SUGGESTED REMARKS FOR THE PRESIDENT IN HIS DISCUSSION WITH MEMBERS OF
THE BUSINESS COUNCIL ON 2/28/91

THE WAR IN THE MIDDLE EAST MAY BE OVER -

But, as we all know, there is much to be done domestically-- and business leadership is absolutely essential to the solution of our most important domestic problems.

Our number one immediate problem is our other war -- the war against drugs. This is a war that America is also winning, but there is a long fight ahead without any quick solution. Five years ago there were 23 million regular users of illicit drugs in the United States and now there are an estimated 13 million, or 10 million less. But almost 6 million of these are "in trouble," (that is, in various stages of addiction).

There is a profound cultural shift in our attitudes, as a nation, toward illicit drugs. I would like to mention two fundamental reasons for this change that you in business should be complimented for. The first is the remarkable support you have given to the Partnership for a Drug-Free America -- with anti-drug messages now running at better than \$1 million worth a day... clearly working to help change the public's attitudes towards drugs.

The second is a growing intolerance being shown towards drugs in the workplace. Most of your companies now have comprehensive drug-free workplace programs and we know that effort is having an important effect. Let me urge all of you to be sure that your companies do have a program of education, treatment and testing for illegal drugs.

Frankly, I would like to be able to tell the young people in our schools in America that the day is coming when there will be no jobs in this country for those who use illicit drugs. We simply can't be competitive in world markets unless we rid ourselves of this scourge.

And that brings me to the education issue. You all know how committed I am on this subject -- and the leadership and involvement on the part of business in our K-12 educational system is truly extraordinary. I hear from governors all over the country about the wonderful work you are doing.

And finally, a situation that underlies both the drug problem and the education problem and which is of deep concern to all Americans is the breakdown of the American family.

The family is the country's fundamental social unit... and it has been subject to extraordinary stress over the past generation of change.

How we meet the needs of the family in our society... and the needs of our people without family... is a problem that business and government at all levels of society must address together.

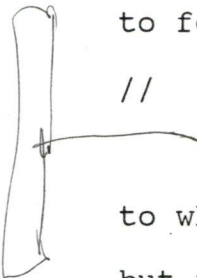


