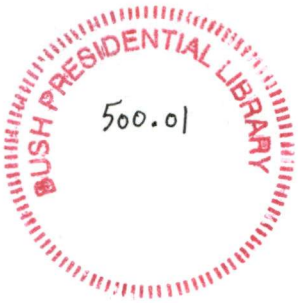

This meeting is a follow on to last week's discussion on the Andean Drug Summit. A new Discussion Paper is at Tab A. It is divided into four sections: U.S. Objectives, Andean Concerns, Reconciling the Differences, and Modalities for Communicating. State will present the paper.

The primary U.S. objective for the Drug Summit is an Andean commitment to a vigorous counternarcotics effort in the region. To convey a common commitment at the Summit, we will seek a communique and several negotiated agreements. However, we do not yet have a full Peruvian or Bolivian commitment to the drug war, and much of our work between now and the Summit will be directed at obtaining their basic commitment, as well as agreement to a communique and other negotiated instruments.

There are two basic questions for the Deputies. Is the strategy for obtaining a Peruvian and Bolivian commitment adequate? Is the proposed communique and are the agreements we seek an appropriate focus for the Summit?

Obtaining a Peruvian and Bolivian commitment, as proposed in the paper, will require a major, coordinated effort. It will depend upon President Barco's support, upon our finding other forms of U.S. support in such areas as trade or asset sharing, upon our ability to generate other donors, and upon the willingness of international financial institutions to become involved. (Not surprisingly, Treasury may have a problem with leaning on the banks.) It is still quite possible that we will be unable generate from other donors the assistance necessary to obtain a Peruvian or Bolivian commitment. In that case, we will need to decide whether to back out of the Summit (difficult to do) or go to the Summit in the hope of gaining commitments there or papering over the problem.

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The proposed communique and the agreements we seek are relatively straight forward. The proposed communique has something for everyone; hopefully everyone would be able to agree with all of it. The agreements may not all be obtainable, but the interagency community believes that we should be able to complete some of them.

If the Deputies can agree to move forward on the basis of this paper, the next step will be to clear the cables of instruction and the Presidential letter which State will draft.

As summit preparations continue, we will also need to begin thinking about how the Drug Summit may provide some lead-up to the next Economic Summit.

Summary: The primary U.S. objective for the summit is a strong public commitment by the four presidents to the drug war. We do not yet have such a commitment from either Bolivia or Peru. Both countries wish economic assistance at the outset of any major counternarcotics effort, while the U.S. would like to see law enforcement success before committing economic assistance. A successful summit will depend on our ability to persuade our Andean partners to march to a common theme. This paper lays out U.S. objectives, likely Andean concerns, a strategy for reconciling the differences, and modalities of communication for achieving that reconciliation.

U.S. Objectives: The U.S. has agreed in-principle to a four country Andean Drug Summit in Catagena, Colombia, in mid-February, subject to possible changes in date and location. The primary U.S. objective is an Andean commitment to a vigorous counternarcotics effort in the region. To support such an effort, we have offered military, law enforcement, and intelligence assistance, with the addition of economic assistance in the future (beginning in FY 1991) based on success in combatting the traffickers. Between now and the summit we will seek Andean agreement to our strategy and to a more vigorous counternarcotics effort. In addition, we will seek agreement to a joint communique and the signing of one or more negotiated agreements or understandings.

The joint communique would call for the following efforts:

- enhanced cooperation in counternarcotics programs, investigations, and prosecutions against the multinational criminal organizations responsible for all elements of drug production and trafficking;
- worldwide assistance in controlling money laundering, precursor chemicals, and the export of automatic weapons;
- economic assistance from the developed world for Bolivia, Peru, and Colombia;
- the World Bank, the Inter-American Development Bank, and the International Monetary Fund to work with the Andean countries to develop projects and programs which facilitate structural adjustment and deal with balance of payments

- problems as a means to support the transition from narcotics related activities to viable economic alternatives;
- increased educational and informational efforts to reduce demand;
  - ministerial level meetings with the summit four, plus the transit and major consumer countries, to discuss mutual problems and coordination of policy.

The summit might also call for another summit to be held to include the producer, transit, and consumer countries.

Executive agreements or memoranda of understanding might also be negotiated and ready for signature at the summit. The agreements could be either bilateral or multilateral (some would presumably be more appropriately signed at the ministerial level; others by the presidents) and would concern such issues as:

- precursor chemicals,
- asset sharing,
- money laundering,
- judicial protection and judicial reform, and
- information exchanges on demand reduction.

Other documents to be signed at the ministerial level would include country specific program implementation agreements on law enforcement, economic, and security assistance. For example, the Government of Peru is seeking Landsat photography of its entire high jungle area with the photography provided by the USG and exploited by the Peruvian Institute of National Planning.

We would also encourage the Andeans to sign agreements among themselves regarding, for example, the sharing of intelligence and control of cross border traffic.

The United States could also report progress on the implementation of the President's trade package and hopefully announce other off-budget economic measures now under review by a State-chaired interagency group. Similarly, we would encourage other developed nations to provide trade and off-budget assistance, though such encouragement will require high-level political involvement. (It may be desirable to describe in general terms in the communique the sorts of assistance we are offering and what we seek from other developed nations.)

Andean Concerns: The most important question which must be resolved prior to a summit is that of the political will of the Andean countries to pursue vigorous counternarcotics policies.

While we must work assiduously in the coming weeks to strengthen their will, there is no certainty that we will succeed.

Of all three countries, Colombia is the least problematic. However, even with its recent supreme court ratification of the emergency extradition and confiscation decrees, President Barco's ability to maintain his offensive against the traffickers is by no means certain, and we will need to talk to Barco about the commitment of his possible successors. We are also concerned that no major traffickers have been arrested. President Barco will seek economic assistance and press for action on a new international coffee agreement.

In Bolivia, President Paz Zamora does not want to take serious action on interdiction unless we first commit large amounts of foreign assistance to an alternative development plan which he will present at the summit. We also face serious problems of narco-corruption in the police and an interior minister who is an obstacle to our efforts.

Peru is the hardest case, and the lame duck Garcia government will be the most difficult to work with. The army is cooperating with traffickers in the Upper Huallaga Valley in exchange for information on the SL and money to feed the troops and is committing serious human rights offenses. President Garcia has told us that the Peruvian economy would collapse without compensation for the narco-dollars currently flooding the country. Corruption remains a problem. During the remainder of the Garcia Administration, Peru is unlikely to meet the required condition for economic assistance of implementing "sound economic policy."

Garcia and Paz Zamora look (in vain) to the Europeans as a counter to the United States, and may believe the Europeans will provide hundreds of millions of dollars per year in economic assistance. (The Bolivian Planning Minister told his press upon return from the Paris Consultative Group that the international community had pledged to Bolivia \$650-700 million in development assistance for each of the next three years. These pledges are very soft, and it is unlikely that Bolivia will see anywhere near those levels of assistance.)

There is also a danger that Garcia and Paz will convince each other that they can milk our determination on this issue for greater resources than we are now willing to provide. They expect (and feel they deserve) far more economic assistance than we (or the Europeans) are prepared to give at this time. Both of their economies are narco-dependent. Both fear driving the rural poor into the hands of (in Bolivia: incipient) guerrilla groups. Both believe, that interdiction should only come after the implementation of alternative development schemes and, in the case of Peru, the defeat of the SL. They also have some

understanding of how our budget process works and, therefore, question our ability to follow through with our promises to provide them with economic assistance in the outyears should they sign on to the Andean strategy.

Reconciling the Differences:

a. Colombian President Barco is our natural ally in this venture, and he too recognizes the need for his Andean colleagues to demonstrate more political courage on counternarcotics. We must employ Barco to the extent possible to convince his skeptical and more leftist neighbors that in return for cooperating with the United States, the U.S. will provide them with significant amounts of economic, law enforcement, and security assistance.

b. Through the closeness of our relationship with Colombia, we must demonstrate to Peru and Bolivia other tangible benefits of cooperating with the U.S., (asset sharing, assistance on trade issues, etc.).

c. We must make clear to Peru and Bolivia that economic assistance in FY-91 and beyond is dependent upon their performance and that the amounts of money foreseen in NSD-18 do not flow automatically.

d. We will approach the Europeans, Canadians, and Japanese to have them make clear to Peru and Bolivia that whatever the eventual levels of aid from other donors, such aid can only complement rather than replace economic assistance from the U.S. (Under Secretary Kimmit will visit Bonn, London, Paris, and Brussels beginning November 11.) That said, we will also need to encourage such assistance.

e. We should also begin now to encourage and support the international financial institutions to work with the Andean nations to provide economic and development assistance as a means to viable economic alternatives to narcotics-related activities

f. Finally we have to be willing to go the extra mile if they do cooperate with us in order show that our promises are not empty.

Modalities: In order to iron out the necessary political issues with the Andeans prior to the summit we have initiated a three-step approach:

-- Our ambassadors/charges in the three capitals will immediately go into the host country president to present a letter from President Bush agreeing to a four-country summit in mid-February and to initiate discussions leading to agreement on our FY 1990 assistance programs, the joint communique, and the other summit documents. (The instructions and Presidential letter will be circulated for

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final agency clearance following the Deputies Committee meeting.)

- On the margins of the OAS/GA, U.S. officials will meet with the foreign ministers of the Andean Three.
- Assistant Secretary Aronson will lead a team to the three countries the week of December 3 to nail down remaining issues.

Presidential and cabinet level phone calls and additional letters will be used as deemed necessary.

Other opportunities to get across our message must also be utilized. The first and second vice presidents of Peru will be in Washington the first week of December, and can be used to pass our message to President Garcia. Vice President Quayle is considering a January trip to Europe which would offer another opportunity to coordinate our policy with the Europeans and to explain why they are not being included in this summit.

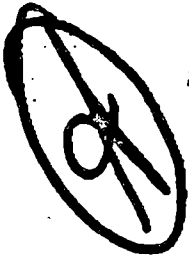

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ANDEAN SUMMIT  
DISCUSSION PAPER

Summary: The primary U.S. objective for the summit is a strong public commitment by the four presidents to the drug war. We do not yet have such a commitment from either Bolivia or Peru. Both countries wish economic assistance at the outset of any major counternarcotics effort, while the U.S. would like to see law enforcement success before committing economic assistance. A successful summit will depend on our ability to persuade our Andean partners to march to a common theme. This paper lays out U.S. objectives, likely Andean concerns, a strategy for reconciling the differences, and modalities of communication for achieving that reconciliation.

U.S. Objectives: The U.S. has agreed in-principle to a four country Andean Drug Summit in Catagena, Colombia, in mid-February, subject to possible changes in date and location. The primary U.S. objective is an Andean commitment to a vigorous counternarcotics effort in the region. To support such an effort, we have offered military, law enforcement, and intelligence assistance, with the addition of economic assistance in the future (beginning in FY 1991) based on success in combatting the traffickers. Between now and the summit we will seek Andean agreement to our strategy and to a more vigorous counternarcotics effort. In addition, we will seek agreement to a joint communique and the signing of one or more negotiated agreements or understandings.

The joint communique would call for the following efforts:

- enhanced cooperation in counternarcotics programs, investigations, and prosecutions against the multinational criminal organizations responsible for all elements of drug production and trafficking;
- worldwide assistance in controlling money laundering, precursor chemicals, and the export of automatic weapons;
- economic assistance from the developed world for Bolivia, Peru, and Colombia;
- the World Bank, the Inter-American Development Bank, and the International Monetary Fund to work with the Andean countries to develop projects and programs which facilitate structural adjustment and deal with balance of payments problems as a means to support the transition from narcotics related activities to viable economic alternatives;

- increased educational and informational efforts to reduce demand;
- ministerial level meetings with the summit four, plus the transit and major consumer countries, to discuss mutual problems and coordination of policy.

The summit might also call for another summit to be held to include the producer, transit, and consumer countries.

Executive agreements or memoranda of understanding might also be negotiated and ready for signature at the summit. The agreements could be either bilateral or multilateral (some would presumably be more appropriately signed at the ministerial level; others by the presidents) and would concern such issues as:

- precursor chemicals,
- asset sharing,
- money laundering,
- judicial protection and judicial reform, and
- information exchanges on demand reduction.

Other documents to be signed at the ministerial level would include country specific program implementation agreements on law enforcement, economic, and security assistance. For example, the Government of Peru is seeking Landsat photography of its entire high jungle area with the photography provided by the USG and exploited by the Peruvian Institute of National Planning.

We would also encourage the Andeans to sign agreements among themselves regarding, for example, the sharing of intelligence and control of cross border traffic.

The United States could also report progress on the implementation of the President's trade package and hopefully announce other off-budget economic measures now under review by a State-chaired interagency group. Similarly, we would encourage other developed nations to provide trade and off-budget assistance, though such encouragement will require high-level political involvement. (It may be desirable to describe in general terms in the communique the sorts of assistance we are offering and what we seek from other developed nations.)

Andean Concerns: The most important question which must be resolved prior to a summit is that of the political will of the Andean countries to pursue vigorous counternarcotics policies. While we must work assiduously in the coming weeks to strengthen their will, there is no certainty that we will succeed.

Of all three countries, Colombia is the least problematic. However, even with its recent supreme court ratification of the emergency extradition and confiscation decrees, President Barco's ability to maintain his offensive against the traffickers is by no means certain, and we will need to talk to Barco about the commitment of his possible successors. We are also concerned that no major traffickers have been arrested. President Barco will seek economic assistance and press for action on a new international coffee agreement.

In Bolivia, President Paz Zamora does not want to take serious action on interdiction unless we first commit large amounts of foreign assistance to an alternative development plan which he will present at the summit. We also face serious problems of narco-corruption in the police and an interior minister who is an obstacle to our efforts.

Peru is the hardest case, and the lame duck Garcia government will be the most difficult to work with. 
