General Responsibilities

- _____ The Presidential Advance Office (x7565) has responsibility for all logistical arrangements for any event involving press coverage. Please coordinate with them from the time your event is approved in order to avoid the need for last-minute modification.
- _____ Notify and clear all participants. (Full name, social security number, date of birth and place of birth).
- _____ Prepare and submit briefing paper to Jim Cicconi's Office by 3:00pm of the preceding day (16 copies)
- _____ Coordinate with Tim McBride on Presidential involvement.
- _____ Coordinate with Press Office and Media Relations regarding Press Coverage. Provide Media Relations with hometowns of participants. No organization's photographers will be admitted to any event unless the press is present. Clearance of such photographers should be coordinated through Media Relations.
- _____ If remarks are required, coordinate with the Speechwriters Office well in advance.
- _____ For outdoor events at the White House, in case of inclement weather, clear and reserve the backup location indicated.
- _____ If participant plans to bring a gift, contact the White House Gift Unit, in advance, for review and proper procedure for handling.
- _____ If any foreign visitor or dignitary is to be involved, please coordinate with the NSC (x2224).
- _____ If any Department of Defense or Military personnel are to be involved, please coordinate in advance with the White House Military Office (x2150).
- _____ If press coverage is expected, please provide all pertinent information concerning this event (guests, scenario, backdrop, etc.,) to the Presidential Advance Office at least 72 hours prior to the event.
- _____ Within five (5) days after the event, submit a complete, confirmed list of staff and attendees, identified by title, and the actual starting and completion times of the event, to the President's Diarist, Office of Presidential Appointments and Scheduling.
- _____ If tent name cards are needed, send a list of names to the Social Secretary's office (x7064) at least 48 hours in advance.
- _____ For West Wing Meetings all room arrangements (chairs, notepads, pencils, etc.) should be made through Carl Jones or Kathy Wills (x2605).

Residence Events

- _____ Coordinate with the Social Secretary's office (x7064) for all arrangements.

Nuclear Test Proposal Splits U.S. Officials

Acceptance of Soviet Initiative Uncertain

Senior Bush administration officials have split over possible U.S. acceptance of a recent Soviet initiative on nuclear testing limits, making resolution of a longstanding superpower dispute at forthcoming U.S.-Soviet discussions in Wyoming uncertain.

State Department officials have cited nuclear testing as one of the principal topics on which they hope Secretary of State James A. Baker III and Soviet Foreign Minister Eduard Shevardnadze can reach accord at their Sept. 22-23 meeting.

But a White House meeting of agency officials Tuesday failed to produce a consensus on any of the outstanding disputes, according to several officials. At stake is a Soviet offer to allow intrusive on-site inspections by the United States of all Soviet underground nuclear tests expected to have a force of more than 75 kilotons, in return for reciprocal Soviet rights in the United States.

The two sides have pursued an agreement since 1987 so they can bring into force a 1974 pact, known as the Threshold Test Ban Treaty, limiting nuclear explosions less than 150 kilotons, roughly equivalent to 150,000 tons of TNT. The atomic bomb the United States dropped on Hiroshima in World War II had an explosive force of 15 kilotons.

Under pressure from Congress, President Ronald Reagan promised that once the pact is ratified, both sides will begin negotiations on new nuclear testing limitations, possibly including constraints on test size and frequency. The Bush administration generally opposes such constraints, however, a circumstance that partly accounts for its current discord.

Chief Soviet testing negotiator Igor Palenykh, who will accompany Shevardnadze to Wyoming, complained last month that the United States was not moving swiftly enough on the issue. His statement came as Moscow agreed for the first time to allow the intrusive U.S. inspections using a method known as Corrtex for all high-yield tests. Corrtex involves inspecting the holes that Soviet bombs are buried in before being detonated as well

ing to inspect. U.S. officials term such a development as a "public relations disaster."

The Soviets did not accept the U.S. demand for at least two inspections a year. The State Department and the Joint Chiefs of Staff said this week it is not necessary but their view is opposed by the Pentagon and the Arms Control and Disarmament Agency.

A State Department official predicted that some response would be made when Shevardnadze and Baker meet. He said "we believe it's hard not to take yes for an answer."

as the external features of the bombs. A special electronic monitoring cable is then buried in a nearby hole.

In return Moscow sought the right to conduct similar inspections at the U.S. nuclear test site in Nevada, and then to monitor blast-generated seismic signals at three U.S. government stations of their choosing. The three stations would be selected from a list of 10 given them by the United States.

Defense Department officials have been reluctant to accept the Soviet proposal because seismic monitoring can also be used to verify compliance with future testing limitations. Officials from other agencies have approved it although some oppose a related Soviet proposal to issue a joint report on the size of each nuclear test.

At the White House meeting chaired by deputy national security adviser Robert M. Gates, representatives of the Defense and the Energy departments expressed concern about the proposal for Soviet inspections in Nevada that would be similar to those required for Corrtex at the Soviet test site in Semipalatinsk. The Energy Department, which manages the Nevada test site, fears that such inspections could compromise bomb secrets.

When testing negotiations began in 1987 the United States also proposed inspections of any blasts expected to exceed 75 kilotons. But the Reagan administration subsequently stiffened this demand to include all blasts over 50 kilotons, with at least two inspections allowed each year even if no high-yield tests occur.

The provision was motivated by fears that the Soviets and the United States could sign an agreement and that the Soviets would then unilaterally cease high-yield tests, leaving the United States with noth-
