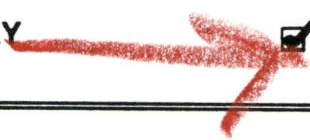

Fourth. We've improved methods of enforcement. If Congress tries to spend money it doesn't have, it will find that a "mini-sequester" will make the cuts. \\

Fifth. And this is an exciting idea Bill Weld is promoting. This budget plan offers incentives in growth for small-to-medium

size job-generating companies. This is another shot in the arm for these productive contributors to our economy. Jobs. And more jobs. That's what this is all about. \\
 And sixth. This package must be passed in order to maintain

economic vitality. It is a package -- and a process -- that demonstrate how Americans can meet challenges together, through bipartisan leadership. ~~Now, with a final burst of quick and decisive action,~~ we can at last put this budget crisis behind us and face the other challenges ^m the world ~~creates.~~ \\
