SUBJECT: Comments on Options Paper

Secretary Dole was not able to respond personally this evening to General Scowcroft's request for comments on the subject paper. However, she has talked with me and the following reflects her views.

- o On page 1, following paragraph 2, add a sentence to the effect: "Finally, because privatization and reforms will cause significant worker dislocation, an unemployment safety net and elimination of major barriers to labor mobility are essential."
- o On page 5, bullet one, please note that Secretary Dole also visited Poland (in August). It would be appropriate to include her name.
- o On the bottom of page 4, in the discussion of the U.S. response of how to deal with the cash shortfall, the Brady Plan is not mentioned. Is this an oversight?

Moreover, while this is not our area of expertise, the idea of private sector contributions of the magnitude mentioned sounds unrealistic.

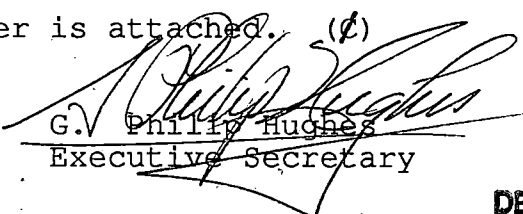

Next Steps in the Recovery Program for Poland and Hungary

I. Introduction

Eastern Europe is in the throes of dramatic change. The success of the move towards democracy in Poland and Hungary will depend in large measure on the ability to bring about fundamental economic reform which lifts rather than depresses living standards. The special case of Yugoslavia aside, Poland and Hungary are the first countries to attempt a radical shift from a communist economy to a market economy. If they fail to complete the course, it may set back political reform in the communist world. The U.S., and particularly its President, will be criticized severely for timid support of Poland and Hungary. However, if Poland and Hungary are successful in shifting to a market economy, they will serve as a beacon to others.

Our current plan for Poland is faltering for several reasons. The Administration's public statements have not fully met public and Congressional needs for a strategic vision capturing what has taken place in Poland. Nor have we made an all-out case for the assistance we are already delivering. Above all, we have failed to signal our intent to render substantially greater assistance to the new Polish government once it has a solid economic program in place. We are thus being accused of fumbling an historic opportunity, perhaps a short-lived one, for a democratic transition in Poland toward overcoming the division of Europe. In the process, we have lost bipartisan support in Congress and have begun to lose credibility within Poland and among our Allies.

To recapture the initiative, we must move quickly to develop and announce a winning strategy. To kick off the phase of our program for Poland and Hungary, the President would dispatch a Mission to Poland to ascertain economic and business requirements; and an Investment Mission to Poland and Hungary.

II. Key Elements

The Plan would have the following key elements:

- (a) strong U.S. leadership;
- (b) phased implementation (90 days, 1 year and 3 year);
- (c) a focus on developing free markets and small enterprises while modernizing basic infrastructure;
- (d) substantial private and international funding.

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The key sectors to be addressed are:

- agriculture (production, processing & marketing)
- banking/financial services
- energy
- environment
- telecommunications
- medical
- worker services (re-training, unemployment assistance)

The President should announce next week that he is sending a Presidential Mission to Poland to report to him within [3] weeks on the types of assistance Poland needs in each sector.

Key elements of the initiative are:

- Presidential Mission to Poland to ascertain broad needs;
- follow-on investment missions to develop detailed programs;
- Senior USG coordinator for Poland and Hungary.

Prior to the public announcement, the President would brief the Congressional leadership, and communicate with the Economic Summit heads and the Polish leadership. We would also have had preliminary contact with the businessmen and experts we would want on the Mission.

(A) Presidential Mission

The Presidential Mission should be led by senior government officials but be comprised mainly of persons from business and academia recognized as experts in each of the sectors mentioned above (see Tab A for illustrative list). The private sector people would act as team leaders for follow-on experts' missions in their sectors. The Mission should be limited to no more than 25 persons. The members of the Mission would serve without pay (travel and per diem would be covered) and commit to see the program through (although not on a full-time basis). Given the level of the private sector participants, it would be natural for each to bring an assistant.

The President would designate the Secretary of Agriculture and the Secretary of Commerce to lead the mission. We need to consider whether it would be desirable to include representatives of the Congressional leadership or key legislators of Polish descent.

The Mission would spend several days in Poland, meeting with the Government and other key leaders and experts. It would assess the economic needs in broad terms. Its report should identify, for each priority sector:

- immediate needs (next six months);
- 1 year action program;
- 3 year action program;

- follow-up missions of experts and potential investors.

The Mission should report to the President within 7 days of its return. The President would then brief Congress and selected world leaders and make his recommendations.

In order to lay the groundwork for the Mission, a small advance team would have to visit Poland soon to make arrangements.

Members would include NSC, State, Agriculture and Commerce.

(B) Investment Missions

An investment mission would be sent to Poland to follow up on the Presidential Mission's recommendations. A separate investment mission would be sent to Hungary. These would be led by the President of OPIC. At present, neither the public nor private sectors are organized effectively to support large increases in private investment. The investment missions would help identify projects and develop a set of programs to facilitate the flow of investment (e.g. the establishment of a U.S. bank in Poland). The goal is to attract \$ [] in private investment in Poland and Hungary in the next three years.

(C) Experts Missions

The businessmen and academics on the Presidential Mission would be responsible for suggesting follow-up experts' missions in their respective sectors. These would be coordinated by the USG Coordinator and should be completed by the end of December.

(D) USG Coordinator

The President should appoint a senior-level USG Coordinator for Poland. The Person would report to the Secretary of State, or his designee. He would be responsible for coordinating U.S. public and private sector efforts and be the main contact with Poland, Hungary and other countries and international organizations. The person must be of high international stature, demonstrated accomplishments in economics and business, and have the ability to work smoothly with senior international officials. The person should be brought on board soon to be able to shape the process.

Options

1. That the President send a Presidential Mission, led by the Secretaries of Agriculture and Commerce and including CEOs from business and academic experts, to Poland to ascertain economic and business requirements.
2. That the President of OPIC lead investment missions to Poland and Hungary.
3. That experts' missions in the various sectors be sent to Poland to follow-up on the recommendations of the Presidential Mission.
4. That the President designate a high-level individual, reporting to the Secretary of State, to be the U.S. Coordinator for economic assistance to Poland and Hungary.
