**PRESIDENTIAL REMARKS: FUNDRAISER FOR PETE WILSON**  
San Francisco, California  
September 19, 1990

Thanks, Pete -- it's great to be back in California for such a good cause. You know, when they called about this fundraiser, they said to me: "it would be a big boost if this country's most famous Republican came here to help out." I replied: "Fine. What time do you want Millie to be there?" \\

George [Deukmejian] -- thanks for another one of your warm welcomes -- it's great you're here helping out the man who's going to be your successor. What a terrific act to follow. \\

Looking around, I see lots of reasons why the California GOP is going to be so strong in November: the rest of your ticket -- Marian Bergeson for Lieutenant Governor; Joan Milke Flores, for Secretary of State; and Matt Fong, for Controller. And a special thanks to Frank Visco, your State Chair; and to Katie Boyd, Gene Trefethen and Ben Biaggini, who have done such a wonderful job pulling this event together -- twice. \\

You have to agree, there's a very great and formidable woman involved in this gubernatorial race ... but of course Gayle [Wilson] is much too modest to admit it. \\

I did have my doubts about coming back to California today, though. Our latest Agriculture Department figures show that your state is the leading producer of broccoli. \\  
Sort of gives a new meaning to the Big Green movement. \\

Being in San Francisco reminds me of when I congratulated

the '49ers at the White House after their second Super Bowl. I asked Joe [Montana], "so, what do you think about a 'threepeat'?" He looked at me and said, "Mr. President, I thought you were limited to only two terms." \\\

The '49ers are fantastic champions: but we're all here today to show the respect and friendship and confidence we feel for another champion: a champion of the environment \\  
a champion for victims of crime \\  
a champion for hard-working taxpayers \\  
a champion of the American vision. \\  
The Champ: Pete Wilson. \\\

Listen to what people say about him. President Reagan calls him "principled." George [Deukmejian] calls him "experienced." Congressman Campbell calls him "dedicated"; Congressman Lewis calls him "respected." \\  
And even his opponent calls him "wonderful." \\\ As for me: I plan to call him "Governor." \\\

Because, as we look ahead to the year 2000, when California's population could soar from 28 to 40 million, we realize that this state needs a Governor committed to the quality of life issues: protecting our natural heritage; \\  
fighting crime and drugs; \\  
ensuring economic security; \\  
creating more jobs and opportunities. \\  
That person is my friend, Pete Wilson. \\\

It was important to have Pete in the Senate -- it's now vitally important to have him in Sacramento. To begin with, his brand of environmental activism is the kind California needs. You know, in this area -- as in all areas of Pete's commitment -- he holds a position of conviction, not convenience. He wrote

the first coastal protection act before the environmental movement even began. And he's long fought for clean air -- to remove toxic emissions, smog and acid rain from our once-pure skies. Clean Air has been one of our Administration's top priorities as well. I urge the Congress to send me a Clean Air bill I can sign. You know I sent Congress a comprehensive bill more than a year ago. And I negotiated an agreement with Pete's colleagues in the Senate. But I'm still waiting for Congress to send me a solid clean air bill. We must see balanced, rational clean air legislation enacted this year -- because it's one of the most important endowments we can make to protect the ecology of our nation and the world. \\\

I think of how the late photographer Ansel Adams described California beauty: "It's always a sunrise, a glitter of green and golden wonder in a vast edifice of stone and space." Pete will preserve that for our children and our children's children.\\

These future generations also need the legacy of a strong economy led by a Governor with a truly exceptional fiscal record. Pete will give them that. After all, not only did he balance eleven straight budgets as mayor--he also received the "Watchdog of the Treasury" award in Washington for his anti-spending role.

[[And no domestic issue has been more on our minds than our economy during the budget talks -- so it's a triumph for the nation that we've reached this critical bipartisan agreement.\\\]]

When I spoke to Congress last week, I said I wanted to be

able to tell the American people that we've truly solved our deficit problem. But, I added, in order for me to do that, there were five tests that the budget agreement would have to meet.

First: It must include the measures I spelled out to increase economic growth and reduce dependence on foreign oil. \\ Second: It must be fair to all programs and all people. \\ Third: It must address the growth of government's hidden liabilities. \\ Fourth: it must reform the budget process; and it must be real. \\ And fifth: it must avoid anything that would threaten economic growth or return us to the days of punishing income taxes. \\ \\

[ [ I'm delighted to stand here and tell you that this historic agreement does meet these tests, and it does it while reflecting not only the improvement in East-West relations, but our broader responsibilities to deal with the continuing risks of outlaw actions and regional conflict. \\ That's why every citizen can be pleased with it and with the future it guarantees for our nation. Together, let us all look forward to -- and work for -- the promise of an exciting and strong new future that's now within our grasp. \\ \\ ] ]

And there's one other subject on everyone's minds that I want to talk about today: our commitment to the situation in the Persian Gulf. This is something Pete, a former military man, understands first-hand. Time and circumstances have proven him farsighted: Pete Wilson has always eloquently supported the utterly essential need for a strong defense. \\

Five weeks ago, we sent our troops half a world away because

we were compelled by the moral compass that guides our nation. \\  
As Americans, we could not ignore this brutally aggressive act of  
terrorism against international law and order. \\\ Nor could the  
rest of the civilized world. The unity of outrage across the  
globe; \\  
the depth of support in the Gulf; \\  
and the ferocity  
of condemnation in the United Nations \\  
are unprecedented. \\\

And now Sadaam Hussein has been given notice by the  
extraordinary joint declaration that President Gorbachev and I  
signed in Helsinki. It is an absolutely unparalleled message of  
solidarity: a clarion call for Iraq to comply -- immediately and  
completely -- with the five resolutions so urgently ordered by  
the U.N. Security Council. \\  
And it heralds a new era for our  
world: the Soviet Union and the United States standing together  
in vigorous condemnation of an outrageous aggression. \\\

What a dramatic legacy for our children to inherit: this  
stunning new partnership of nations. Ours is the generation to  
finally see the emergence of the promising, exciting new world  
order which we have sought for generations. And we are witness  
to the first demonstration of this new partnership for peace: a  
united world response to Iraq's aggressive ambition.

So the U.N., the U.S., the Soviet Union, and countries across  
the globe have issued with one voice these unequivocal demands:

One: Iraq must withdraw totally and immediately from Kuwait.

Two: Iraq must restore Kuwait's legitimate government. \\  
And three: Iraq must free all hostages in both countries. \\\

Humanity itself will tolerate nothing less. \\\

If Iraq does not meet these non-negotiable conditions, then President Gorbachev and I agree that its isolation will not end. We affirmed that we're prepared to take additional steps if sanctions and the quest for a political resolution do not work.\\

We cannot think about the Persian Gulf without remembering our young men and women there -- joined by brave compatriots of armed forces from countries spanning four continents -- all standing firm and unyielding in the distant desert sands.

Young Americans like 18-year-old Michael Pigeon of Detroit, who wanted to join the Marines here in California in order to serve his country in the Gulf. But he wasn't accepted because he was 30 pounds overweight. Here was a young man who yearned so desperately to defend the American values that mean everything to him, that he walked the 2,500 miles from his home in order to reach his dream -- and his goal. Not only did he make it to the San Diego boot camp, but he lost the weight along the way, and today -- Mike is a proud Marine. He says now that marching in combat boots will be no problem for him.\\ [Gives a new meaning to "I'd walk a mile for a camel."\\\]

Mike's kind of patriotic self-sacrifice reflects the incredible spirit of the American people. Splendid Americans from children to great-grandmothers. They give our brave young servicemen and women loving support and proud resolve. It's touching to hear of the grass-roots efforts swelling from coast to coast. Radio stations volunteering to tape family messages to

send to soldiers. Enough cookie air lifts to fill Candlestick Park. Army mothers encouraging everyone to fly their flags in honor of our young people far from home. Yellow ribbons waving their bright, silent tribute from Maine to Arizona; Oregon to Florida. I've even heard of a group of women who have formed a group called MASH: Mothers Against Sadaam Hussein.

Once again the people of our country have come together to show the world our finest strengths -- American optimism; unity; unselfishness; the wonderful values of family; and the will to stand up for what's right and good. \\ Strengths that form the very heart of America -- and that make possible the freedoms our brave servicemen and women are striving to defend.

One of these freedoms is the right to vote -- to choose our form of government. // Fellow Republicans, I can't think of anything that would better honor these heroes than to exercise that privilege. // As we do, we'll stand up for America. We'll show Saddam Hussein what this great Nation is all about.

I know that every American looks forward to the day when our extraordinary young men and women will return home to a nation proud of its ideals of freedom, integrity and honor -- a nation committed to its tradition of preserving, protecting and defending those precious beliefs which have always made America a beacon of hope and freedom to the world.

Thank you for your warm welcome and the support you're giving to next governor of this great state -- Pete Wilson. God bless you and the United States of America.

THESE FUTURE GENERATIONS ALSO NEED THE LEGACY OF A STRONG ECONOMY LED BY A GOVERNOR WITH A TRULY EXCEPTIONAL FISCAL RECORD. PETE WILL GIVE THEM THAT. AFTER ALL, NOT ONLY DID HE BALANCE 11 STRAIGHT BUDGETS AS MAYOR -- HE ALSO RECEIVED THE "WATCHDOG OF THE TREASURY" AWARD IN WASHINGTON FOR HIS ANTI-SPENDING ROLE EVERY SINGLE YEAR HE HAS BEEN IN THE SENATE. \\

FIRST: IT MUST INCLUDE THE MEASURES I SPELLED OUT TO INCREASE ECONOMIC GROWTH AND REDUCE DEPENDENCE ON FOREIGN OIL. \\ SECOND: IT MUST BE FAIR TO ALL PROGRAMS AND ALL PEOPLE. \\ THIRD: IT MUST ADDRESS THE GROWTH OF GOVERNMENT'S HIDDEN LIABILITIES. \\ FOURTH: IT MUST REFORM THE BUDGET PROCESS; AND IT MUST BE REAL. \\ AND FIFTH: IT MUST AVOID ANYTHING THAT WOULD THREATEN ECONOMIC GROWTH OR RETURN US TO THE DAYS OF PUNISHING INCOME TAX RATES. \\ \\

I WANT TO STAND IN FRONT OF THE AMERICAN PUBLIC AND TELL YOU THE NEGOTIATORS HAVE COME UP WITH AN AGREEMENT THAT MEETS THESE TESTS. I WANT TO TELL YOU THAT THE AGREEMENT REFLECTS NOT ONLY THE IMPROVEMENT IN EAST-WEST RELATIONS, BUT ALSO OUR BROADER RESPONSIBILITIES TO DEAL WITH THE CONTINUING RISKS OF OUTLAW ACTIONS AND REGIONAL CONFLICT. \\ I HOPE WE WILL SEE THIS AGREEMENT SOON -- AND I LOOK FORWARD TO SAYING TO AMERICA: TOGETHER, LET US ALL WORK FOR THE PROMISE OF AN EXCITING AND STRONG NEW FUTURE THAT'S NOW WITHIN OUR GRASP. \\ \\

AND THERE'S ONE OTHER SUBJECT ON EVERYONE'S MINDS THAT I WANT TO TALK ABOUT TODAY: OUR COMMITMENT TO THE SITUATION IN THE PERSIAN GULF. \\ THIS IS SOMETHING PETE, A FORMER MILITARY MAN, UNDERSTANDS FIRST-HAND. TIME AND CIRCUMSTANCES HAVE PROVEN HIM FARSIGHTED: PETE WILSON HAS ALWAYS ELOQUENTLY SUPPORTED THE UTTERLY ESSENTIAL NEED FOR A STRONG DEFENSE. \\

SIX WEEKS AGO, WE SENT OUR TROOPS HALF A WORLD AWAY BECAUSE WE WERE COMPELLED BY THE MORAL COMPASS THAT GUIDES OUR NATION. \\ AS AMERICANS, WE COULD NOT IGNORE THIS BRUTALLY AGGRESSIVE ACT OF TERRORISM AGAINST INTERNATIONAL LAW AND ORDER. \\ \\ NOR COULD THE REST OF THE CIVILIZED WORLD. THE UNITY OF OUTRAGE ACROSS THE GLOBE; \\ THE DEPTH OF SUPPORT IN THE GULF; \\ AND THE FEROCITY OF CONDEMNATION IN THE UNITED NATIONS \\ ARE UNPRECEDENTED. \\ \\

AND NOW SADDAM HUSSEIN HAS BEEN GIVEN NOTICE BY THE EXTRAORDINARY JOINT DECLARATION THAT PRESIDENT GORBACHEV AND I SIGNED IN HELSINKI. 

A fine draft. One comment about the message of this speech applies to speeches as well. At one point (pg. 2, para. 4, line 3) the draft gives a list of qualities that reflect the GOP position and the President's position:

"[T]his state needs a Governor committed to the quality of life issues: protecting natural assets; fighting crime and drugs; ensuring economic security; creating more jobs and opportunities."

We suggest that in this list of GOP qualities, the phrase "empowering people" or perhaps, "empowering people, especially the poor" be added. This will make the draft cover in some manner the four overarching topics which are necessary for articulating the President's message, namely:

- o Pro-growth/Anti-recession Agenda
- o Empowerment (including Educational Choice)/ A Kinder, Gentler Nation
- o Crime and Drugs
- o Environment/Energy

These are the crucial aspects of the Bush domestic policy message and to the extent they can be worked into drafts, particularly political events, we will really strike home with the public as well as the voters in November.

Two: Iraq must restore Kuwait's legitimate government. \\

And three: Iraq must free all hostages in both countries. \\ \\

Humanity itself will tolerate nothing less. \\ \\

If Iraq does not meet these non-negotiable conditions, then President Gorbachev and I agree that its isolation will not end. We affirmed that we're prepared to take additional steps if sanctions and the quest for a political resolution do not work. \\ \\

We cannot think about the Persian Gulf without remembering our young men and women there -- joined by brave compatriots of armed forces from countries spanning four continents -- all standing firm and unyielding in the distant desert sands.

Young Americans like 18-year-old Michael Pigeon of Detroit, who wanted to join the Marines here in California in order to serve his country in the Gulf. But he wasn't accepted because he was 30 pounds overweight. Here was a young man who yearned so desperately to defend the American values that mean everything to him, that he walked the 2,500 miles from his home in order to reach his dream -- and his goal. Not only did he make it to the San Diego boot camp, but he lost the weight along the way, and today -- Mike is a proud Marine. He says now that marching in combat boots will be no problem for him.\\ [Gives a new meaning to "I'd walk a mile for a camel."\\\]

Mike's brand of patriotic self-sacrifice reflects the incredible spirit of the people across this land. Splendid Americans from children to great-grandmothers who are giving our brave young servicemen and women support filled with love and pride -- coming from warm hearts as big and generous as the open sky over this country's heartlands.

It's touching to hear of the grass-roots efforts swelling from coast to coast. Radio stations volunteering to tape family messages to send to soldiers. Enough cookie air lifts to fill the new Air Force One. Army mothers encouraging everyone to fly their flags in honor of our young people far from home. Yellow ribbons waving their bright, silent tribute from Maine to Arizona; Oregon to Florida. I've even heard of a group of women who have formed a group called MASH: Mothers Against Sadaam Hussein.

Once again the people of our country have come together to

show the world our finest strengths -- American optimism; unity; unselfishness; the wonderful values of family; and the good, sound "old-fashioned" morality that made this country what it is: the best and brightest place on earth. \\

I know that every American looks forward to the day when our extraordinary young men and women will return home to a nation proud of its ideals of freedom, integrity and honor -- a nation committed to its tradition of preserving, protecting and defending those precious beliefs which have always made America a beacon of hope and freedom to the world.

God bless them, and God bless the United States of America.
