Attached is a paragraph supplied to me by Stella Guerra, Assistant Secretary for Territorial and International Affairs at the Department of the Interior. Interior has oversight of four areas in the Pacific: the Territories of Guam and American Samoa, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands and the Trust Territory of Palua. Although officials of these areas are not being invited to the Micronesian Summit on Saturday in Hawaii, which I understand from NSC and State is a foreign policy event between the President and leaders of sovereign independent nations on a head of state-to head of state basis, Interior would like some mention of the U.S. relationship to the four areas considered for any formal remarks the President will make at the Summit or at other events in Hawaii. We recognize that any reference may be difficult and have to be forced. Accordingly we will defer to foreign policy considerations and the advice of NSC, but felt obligated to raise the issue.

On a second speech note, when the President is in Albuquerque on Thursday for gubernatorial candidate Frank Bond, the head of the four major federal land agencies will also be meeting in that city to discuss anti-drug efforts on public lands (see attached entry in this week's Cabinet Report). If the President's remarks are to contain some reference to the war on drugs or crime and law and order, some mention of the meeting and federal efforts to fight drugs on public lands might be appropriate. It is not yet clear whether the four individuals (Cy Jamison from BLM, Dale Robertson from the Forest Service, John Turner from Fish and Wildlife, and Jim Ridenour from the Park Service) will attend the lunch, but I don't think this should be a controlling factor if you think some mention of their meeting is appropriate.

Let me know if you want to discuss either of these or if additional information is needed. Thanks for considering these requests!

We all know Saddam Hussein's outlaw act threatens grave economic consequences. But as serious as these consequences may be, what is at stake is far more than a matter of economics or oil. // What is at stake is the principle at the heart of international order: whether aggression pays -- or whether aggression is punished. // Whether we live in a world governed by the rule of law -- or the law of the jungle. ///

No President is quick to order American troops abroad. But there are times when this nation -- when any nation that values its independence -- must act to confront aggression. // Make no mistake: America will not waver -- and Saddam's aggression will not stand. //

And when this ordeal is over -- when Kuwait is once again a sovereign and free member of the family of nations -- Saddam Hussein must pay for the pain and hardship he has caused. // Saddam Hussein must know: The world holds him accountable. ///

And -- with the young men and women of our Armed Forces in our minds -- I want to add one thing more. // Right now -- half a world away -- those brave young men and women are teaching us a

lesson about what it means to love liberty -- the precious freedom that gives America its meaning. // So as November 6th draws near, I urge every citizen of New Mexico: get out and vote. Don't take democracy for granted. ///
