I. SUMMARY

On Tuesday, July 31, 1990, at 5:30 PM, you will address approximately 230 guests on the State floor of the White House. Among those attending will be RCLC Chairman Ed Prince, former Chairman Rich Devos, National Republican Congressional Committee Chairman Guy Vander Jagt, and Co-chairman Ed Rollins.

II. DISCUSSION

The attached remarks (6 minutes, cards) highlight differences between the Republican and Democratic parties, while praising the RCLC and NRCC for their efforts to secure a Republican controlled Congress. Within this framework, the remarks focus on three issues: economic expansion and budget reform, redistricting, and your call for a non-partisan and swift confirmation of David Souter to the Supreme Court.
