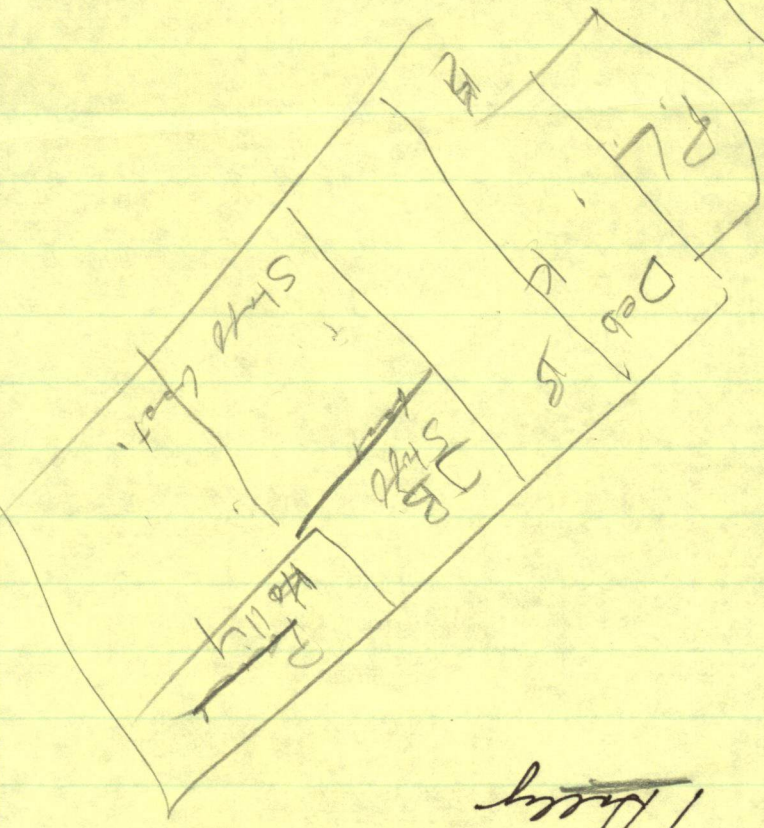
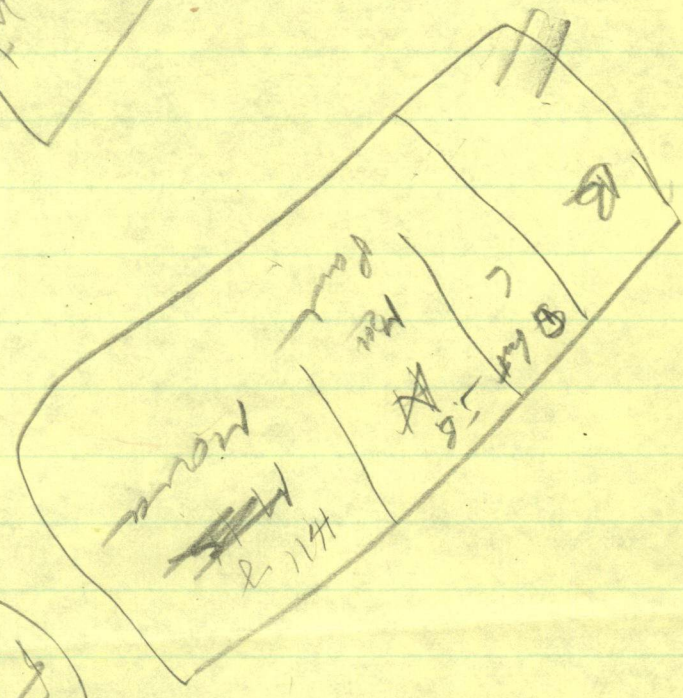
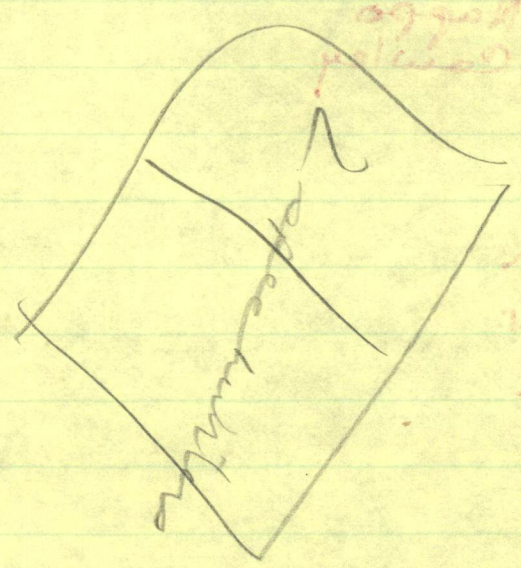


Floor plan

SUBJECT: Relocation of the Low Income Advisory Board

Per our phone conversation on Monday, we have exhausted all available alternatives concerning the relocation of the Low Income Advisory Board from rooms 195, 197, and 199 to rooms 469 and 471, Old Executive Office Building (OEOB). This move was to have occurred by April 30, 1990, as stated in my memorandum dated April 17, 1990 (copy attached). As agreed, rooms 195, 197 and 199 were assigned temporarily to the Low Income Advisory Board for a year, and that time has since expired. This was pointed out by J. Bonnie Newman in her memorandum of April 3, 1990, on this subject to Roger Porter (copy attached).

On April 9, 1990, you and Lewis Pearson, Director of the Facilities Management Division, visited rooms 191 and 193 to review the options for altering space in rooms 469 and 471; and we offered to assist you in arranging for both any alterations to the space and the move of the Low Income Advisory Board. At that time, we explored the possibility of another room being available on the fourth floor of the OEOB, but there is no vacant space.

Based on the earlier memorandums referred to, irrevocable commitments of these rooms were made because of expanding initiatives of the Administration. The time has been reached when relocation of the Low Income Advisory Board must occur.

We are ready to initiate the process to vacate rooms 195 and 197 by Friday, May 18, 1990, and room 199 by Friday, May 25, 1990.

The Facilities Management Division will provide any assistance you may need to complete the moves by these dates, and for any alterations which can be accomplished after the move.



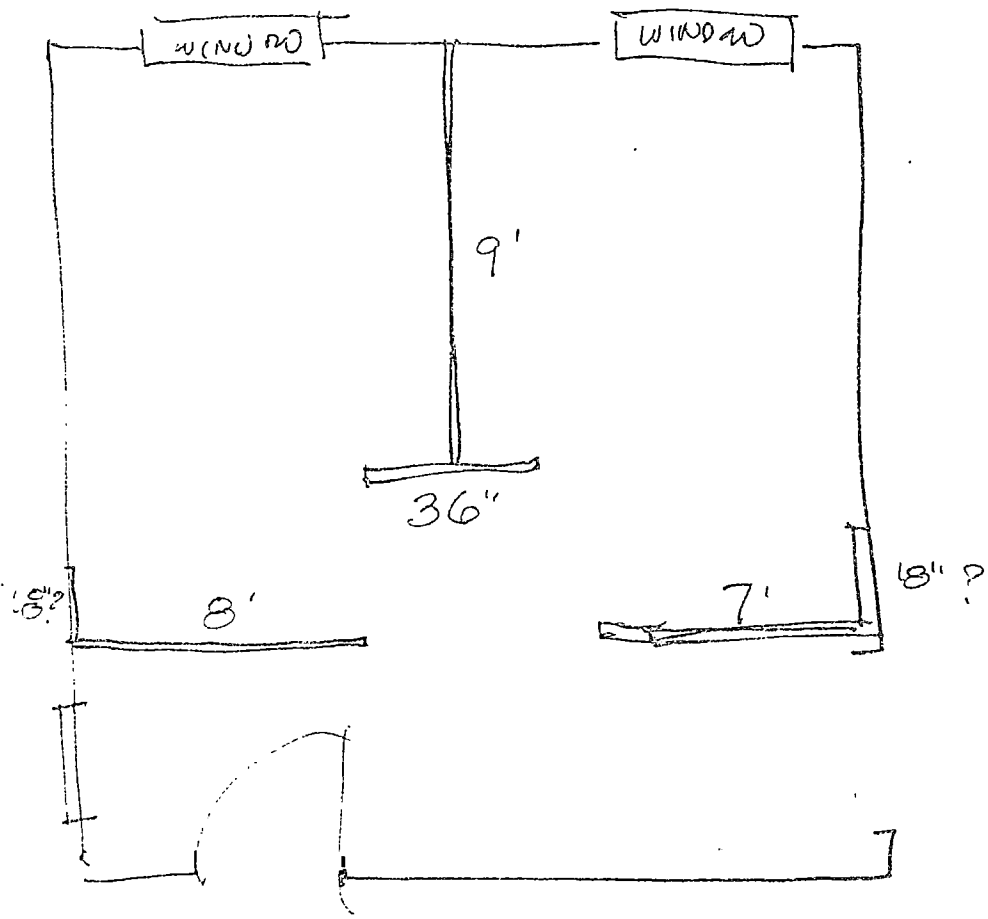
With your cooperation, we trust this can be resolved by April 15, 1990, in order to satisfy the new requirements.

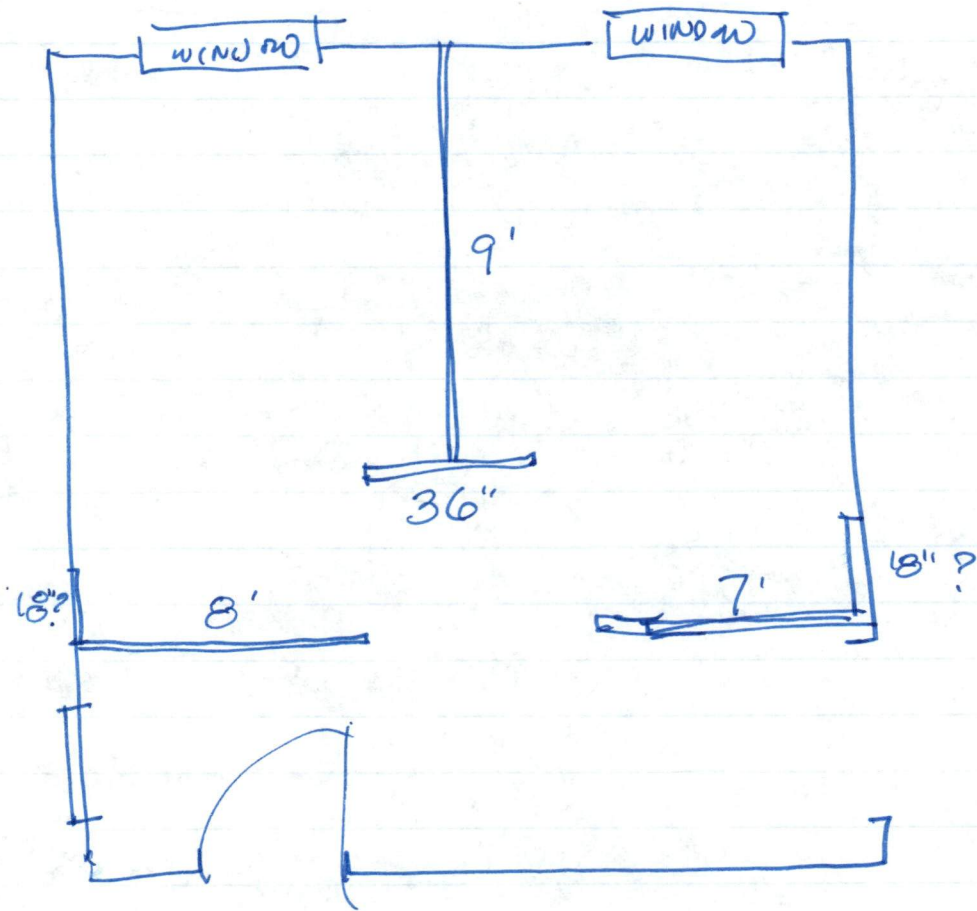
