In these next few days, the experience you will gain and the friendships you'll make, will last a lifetime. You will have hands-on experience learning about the criminal justice system, learn about career requirements and citizenship, self-discipline and patience. But, most importantly, you'll learn from the very best law enforcement professionals who know what it's like to be in the field, putting their lives on the line to protect others.

There is no more noble calling, no higher honor, than to serve your fellow citizens as a law enforcement officer. Over the years, I've met officers in every corner of this country. And every time, I've come away impressed by their dedication to duty, that fierce desire to serve and protect. To them, putting on that badge every morning is a tremendous source of pride.

At the federal level, we are adding new agents to battle the increase in crime associated with the scourge of drugs. We have particular concerns with the message to be taped for the National Bar Association, and we would like the opportunity to discuss any changes that we have recommended that are not accepted.

In paragraph 2, line 5, delete the words "reads like a roll call of." We would recommend substituting the words "includes some of," so that the sentence will read "Your distinguished membership includes some of the outstanding legal minds of our time -- scholars like Thurgood Marshall, Charles Hamilton Houston, Spotswood Robinson, and Sadie Tanner Alexander."

In paragraph four, line two, delete the words "must be given the chance to pursue judicial careers." We would recommend substituting the words "should be given the opportunity to serve in the nation's judicial ranks."

In paragraph four, line six, delete the words "programs that promote," and substitute the words "their efforts to promote qualified."
