
Dear Ms. Scaling:

Legal immigration reform bills passed by the House and the Senate have resulted in a number of differences which have yet to be ironed out. Some of the areas open to negotiation should be of prime concern to the White House.

For example, the provision of the House bill setting up a bureaucratic labor "attestation" system to determine the eligibility of employment-based visas remains a part of the bill. That particular provision was objected to by Michael J. Boskin, Chairman of the President's Council of Economic Advisers in his October 16th letter to the Wall Street Journal. There are many other flaws in the bill which are just not being addressed in the ongoing negotiations.

I hope you find my enclosed op-ed, which appeared in the Washington Post on October 16, 1990, to be of assistance. The most extensive change in immigration policy should not be addressed in the waning moments of an expiring Congress. It is a matter far too important to be subject a last-minute legislative process.


Dear Ms. Bates,

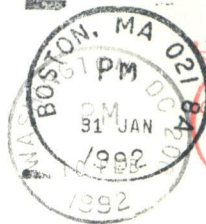



Dear Friend:

George Bush made a lot of promises when he ran for president in 1988. First, he promised to be the "environmental president." Then, the "no new taxes president." Next, he promised to be the "education president." Whatever kind of president the public seemed to want, he would be it.

However, there's another kind of president George Bush also promised to be -- the "constitutional president":

"I, George Herbert Walker Bush, do solemnly swear that I will faithfully execute the office of President of the United States and will, to the best of my ability, preserve, protect, and defend the Constitution of the United States."

As you well know, this is a promise every president makes on inauguration day -- a solemn oath sworn before the entire world.

HOWEVER ... unlike his other promises, this particular vow is one that George Bush never reminds anyone about -- either by his words or his actions.

INSTEAD ... President Bush has been in the very forefront of an unrelenting assault on the Bill of Rights and the personal liberties it protects. The assault has been so widespread, on so many issues, that every American who looks to the Bill of Rights for protection must now step forward to preserve it.

THAT'S WHY ... I'M ASKING YOU TO DO YOUR PART TO HELP DEFEND OUR MOST PRECIOUS RIGHTS AND LIBERTIES by joining nearly 300,000 other Americans as a member of the American Civil Liberties Union: the only national organization devoted to preserving, protecting, and defending the Constitution. For clearly -- in spite of his solemn oath of office -- George Bush will not.

In fact, the consistent pattern of attacks on personal liberties that George Bush has championed shows that it is up to people like you and me to stand up and defend our precious liberties ourselves. And -- together -- here is what we must stand up against:

#### ATTACKS ON THE FIRST AMENDMENT

ITEM: When the Supreme Court correctly -- albeit narrowly -- declared the burning of an American flag to be a form of political expression protected by the First Amendment, George Bush forgot his "promise" to preserve and protect

the Constitution and tried to ram his infamous "flag-burning amendment" through Congress.

By outlawing "disrespectful" treatment of the American flag, this amendment would have carved out an official "exception" to the freedom of speech guaranteed by the First Amendment, and resurrected the crime of sedition. Even worse, it would have created a frightening precedent by reducing the protections of the Bill of Rights for the first time in American history.

George Bush put the full power of his presidency behind his attempt to water down the Bill of Rights. But through the support of concerned people like you, the ACLU was able to mount a powerful lobbying campaign and defeat the amendment in the Senate. Yet the tiny margin of our victory -- only four votes -- was both frightening and ominous.

**ITEM: George Bush -- through his attempt to shrink the freedom of speech protections of the First Amendment -- has also aided and abetted the spread of artistic censorship in America.**

During the past two years, America has seen the rebirth of a dark age of artistic suppression. With George Bush wholeheartedly supporting the dangerous notion of "re-examining" the First Amendment, Jesse Helms and the radical right have been granted enormous power in their efforts to institutionalize federal censorship of the arts.

Their attack on the National Endowment for the Arts -- for funding a controversial exhibition by famed photographer Robert Mapplethorpe -- almost succeeded in destroying what had become an extraordinarily important source of stimulation and support for American artists.

Today, an atmosphere of intimidation is still serving to deny grants to artists whose work is "unacceptable" to Jesse Helms and his extremist followers.

Indeed, America is now seeing a nationwide epidemic of "morality policing" straight out of the darkest nightmares of Franz Kafka. Book and record stores have been invaded because the smallest percentage of their stock failed to meet "community standards," with their entire inventories seized and their owners arrested ... Singers have been banned from performing unless they allow the national anthem to be played as a prelude ... Rock musicians have been arrested for "obscene lyrics." And we even witnessed the outrageous sight of the director of a highly respected art gallery arrested and put on trial when he dared present the Mapplethorpe exhibition!

Not one of these events was criticized by the President sworn to uphold the Constitution.

**ITEM: George Bush is enforcing a policy of suppressing the free speech of medical professionals -- no matter how much it may endanger patients.**

George Bush's personal opposition to abortion is one thing. But his enforcement of regulations that prohibit medical professionals in federally

supported family planning facilities from even mentioning abortion is an entirely different matter. This regulation prohibits doctors from providing advice about abortion, even when patients ask for it and the doctors think it's necessary.

After the Supreme Court upheld this gag rule, Congress banned it. But Bush vetoed the ban, and an attempt to override the veto in the House of Representatives fell 12 votes short of the required two-thirds.

As a result, medical professionals are now required in federally funded clinics to violate their ethical obligations to their patients, since they cannot include vital information patients must have in order to make informed decisions about their own medical treatment -- even if patients ask for such information and medical personnel believe it to be medically necessary.

**ITEM: George Bush implemented an unprecedented effort to restrict the operation of a free press during the Persian Gulf War.**

When the press is allowed to report a war freely, there is rarely a violation of military security. Both World War II and the Vietnam War demonstrated that. Unlike our recent experience in the Persian Gulf, reporters during World War II and the Vietnam War were not herded into "press pools," were not forbidden from doing independent reporting, and were not prohibited from going where they pleased. And the stories they filed were invariably responsible. No breaches of military security occurred.

BUT ... the stories from Vietnam also uncovered the truth the government would have preferred the public not to have. And widespread public misgivings and anti-war sentiment, which were already building, were encouraged and reinforced.

Obviously, George Bush remembered the lessons of Vietnam all too well -- and determined that the solution was to control the flow of news from the Persian Gulf and thus dilute the right of citizens to know what their government was doing. So during the Gulf War ... as during the invasion of Grenada and Panama ... reporters knew only what the government wanted them to know. And we were all denied our First Amendment rights in the process.

#### **ATTACKS ON YOUR PROTECTIONS AGAINST ABUSE BY POLICE AND THE COURTS**

**ITEM: George Bush has contributed to the creation of a "wartime mindset" that has made the American public more accepting of police abuses and drastically severe punishments.**

Historically, real wars against other countries have always served as convenient pretexts for the suspension of personal liberties in the interests of "public safety" or "national security." And declarations of "war" on the domestic front have had similar results.

At first it was the so-called "war on drugs" that George Bush used to justify illegal police searches, compulsory urine testing of innocent public employees and the frisking of people at airports because they

matched a supposed profile of a "drug criminal."

AND NOW ... he has allowed the "war mindset" strategy to grow even worse -- with the Bill of Rights becoming the major casualty.

FIRST ... in a frightening echo of the outrages committed against Japanese-Americans during World War II, the Bush Administration used the war in the Persian Gulf to justify a series of shameful investigations and interrogations of Arab-American citizens -- simply because they were of Middle Eastern descent.

THEN ... with the Persian Gulf War over and the American people in a state of euphoria and relief, George Bush was willing to trade on those understandable feelings to attract support for his "war on crime" -- again at the expense of the Bill of Rights.

In fact, he challenged Congress to duplicate the troops' 100-day victory in the Middle East by passing -- also within 100 days -- a legislative package of truly frightening implications:

**ITEM: George Bush demanded that Congress pass an onerous package of "anti-crime" measures designed to systematically dismantle some of the most important constitutional protections American citizens enjoy against abuses of authority by the police and the courts.**

The Bush crime package asked Congress ...

- to permit evidence obtained during illegal police searches to be used in court, as long as the police can claim their "error" was made in "good faith" ...
- to authorize an unprecedented expansion in the use of the death penalty -- even against the mentally retarded or otherwise disabled ... AND
- to dramatically narrow the circumstances under which prisoners can exercise their right to habeas corpus -- the basic constitutional right they rely on to test the legality of their convictions in federal courts.

The Bush proposal was so callously severe that prisoners would be virtually without recourse in most cases, even if their convictions in the state courts were demonstrably improper!

BUT ... George Bush's crime bill was more than just an outrage against the rights of all citizens. At a time when racial tensions are festering and almost four decades of progress toward equality are being eroded, this bill held extraordinarily frightening implications for blacks and other minorities, in particular.

Sadly, the House agreed to many of Bush's demands. But because it balked at some of the harshest provisions, the President once again

threatened a veto. This time Congress backed down from a veto fight by killing the bill in the Senate in the last day of the session. Combined with the White House's other actions in the area of race relations, the Bush crime package presented an agonizing picture of an Administration that is far too willing to pander to people's basest instincts for political gain -- no matter what the damage to the Bill of Rights might be.

#### ATTACKS ON RACIAL EQUALITY

ITEM: The Bush crime package asked Congress to specifically FORBID courts from accepting statistical proof that the death penalty is being handed down on a racially discriminatory basis!

In a bill cynically called the "Equal Justice Act," George Bush asked Congress to forbid courts from even considering such evidence -- no matter how overwhelming it was.

And the evidence is overwhelming -- so much so that the Bush Administration's decision to "handle" the problem by simply making such evidence illegal is as saddening as it is outrageous.

ITEM: George Bush has proposed a system for financing education that can only serve to further undermine the nation's public schools -- and thus widen the gap in educational opportunity that has confronted our nation's racial minorities for so long.

Although the "educational voucher" system George Bush has advocated will appear to enhance choice and equality by making the same amount of money available for every child -- whose parents can then use it to pay for private education -- the reality of today's economy is that such a sum will almost certainly pay just a part of the cost of a good private education. Perhaps only a third of the cost, at best.

Thus, those parents least able to make up the difference -- members of disadvantaged minority groups whose children already attend poorly funded schools -- would still be forced to send their children to those same public schools. Except that those schools would now be even more poorly funded -- because of the shift of government support to the voucher program ... and more segregated -- because of the further flight of middle class students that the voucher system will encourage.

#### ATTACKS ON THE FOUNDATIONS OF JUDICIAL FAIRNESS

ITEM: George Bush is deliberately completing the reshaping of the federal judiciary begun by Ronald Reagan and Edwin Meese.

Perhaps the most ominous promise George Bush made when he ran for president was to appoint even more federal judges -- including Supreme Court Justices -- who shared his views toward personal liberties.

That is one promise he has frighteningly fulfilled. For by the time he leaves office, George Bush will have joined with Ronald Reagan to appoint 70 percent of the lower federal bench! And he has already replaced

Thurgood Marshall and William Brennan -- the two Justices most devoted to individual rights -- with David Souter and Clarence Thomas.

Although Justice Thomas has not yet participated in any major cases, and it is still too early to draw any final conclusions about Justice Souter's place in history, four of the earliest decisions in which Souter has joined offer a frightening picture of the majority George Bush has created on the Court ... and which, with the addition of Thomas, may now become even more powerful:

- In the first of these decisions -- with Justice Souter clearly casting the deciding vote -- the Court ruled that the use of a coerced, involuntary confession could be considered a "harmless error" that would not entitle a defendant to a new trial!
- THEN ... with adherents of liberties still reeling, the Court aimed a crushing blow at the precious right of habeas corpus that George Bush was also attacking in his "anti-crime" package -- making it far more difficult for prison inmates to appeal even improper convictions.
- NEXT ... Justice Souter provided the tie-breaking vote in approving the jailing of even wrongfully arrested persons for up to 48 hours before giving them an opportunity for a hearing before a judge. And the 48-hour "meter" doesn't have to run on weekends!

This decision was so outrageous that even Justice Antonin Scalia, who almost always votes to widen police powers, accused the Court of having "repudiate[d]" the Fourth Amendment's "core" purpose of protecting citizens against wrongful arrest! And he added that this was a vision of a system of justice "few Americans would recognize as our own."

Ironically, all of these decisions narrowing our protection from the abuse of government authority came while television stations nationwide were still showing the horrifying videotape of Los Angeles police officers brutally clubbing a helpless prisoner!

- FINALLY ... Justice Souter provided the tie-breaking vote in the now infamous case of Rust v. Sullivan, which upheld regulations forbidding doctors from providing any information to their patients about abortion.

ITEM: George Bush cynically reversed his position on choice ... and became a leader of the extremists who want to restrict the reproductive rights of all Americans and also to deny us our right of privacy!

For years, George Bush had actually represented himself as pro-choice. But when given an opportunity to join Ronald Reagan's ticket in 1980, he suddenly became an opponent of reproductive freedom. And today he is the avowed leader of the campaign to overturn the Supreme Court's Roe v. Wade decision, which confirmed a woman's constitutional right to abortion.

In fact, even while he was publicly proclaiming that anti-abortion mobs who were illegally obstructing and intimidating several Wichita, Kansas,

abortion clinics should "obey the law," he was actually dispatching his own Justice Department lawyers to intervene on the mobs' behalf!

But he has also taken his campaign against reproductive liberties one frightening step further. Invariably, his requests that the Supreme Court overturn Roe v. Wade have also included a request that the Court eliminate the basic constitutional right of privacy itself on which Roe is based.

This would mean that even the right to use contraceptives would be subject to the whims of state legislators! And if Clarence Thomas shares the President's views on both privacy and abortion, this frightening outcome could become reality.

\*\*\*\*\*

Those are just some of the specific ways by which President Bush has disavowed his sworn oath to "preserve, protect, and defend the Constitution."

Through this blatant disavowal of his oath of office, George Bush has brought America to a moment when those of us who truly care about freedom must defend it! And there is no better way for you to do that than by becoming a member of the American Civil Liberties Union.

Why the ACLU? Because no other organization has our expertise or track record at defending liberty. And we've proven it consistently over the past 72 years.

We fought for religious freedom when fundamentalist zealots tried to make the teaching of evolution a crime in the Scopes Monkey Trial in 1925 (and again when "creationists" resumed this attack in 1981) ... We stood up for freedom of speech when the rights of workers and employers alike were threatened by the labor strife of the 1930s ... We defended basic human dignity and due process rights when thousands of Japanese-Americans were herded into American concentration camps in the 1940s ...

And we've fought in every major civil liberties battle since then. We defend liberty wherever and whenever it is threatened. In state and federal courts. In the Supreme Court. In Congress and the state legislatures. And even before school boards and city councils in America's small towns.

As one former president of the American Bar Association said: "The ACLU defends every inch of ground where liberty stands."

It hasn't always been easy, because defending a principle means you sometimes have to defend someone unpopular in order to preserve that principle. And a lot of people have trouble understanding that.

We took a lot of heat defending the rights of Japanese-Americans at the height of a war with Japan. And you can imagine what we went through standing up for the freedom of speech of neo-Nazis who wanted to demonstrate in Skokie, Illinois in 1977.

But there have always been concerned people like you who understood that a liberty denied to anyone today ... is a liberty that can be taken away from you and me tomorrow.

These are the people who now make up the ACLU's membership of nearly 300,000 people. And who send us their contributions of \$20 or more because they know that someone has to be there to defend liberties against the George Bushes of the world.

President Thomas Jefferson once said that "The price of liberty is eternal vigilance." President Bush, nearly 200 years later, has made those words more urgent than ever.

Hobart and William Smith Colleges initiated a Public Policy Program in Washington, D.C. in the winter of 1985, and has continued to run the program every two years since then. The program has been a productive and rewarding experience for the intern sponsors and for our students.

The 1993 Public Policy Program will run from Monday, January 4th through Friday, March 12th. Forty students are enrolled in the program; we have told them that they can expect to work full-time and that they should expect the unexpected. At least one student who has been accepted into our program has expressed an interest in doing an internship in your office. We are interested in knowing if you have any internship opportunities for this period and, if so, whether you could send us any information regarding your office and the internships. We will make this information available to the students when they return to campus in September and send you files (vita, transcript, writing sample, recommendation, personal statement) for those students interested in your internships; you could then let us know if any of them fit your needs.

We have both spent periods of time in Washington (one at the Civil Rights Commission and the other at the Urban Institute) and realize the importance of the Washington experience for ourselves and our students. These experiences have taught us that the crucial people involved in policy-making and program management are usually people who do not receive the headlines. We have always been very impressed by the dedication and the skill of people working in Washington, and we think that our students should have the opportunity to work with them. Our program provides the opportunity for students to experience both the practice (in the internship) and the theory (in the courses) of policy-making. The students take part in a bidisciplinary seminar that asks them to integrate their own experiences, those of their peers, and those of guest lecturers. This seminar is held in the evening and the other two courses in the early morning so as not to conflict with the working day.

Term: Winter 1993

Professors: Joseph P. DiGangi and Scott McKinney

**General Description:** Students who are part of the program will take a full term of work in Washington and receive a full term's worth (3 courses) of credit upon successful completion. In addition, they will do a full-time internship. The term will start on January 4. Congress and the executive branch usually consider some of the most important issues (e.g.: the budget) between the Christmas break and the Easter break. This is a time of intense activity and provides the ideal opportunity for student interns to experience the government process of policy-making. The program is currently designed for 40 third and fourth year students. The courses taught in the program will be policy related with almost daily contact and discussion with governmental decision-makers.

Each student will be required to serve as an intern as part of the course or program structure (the internship is described below). The classes will be held early on Tuesday and Thursday mornings. There will be seminar meetings on Wednesday evenings. Students are expected to have access to the vast resources of Washington, D.C., including university libraries, the National Archives, the Library of Congress and "inside" information from "unofficial and unnamed sources."

**Courses:** The following courses will be offered:

Political Science 331: Political Behavior in the Governmental Process - This course will examine the governmental process in terms of the political behavior of those who participate in it. Their motivations and perspectives will be seen as playing a large part in their work. Their affiliations with geographical and interest constituents will be seen as important in establishing their roles and perspectives in the system. Their appointees, civil servants, staff) will be understood to involve the several factors that define government in political terms. The focus will be on important current substantive issues and how they are defined, perceived, shaped and implemented by the governmental actors. A clear, realistic understanding of the governmental process as a political process should emerge.

Economics 372: The U.S. in the International Economy - This course will examine some of the major economic problems related to the growing importance of international economic relations for the U.S., how economic policy has contributed to these problems and what policy options are available at this point. The problems examined will be those of greatest concern when the course is taught. They will probably include: the budget deficit and the trade deficit; international financial relations; foreign ownership of American assets; deindustrialization and its impact on income distribution. The course will emphasize the integration of these issues with current

politics and policy making and the creation of policy proposals that take into account the economic circumstances and the political constraints.

Political Science 425: Seminar National Decision Making - The internship and seminar are the two components for the third course for the program. These two elements combine to give each student the opportunity: (1) to become intimately acquainted with the work of one actor (member of Congress, agency, interest groups, etc.) in the American political system by participating in the work of that actor for the duration of the term; and (2) to bring the specialized knowledge gained as a result of that discussion and analysis of national economic policy-making will take place. The combination of the practical work experience with academic analysis will give each student a realistic understanding of the importance of political realities in the making of policy decisions. The students will develop both specific and broad understanding of decision-making institutions and processes through a large variety of internships covering virtually every part of the process. The seminar will piece together these several parts into a coherent whole. Students will be required to do a substantial research paper for this seminar. Students are expected to do their research paper on a project or subject that is directly related to their intern experience.

Internships - The internship program will be a central focus of the Washington term. Each student will be placed in an internship of his/her choice. The placement is quite involved and it will be explained in full during the orientation. However, it is important to emphasize that the sponsor organization is given an opportunity to choose and you have the opportunity as well to select the internship you would like to do. Most students are placed through the colleges; however, a few may find their own internships, e.g.: with a member of Congress from their state or district. All students in the program will have a full-time internship in a challenging and responsible position. A partial list of previous placements follows. Please note that some of the Senate appointments are limited to only residents of the Senator's state. This applies to all House appointments.

**Accommodation:** Students in the program are expected to live in accommodations that will be arranged for the entire group; participants may request permission to make their own housing arrangements for the term. More information about housing will be made available at the orientation meetings.

**Approximate costs:** Students will be charged a program fee that includes the regular term tuition and accommodation. Costs not included in the fee are meals, transportation, and personal expenses. More detailed information about the costs will be made available at the orientation meetings.
