Let me also say, it's a delight to be back among my friends in Idaho; and it is especially delightful to be with you on your centennial year. Of course, we also remember that the history of this great state reaches beyond a century. If we had to choose one day that Idaho history began, it would have to be March 4,

1863, when the first Republican President -- Abraham Lincoln -- created a new territory of the United States with a stroke of his pen. And as I look around this room, at Senators McClure and Symms, and Congressman Craig, I can't help but reflect: How fitting that this great state of Idaho and our Republican Party were born together.\\

Now a new century is beginning for Idaho. Let us make it a century of promise and prosperity. Let us do that by sending Larry Craig to the United States Senate.\\

And no one can convince me, or Larry, that this extraordinary new world would have come about if America had followed the liberal path of unilateral concessions.
