But even more importantly, he has, like his father, turned into quite a businessman and community leader who exemplifies the highest ideals of good citizenship. ((But Rob, let me tell you I can't give you a Cabinet spot like your father. When it comes to adding more Cabinet positions, "Read my lips: No new Texans.))

Bob and Rob, I wish I could be there tonight to see you recognized for your service and vision -- and your work to improve the lives of so many others who are less fortunate. The

two of you have set a new standard in your charitable, civic and public service. Houston can be proud of you. I know I am.
