Minutes

Mr. Gates asked Mr. Kimmitt to begin with a brief discussion of the National Security Review on South Africa. (U)

Mr. Kimmitt said the U.S.'s "South Africa policy" needed to be viewed in the context of clashes on the Hill during the last Administration, when the Administration lost its control over the conduct of some foreign policies because of bipartisan squabbling; South Africa, Central America, and the War Powers Act were examples. Secretary Baker thinks we need to listen to people on the Hill, find common ground and common cause with them. Rather than just say "We oppose apartheid," which simply

leads to conflict with the Hill, we need to say "we want a bipartisan approach and we want to do more for black South Africans." We also need to work in a regional context, and we need to work with our partners, the British, Germans, Japanese. When he met the Secretary in Rome, De Klerk said the National Party would fight for change. The Secretary said he thought South Africa had about a 6-month "grace period," after which it would be very difficult to hold back pressures for additional sanctions if there was no evident progress toward ending apartheid. Kimmitt said it was evident that the South Africans wanted to break out of their isolation, and there is a role for the U.S. in this, but we need to take the lead on the Hill; the President needs to be seen to be leading. The Administration needs to meet with a broad spectrum of both white and black South Africans in order to move the situation forward. (U)

Mr. Kerr said the CIA saw signs of a moderating situation following the South African elections (September 6, 1989), justifying cautious optimism. The CIA didn't assume there would be quick progress; South African whites thought they they'd regained control and the initiative with the result that neither blacks nor whites might be willing to take risks, and the consequence that unfulfilled expectations can lead to more unrest. (b)(3)

Mr. Kimmitt said the "6-month deadline" for progress in ending apartheid before more sanctions were considered was a simple statement of fact; the mood on the Hill would not be tolerant, and foreign countries were pressing for more sanctions: the Canadians would push at CHOGM (Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting, at Kuala Lumpur) for financial sanctions. (U)

Mr. Gates said "Six months is the time we give ourselves -- and it is probably the most that will be granted by the Hill." (U)

Mr. Wolfowitz said "Leadership (on the issue) is something we want for ourselves." But, he asked, is it in our interest to get the President up front in the fight? (U)

Mr. Kimmitt said we don't want to overpromise what we can do. Do we want to invest the President's personal capital in this? Does the President want to lay this out in his UN General Assembly speech? (U)

Mr. Wolfowitz said if Congress voted additional sanctions, we would want to speak out against them but we don't necessarily want the President to stake his own prestige on a "do or die" battle. (U)

Mr. Kimmitt agreed but said we needed to pick up the Boschwitzs, Kassebaums, Lugars (moderates who voted for 1986 sanctions), etc. (Ø)

Mr. Cohen said he thought Congress was simply looking for signs of movement on the part of the Administration, not a complete change of approach. Cong. Wolpe said he was looking for ways to cooperate with the Administration, although obviously he would stake out his own position. (U)

Mr. Edelman asked if there were any Boren or Nunn Democrats in the House who might counter Wolpe? Mr. Cohen said he didn't think so. (Ø)

Mr. Gates then moved the discussion to a review of the Options:

1. How vigorously should the U.S. attempt to stimulate internal change in South Africa, and what general methods should be used? (Ø)

Option C (a balance of pressure and incentives) was unanimously preferred. (Ø)

2. Should the U.S. continue, as it has over the past eight years, to broker relations between South Africa and its neighbors? (Ø)

After brief discussion, it was agreed that we would use a blend of Option B (accept the need for SADCC/FLS economic independence but draw the line at impractical, redundant, politically-motivated projects) and C (press SADCC/FLS to accept South Africa's central position in the regional economy and work to promote closer ties between them). (Ø)

3. Should the U.S. adopt a solo approach to South Africa, or should U.S. policy be coordinated with others? (Ø)

Option D was chosen -- the U.S. should formulate its own policies based on its own imperatives, but otherwise coordinate as closely as possible with key allies and trading partners. (Ø)

4. To what extent should sanctions against South Africa be a part of U.S. policy? (Ø)

After discussion, Option C (accept existing sanctions but seek to divert the debate from "sanctions" per se and concentrate on promoting dialogue among the races and enhancing black political leverage) was accepted by all.

Mr. Gates said sanctions were a fact of life and the law of

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the land, but the U.S. wants to focus on anti-apartheid positions as a declaratory policy; "there is no interest in this Administration in pursuing a strategy of having the UN pass a resolution calling for new, higher-level sanctions (i.e., at the U.S. level). This would be an invitation to trouble with the British, Germans, French, and other key U.S. allies. We will enforce U.S. law but will keep a low profile. Mr. Kimmitt noted that Senators Simon and Kennedy will probably accuse the U.S. of "carrying water" for the British; he said the State Department wasn't seeking a shift in policy (by advocating a new round of sanctions), but said the Secretary didn't want the U.S. to get out ahead of the British in advocating the dismantling of them. (Ø)

5. How best to deal with the nuclear proliferation threat posed by South Africa? (Ø)

Option B was chosen (work with the UK, USSR, EC and others to respond to SAG's demand for increased nuclear commerce in the context of NPT adherence). (Ø)

6. In formulating and implementing U.S. policies, should the U.S. strive for a more cooperative working relationship with the USSR? (Ø)

After discussion, it was agreed that there was some limited potential to engage Soviet cooperation where there were overlapping interests, and it was agreed that the U.S. should continue discussions with the Soviets in order to identify these areas. Mr. Wolfowitz said it was hard to be against a "case-by-case" assessment of the possibilities for cooperation with the USSR, but we certainly don't want to go for blanket authorization. In principle, DOD didn't see much of a constructive role the Soviets could play, but it could be pursued on a case-by-case basis. Mr. Kimmitt noted that the Soviets had been constructive in the southern African negotiations, but we don't want to give them a strategic advantage. The State Department didn't have high expectations about discussions with the Soviets but each case was different and should be looked at on a "case-by-case" basis. Mr. Gates said if one looked over the long haul, say 15-20 years, it's hard to see the Soviets suddenly changing their entire direction in Africa, given their past support for SWAPO, the ANC and other liberation movements. "We need to be damned careful." Mr. Kimmitt said "Yes, but we shouldn't pass by an opportunity." The Soviets seem to want out of Africa and we want to get them out; let's explore and exploit our overlapping interests. (Ø)

7. Should the U.S. use diplomatic contacts and presence to press for change in South Africa, and if so, how? (Ø)

There was general agreement on Option B (limit contacts in apartheid-enforcing areas and with high level visitors) but also general agreement that it was desirable to begin blurring distinctions on contacts to take advantage of opportunities. Mr. Kimmitt noted that we don't want to give the impression that we're loosening up on restrictions against high-level contacts; we need to consult with Congress and take advantage of changes in the situation. (Ø)

8. Should the U.S. aggressively expand programs in South Africa designed to enhance Black Empowerment? (Ø)

It was concluded that we should seek "modest increases" in U.S. programs to enhance Black Empowerment. Mr. Edelman said the principal problem was U.S. budgetary restrictions and finding groups (in South Africa) able to use the money and eligible for it. Mr. Kimmitt said the Democrats on the Hill were suspicious about the new Administration's intentions; "we can't be timid." We need to find money, and we need to craft our programs to sound positive to the Hill. He asked about support for the Urban Foundation's housing programs, which the British back. Mr. Edelman said he would prefer to see additional funding go into universities and educational programs; Mr. Kimmitt advocated U.S. support for black housing programs. Mr. Gates suggested that we agree to a "division of labor," with the U.S. doing education and the British doing housing. (Ø)

The meeting ended with agreement that the NSC would prepare minutes and a decision memorandum which would be circulated in draft prior to final approval. (U)
