WE NEED A SENATOR LIKE JIM RAPPAPORT ON CAPITOL HILL. I NEED THEM, MASSACHUSETTS NEEDS THEM, AND MOST OF ALL, AMERICA NEEDS THEM. //

SUBSEQUENTLY, THE UNITED NATIONS SECURITY COUNCIL PASSED TEN RESOLUTIONS OF CONDEMNATION AND DISAPPROVAL. ON AUGUST 5TH, I SAID SADDAM HUSSEIN'S AGGRESSION WILL NOT STAND. TODAY I AM MORE DETERMINED THAN EVER: THIS AGGRESSION WILL NOT STAND. ///

THIS MORNING OVER 300 AMERICANS, INNOCENT CIVILIANS, ARE HELD AGAINST THEIR WILL IN IRAQ. MANY OF THEM REPORTEDLY STAKED OUT AS HUMAN SHIELDS, NEAR POSSIBLE MILITARY TARGETS -- BRUTALITY NOT SEEN SINCE ADOLF HITLER.

MANY MORE AMERICANS ARE IN HIDING IN KUWAIT, THEIR LIVES AT STAKE; 27 IMPRISONED IN THE U.S. EMBASSY IN KUWAIT CITY. THEY ARE CUT OFF FROM FOOD AND OTHER SUPPLIES. THEY ARE SURROUNDED BY IRAQI TROOPS.

OUR FLAG STILL FLIES BUT THE RIGHTS OF THESE AMERICAN CITIZENS ARE, AT THIS VERY MOMENT, BEING DENIED BY IRAQ'S BRUTAL DICTATOR.

LET ME BE CLEAR -- WE HAVE NO ARGUMENT WITH THE IRAQI PEOPLE. WE BEAR NO HOSTILITY TO THE IRAQI PEOPLE, NOR DO ANY OF THE OVER 25 COUNTRIES REPRESENTED ON LAND AND SEA IN THE GULF AREA. OUR PROBLEM IS WITH SADDAM HUSSEIN -- ALONE.

I WANT A PEACEFUL RESOLUTION TO THIS CRISIS. INDEED, WE HAVE WORKED CLOSELY WITH THE UNITED NATIONS IN PUTTING SANCTIONS INTO EFFECT, IN PASSING RESOLUTIONS AND IN SPEAKING WITH ONE VOICE AGAINST THE INVADER'S AGGRESSION.

WE ARE GIVING THE SANCTIONS TIME TO WORK. I HOPE THERE WILL NEVER BE A SHOT FIRED IN ANGER, BUT LET ME BE VERY, VERY CLEAR:

THERE WILL BE NO COMPROMISE ON THE STATED OBJECTIVES OF THE UNITED NATIONS SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTIONS -- NONE AT ALL.

THE BRUTALITY AGAINST INNOCENT CIVILIANS WILL NOT BE TOLERATED AND WILL NOT STAND. // SADDAM'S CLEAR VIOLATIONS OF INTERNATIONAL LAW WILL NOT STAND. // AND THAT MEANS, YES, SADDAM HUSSEIN'S BRUTAL AGGRESSION WILL NOT STAND. //

AS TO OUR OWN FORCES DEPLOYED IN THE GULF, WE HAVE THE FINEST YOUNG MEN AND WOMEN OVER THERE EVER TO SERVE IN OUR ARMED FORCES. THEY ARE ALL VOLUNTEERS, THEY ARE ALL WELL TRAINED, THEY ARE ALL HIGHLY MOTIVATED -- AND WE OWE THEM AN ENORMOUS VOTE OF THANKS. SO LET'S SHOW THEM HOW PROUD OF THEM WE ARE -- BY TAKING THE TIME TO VOTE ON NOVEMBER 6. BECAUSE COME ELECTION DAY, THOUSANDS OF G.I.'S WILL BE SENDING IN THEIR ABSENTEE BALLOTS FROM THE SAUDI DESERT AND THE PERSIAN GULF.

LET'S SHOW THEM THAT WE DON'T TAKE DEMOCRACY FOR  
GRANTED. LET'S MAKE THEM PROUD. //

Thanks Bill -- I'm glad to be here today -- and I want to tell you there's no truth to the rumor that I was afraid to leave Washington. Dan Quayle does not own a copy of Evelyn Murphy's autobiography. \\ However, there is some sense of betrayal on the home front. Who would have thought my own dog would write a "lick and tell" book. \\ \\ And maybe, with her writing ambitions, maybe she'll be the next Redskins locker room correspondent. \\ \\

It is great to be back here, down the road from where I was born -- and with my sister, Nancy, here to keep an eye on me. \\ And it's going to be great when John McGovern represents Bedford -- he's going to be an important voice for Massachusetts. \\

I see old friends here: Rep (Silvio) Conte; Gov (John) Volpe; Sen. (Dave) Locke. Also Andy Card and Ron Kaufman. \\ And congratulations to the terrific team that's going to bring a clean house to Massachusetts Tuesday: Bill Weld, your next Governor; Paul Cellucci, Lt. Governor; Jim Rappaport, Senate; Joe Malone, Treasurer; Bill Sawyer, Atty General; Paul McCarthy, Sec. of State; Doug Murray, Auditor; and all the other great Republicans running for Congress and the State House. Ray Shamie -- your vision has forged a forceful new definition of Republican strength as you lead our party in the '90s. \\ And Steve (Pierce) -- you've set a terrific example of putting party unity first -- a legacy of honorable leadership for this state. \\

Two days ago, we had the World Series champs at the White House. And I know you're all thinking about the team here that's had rough times and has fallen from grace in this state -- that's lost its first place status -- that just couldn't seem to get the job done. \\ But enough about the Massachusetts Democrats. ///

And enough of the Massachusetts Democrats. Of the anger and distrust Massachusetts voters have felt for too long. In their place comes a man with unblemished integrity and a vision of a state without corruption. Bill Weld will turn Massachusetts into a place where strength means strength of character, not strength of old-boy connections. He's the leader for the '90s. ///

Another leader for the 90's is my friend Paul Cellucci. I am grateful for Paul's loyalty, dedication, and ability. And along with Bill and State Treasurer candidate Joe Malone, Paul knows what's needed to pull your economy out of its tough times.

During my presidency, America's economic health has been our Number One priority. And after what seemed like endless negotiations, we finally have a budget. The negotiations were tough because the one party that has ruled Congress for almost 40 years is dedicated to perpetual reelection. And the Democratic Party has a bias for red tape over choice, for Washington solutions over community solutions, and for bureaucracy over people. And you add all that up and what do you get? You get a liberal Democratic-controlled Congress that's committed to two things: taxing and spending. ///

The final budget agreement is an example of how the

Democratic Congress works -- or doesn't work. For the sake of the nation, I honestly felt that we had to reduce the deficit now. It is high time that we stop mortgaging the future of these young kids here today. And the Democratic spending binge has got to stop. \\\

I felt strongly about reducing the deficit with spending cuts -- not raising taxes. And that's exactly the kind of budget I sent to the Congress last January. Predictably, the Democrats, instead, wanted to slash defense and then raise your taxes.

What we got was a compromise. And there is some good in it -- the largest spending cut in history. There are some incentives built in so that we will become less dependent on foreign oil. And we also got the first-ever five-year curb on spending.

We put Congress on a pay-as-you-go plan so that the liberal Democrats will no longer be able to fund programs with red ink. If Congress tries to raise spending one dime, they've got to cut other excess spending or find the money for it right there and then. And finally, we held the line against the reckless cuts of our Armed Forces. I will not be the President to preside over the weakening of this nation's defense. \\\

An enforceable deficit reduction agreement was long overdue and absolutely necessary, but I cannot join the liberal Democrats in a carnival of self-congratulation.

What you saw on T.V. last month was the good, the bad and the ugly. The good: Republicans like Silvio Conte. The bad: Democrats like John Kerry. And the ugly -- something you in

Massachusetts are all too familiar with -- new Democratic taxes.

They say there are two things you should never watch being made: sausage -- and legislation. Well, last month America sure got a tour of the hotdog factory. \\ It was not a pretty sight.

The Democrats held America's economy hostage. And to get an agreement -- to get the \$350 billion in spending cuts -- we had to pay a ransom to the Democrats. And the American people have had to pay the ransom in higher taxes.

But the price could have been worse. The original Democrat bill that passed the House tried to impose \$40 billion in income taxes on working Americans. They called it their bill to soak the rich -- but the truth is -- only four billion came from the so-called "surtax" -- while forty billion was to come from the paychecks of the working men and women of this country. We said: "We are going to stop you." And we stopped them cold. \\\

That was not, as these demagogues would have you believe, Republicans protecting the rich -- that was Republicans standing up for the working families in this country. \\\

This Democratic Congress was content to stall an agreement, and stall the economy. We are not going to let them get away with it. \\\ You send me more Republicans for the United States Congress -- and we'll get the job done. \\\ How different the entire budget process would have been with Bob Dole as Majority Leader. How different this entire country will be with a Republican-controlled Senate. \\ We need Jim Rappaport in Washington. \\\

This liberal Democrat Congress has become America's biggest, most entrenched special interest. The House intended to be closest to the people has become the House of Lords. It is great to be back here, up the road from where I was born, ~~with my sister, Nancy, here to keep an eye on me.~~ Great to be near Concord: when John McGovern is elected to represent the 5th district it's going to be the second "shot heard 'round the world." I flew up with John today -- and he's going to be an important new voice for Massachusetts. \\

I see old friends here: Gov (John) Volpe; Sen. (Dave) Locke. Also Andy Card and Ron Kaufman. \\ And congratulations to the terrific team that's going to bring a clean house to Massachusetts Tuesday: Bill Weld, your next Governor; Paul Cellucci, Lt. ~~After protracted, difficult and tough negotiations,~~ *The ~~we~~ were* we finally reached a budget agreement with the Democratic majority that controls Congress. There were clear differences between the two parties in our approach to solving this spiraling deficit problem facing our country.

The Democrats wanted to raise taxes, including income tax rates. I wanted to reduce the deficit with spending cuts. ~~In fact, that is the kind of budget I sent Congress at the beginning of the year.~~ What we got was a compromise. And like all compromises, there was good with the bad.

We got almost \$500 billion in deficit reduction in five years -- half a trillion dollars. We got \$350 billion in spending cuts -- the largest cut in history. We got incentives to make America less dependent on foreign oil.

An enforceable deficit reduction agreement was long overdue and absolutely necessary, but I cannot join the liberal Democrats in a carnival of self-congratulation.
