. Wolfowitz: I would prefer to drop paragraph 2, and get our ROE to say that it permits such disarming as necessary. Disarming is a means not an end. (S)

Admiral Howe: We will look at that. (S)

Mr. Russell: Our PAO at USUN tells us that the press corps around the UN have backed off the story that Boutros-Ghali and the U.S. are on different track. (S)

Admiral Howe: Let's shift to the military contribution to UNOSOM II. Ed, I was hoping we would have received a paper in advance of this meeting. (S)

General Leland: We will send a planning cell to New York which will stay, principally logisticians, to work with the UN on the details. When you have a multi-national group, this is not a trivial matter. It will be solved in Somalia. The key is to stand up the UNOSOM II command and getting the UNOSOM II commander named. Colin Powell gave Larry Eagleburger a list of (S) and he will call Boutros-Ghali. There apparently was (S)

Mr. Wisner: I mentioned that to the Secretary-General's man, who spoke to the Secretary-General who then spoke to Goulding. (S)

Tomorrow we can take Goulding aside on this. He has heard from the Secretary-General.

General Leland: We haven't prepared 1.4(d) yet. If we think we will be successful, that needs to be done. (S)

Ambassador Oakley: Johnston had in mind a U.S. chief of staff. (S)

General Leland: Yes, and other key people on the staff. We need to put the right Americans in there. Clearly in logistics, and probably in the UN organization as well. (S)

Ambassador Oakley: Americans are making the humanitarian side run. (U)

Mr. Wolfowitz: 1.4(d)
(S)

Admiral Howe: We will deal with that tomorrow. (S)

1.4(d)

Ambassador Oakley: Colin thought of one. (S)

Mr. Wisner: General 1.4(d) (S)

General Leland: Everybody thought of him. 1.4(d)
The pacer is English.

Ambassador Oakley: If you have a U.S. chief of staff, and he is cooperative. (S)

Admiral Howe: You are talking about 4000 U.S. troops, logistics, intelligence, command and control. Under U.S. command or an opcon type situation? (S)

General Leland: There are some traps to be run in the Pentagon yet on the command relationship. (S)

Admiral Howe: The QRF is in addition? (S)

Ambassador Oakley: That's until people are comfortable.

Admiral Howe: This QRF would be an opcon arrangement? (S)

General Leland: That is not clear. It may stay under the U.S. (S)

One key element is the commitment from the next Administration. The other is that our allies think that the U.S. won't stay. (S)

Admiral Howe: Where are we on being able to present this tomorrow? (S)

General Leland: It is good to give a pitch on what we are unique in, and others could do the rest. (S)

Admiral Howe: At some point we would want a memo from the Secretary that we can show the President. (S)

Ambassador Oakley: The military is shifting to private contractors. But someone has to pay the bill. (S)

General Leland: This number would reduce as it goes to a contract operation. (S)

Admiral Howe: The final issue is fundraising. (S)

Mr. Howard: We have the fund which covers UNITAF. We have made lots of progress with the UN. There is only \$100 million or so in the fund, all in yen. We estimated the costs at \$483 million, which may be liberal. On UNOSOM II, I thought it was going to be assessed. (S)

Mr. Clarke: Yes, but it would set a precedent of being Chapter 7 and assessed. (S)

Admiral Howe: We are saying we would pay our assessments and either get credit or reimbursed. (S)

Ambassador Oakley: Boutros-Ghali is worried. The UN fears we are paying now and who will pay for phase two? If it is assessed, great. (S)

Mr. Wolfowitz: I would like to ask why the fund cannot pay for UNOSOM II. (S)

Mr. Howard: That was left open. (S)

Mr. Wisner: We were very skittish with ^{174(b)} At the moment the fund has \$100 million plus, and there is no fix on what the operation will cost. There are about 14 governments we want to shake again. I decided that as a first cut I will call ambassadors here. We will also send cables out to the field. At some point we will get Larry Eagleburger involved. Does the President want to be involved? (S)

Admiral Howe: Let's reserve that for the tough issues. (S)

Mr. Wisner: I want to reserve it for the key ones. (S)

Mr. Howard: Congress will make a big issue of why we are paying more than our costs. (S)

Admiral Howe: Japan is in the lead with \$100 million. (S)

Mr. Wolfowitz: This is not comparable to what we are doing and paying. (S)

Admiral Howe: They have been told that. (S)

Mr. Wisner: We have told them we reserve the right to come back for more. (S)

Admiral Howe: We need to know how much this is costing. (S)

Let's conclude with Taiwan. Jim Lilly raised it last time. 14(d)

[REDACTED] (S)

Mr. Wisner: We started with the voluntary agencies, which have a big need for cash. They will be carrying much of the reconstruction burden. If Taiwan can do it, it will be better for them than putting money in a big fund. There are two problems. 14(d)

[REDACTED] Our view is that the best way is to get funding for the voluntary agencies. (S)

Admiral Howe: Including for what I call the "Oakley fund" to rebuild Mogadishu. (S)

Mr. Michel: We will have big costs at every stage and need money. (S)

Mr. Wolfowitz: 14(d)

[REDACTED]

Mr. Wisner: 14(d)

[REDACTED] (S)

Mr. Clarke: It doesn't have to be the UN. It could be in-kind, providing airlift, not through the UN. (S)

Mr. Wisner: I am open to it. (S)

Admiral Howe: Let's put it into a cable and get the right language. (S)

Mr. Michel: In Central America, 14(d)

^{14(d)} [REDACTED] has come up with money and it hasn't impressed other donors. (S)

Mr. Howard: We have the ^{14(d)} [REDACTED] and they could donate to that. (S)

Mr. Clarke: It would have to be appropriated. (S)

Admiral Howe: Between Paul Wolfowitz and Frank Wisner let's work it out. (S)

Ambassador Oakley: I have a question for Nick Rostow on war crimes, which is in the Bosnia resolution, yet we are investigating mass murder in Kismayo. (S)

Mr. Rostow: UNSCR 794 says it will hold people responsible. I understand that the Kismayo commander is using CID to investigate and will turn over the evidence to the eventual authorities. I am not sure JCS hasn't concluded that there is not a violation of international law. (S)

Admiral Howe: Are you thinking of a UN mechanism? (S)

Ambassador Oakley: ^{14(d)} [REDACTED]
(S)

Mr. Wolfowitz: Is it possible for the UNOSOM II resolution to have a provision to carry out special trials? (S)

Mr. Wisner: Of whom? By whom? How was this done in Grenada and Panama? (S)

Admiral Howe: We had a local authority in both cases which stayed in power. (S)

Mr. Wisner: There must be a body of law. (S)

Mr. Michel: There is a body of Somali law. (S)

Ambassador Oakley: My second question concerns codels and what we do with the transition people to prepare Congress for all these issues. Boren was supportive. Mitchell is coming out. (S)

Admiral Howe: We have briefed Congress, and I suspect they will want more. (U)

General Leland: There is a tentative visit program, and we hope to space them out. (S)

Ambassador Oakley: We may want to plant ideas with them. (S)

Admiral Howe: That is very important. (S)

Mr. Natsios: We had a request for the President to meet with PVOs. Can we revive that? (S)

Admiral Howe: I'll look at that. (S)

In summary, we need to go over the resolution question. Second we need to get a cable going to troop contributors and others to make our case. (S)

Mr. Wisner: Skip, you should raise on the side with Goulding the (S) and make clear that the UN should contact them but we want to weigh in. (S)

General Leland: I'd add that we need to get that UNOSOM II commander. (S)

Admiral Howe: We need to identify him and we need him in Mogadishu as quickly as possible. (S)

Mr. Wisner: We need to do the same think on the civilian side. (S)

(S) [REDACTED]

Admiral Howe: Your impression, Bob [Oakley], (S) wants out? (S)

Ambassador Oakley: Yes. The time to do this is when you transition to a new phase. (S)
