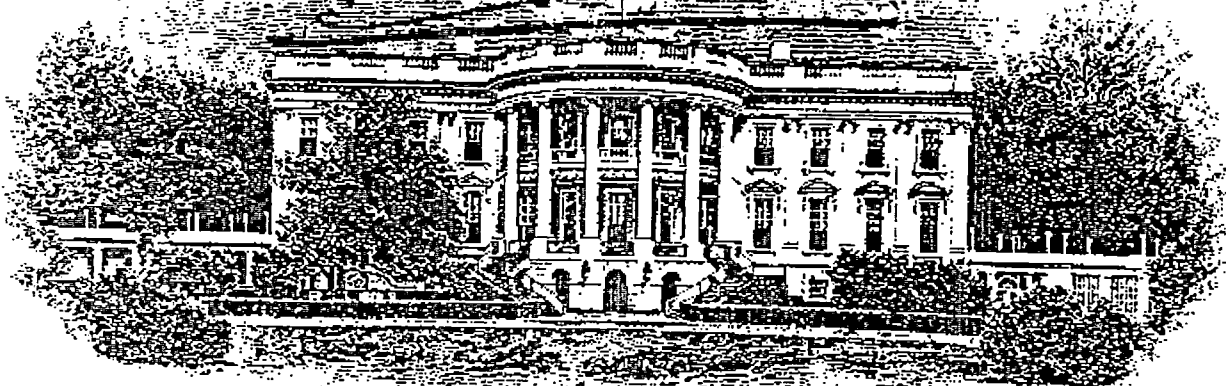

SUBJECT: FACT-CHECK ON VIDEO MESSAGES

I. Proposed Video Message for the National Basketball Association All-Star Game:

1. graph one, third sentence: capitalize Weekend, in "All-Star weekend."

II. Proposed Video Message for the National Automobile Dealers Association:

1. page one, graph two, first sentence: rather than "..welcome your new leadership aboard," I'd suggest "..welcome aboard your new leadership."
2. page one, graph two, second sentence: note that you identify Anderson and McCarthy as a "team." FYI: Anderson is the incoming president, while McCarthy is executive vice president.
3. page one, graph three, fifth line from bottom: "fight double digit"---double-digit should be hyphenated. Also, in the following sentence, there should be a comma after "big cuts in production,".
4. page two, graph three, third sentence: "400,000 lbs.," rather than "4000,000." Also, I'd suggest "for the troops in the Persian Gulf," rather than "..to the troops.."

III. Proposed Video Message for Ray Shamie Retirement Dinner:

1. page one, graph two, first sentence: "the story of St. Patrick," rather than "the story St. Patrick." Also, this story was related to Barrie by M.K.; what I've found through our reference materials is that Cashel Rock is where "St. Patrick reputedly plucked a shamrock from the ground, using it as a symbol to explain the mystery of the Trinity, giving Ireland, in the process, its universally recognized symbol." I've spoken to M.K., and she says that's the incident she was referring to.

Also note: "convinced thousands of Irish to 'see the light,'" 'see the light' is put in quotations because it is metaphoric, not as any kind of excerpt from what he might have said there.

2. page two, graph one, second sentence: "...the addition of nine newly elected state senators," not eight.

IV. Proposed Cities in Schools Education Message:

1. graph two, first and second sentence: "drop-out" is one word, as in "dropout prevention" (1st sentence), and "dropout tragedy" (2nd sentence).

Hinesville and the other towns near here lined not just the streets around Fort Stewart -- but lined the interstate all the way up I-95 to Savannah. // What a sight that must have been to the proud soldiers of Fort Stewart. //

With those brave men and women in mind, let me close with a prayer: for the safety of every American serviceman and servicewoman -- for every member of the coalition forces standing with us -- for every innocent, caught up in this terrible conflict. May all of them be safe and sound -- and may the families of Fort Stewart be re-united once again. //

Dave Carney has asked that I follow up with you regarding the script for the Ray Shamie video message. What follows are a few thoughts and suggestions. My source for most of this input is Bruce Stebbins, who as you know has left his position as Associate Director of Political Affairs for the Northeast. Since Bruce has worked with the Republican party for the past several years, I deemed his input of value.

- ◆ Perhaps it would be more effective and less harsh to poke fun (see paragraph 2) at Democrats in general rather than the 2 senators in particular. Bruce points out that Governor Weld and Senator Kerry have been working closely on a project in the state. Perhaps it would work to say, ". . . at persuading the followers -- hopefully the Democrats will follow."
- ◆ Paragraph 4 refers to ". . . first time since 1972," I believe the correct year may be 1974. I can confirm this for you by Monday.
- ◆ We would recommend, for political reasons, the mention of Joe Malone's name. He is the newly elected state treasurer. 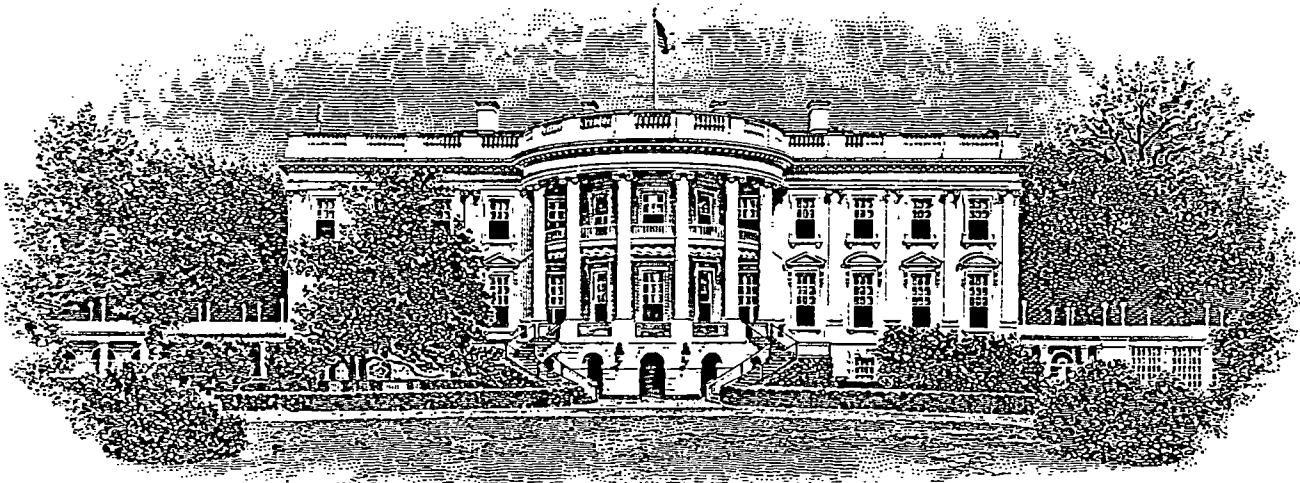

- 3) page one, graph four, first sentence: FYI--not only was Gallagher "among the first U.S. Marines to engage Iraqi units," he was "a leader of a daring attempt Wednesday to rescue two U.S. Army soldiers missing in Khafji, Saudi Arabia," according to today's Great Falls Tribune (Note: these were the two missing from the jeep, Schwarzkopf later said they were safe).
- 4) page one, graph four, second sentence: note that Don's wife Dawn will **not** be in attendance; his brother, Brian, however will.
- 5) page two, graph three: Do we really want to talk about women's chests? By starting out "..to Jeanine, Dawn" and ending with "on your chests" it sounds like we're talking about them rather than "military families." How about changing "your chests" to "their chests."

1. graph one, third sentence: capitalize **Weekend**, in "All-Star weekend."

1. page one, graph two, first sentence: rather than "..welcome your new leadership aboard," I'd suggest "..welcome aboard your new leadership."
2. page one, graph two, second sentence: note that you identify Anderson and McCarthy as a "team." FYI: Anderson is the incoming president, while McCarthy is executive vice president.
3. page one, graph three, fifth line from bottom: "fight double digit"---double-digit should be hyphenated. Also, in the following sentence, there should be a comma after "big cuts in production,".
4. page two, graph three, third sentence: "400,000 lbs.," rather than "4000,000." Also, I'd suggest "**for** the troops in the Persian Gulf," rather than "..to the troops.."

III. Proposed Video Message for Ray Shamie Retirement Dinner:

1. ✓ page one, graph two, first sentence: "the story of St. Patrick," rather than "the story St. Patrick." 
