Good afternoon. It's a pleasure to join the distinguished guests at this important Pacific Basin Economic Council conference.

You meet at an historic time, not only for Eastern Europe, but for the Pacific basin. As the end of the 20th century approaches, we're watching the dawn of a new era -- an era in which the Pacific basin nations will become a focal point of economic activity. And this activity is certain to have a major influence on political developments around the world.

As a Pacific nation, the United States will play a significant and constructive role in the development of this new Pacific era. We recognize that the dynamism of the Pacific is based, in part, on the energies of free peoples dedicated to free markets and international cooperation. And fostering these concepts will contribute to the stability and vitality of this important region.

But, a word of caution. It's important that as the East-West confrontations of the cold war melt away that they are not replaced by a new ~~adversarial economic competition~~ ^{managed trade} in the Pacific. The nations of this region must work to develop common rules and guidelines that will promote healthy competition -- a competition based on ~~open markets~~ ^{free} and fair trade. And while we understand the cultural, social and economic differences between

countries, it is essential that we maintain an open dialogue. Only then will we be able to accommodate these differences and develop closer links between the nations of the Pacific. And that's part of the reason for today's conference. Constructing relationships that bridge disagreements and build a better understanding among the nations.
