### FORMAT:

The RA video would be a combination of audio and visual bites pulling together the Washington political community and operations, the actual country chapters and the Party leadership. To that end, the video would include some or all of the following:

**INTRODUCTION:** Explain what Republicans Abroad is and how it operates (2 minutes).

Using existing footage from our first video, we can provide a new voice over for the introduction of the organization, merged with visuals of foreign capitols, pictures of Americans abroad and graphic interfaces which illustrate the "world-wide" nature of the organization (i.e. globe turning, etc.). Existing audio bites would have to be redone to discuss organization's history and progress as a vote getting mechanism within the Republican National Committee.

**RNC INPUT:** Use Party leadership to demonstrate the Republican party's commitment to Americans abroad. (1-2 minutes.)

Showing Capitol Hill and the Republican National Committee headquarters, we would record remarks from the RNC Chairman and Co-Chairman Clayton Yeutter and Jeanie Austin discussing their feelings about the relevance of Republicans Abroad. Yeutter's office would be an excellent visual against his remarks and Austin could be filmed in one or two different settings within committee headquarters to show the overseas voters the work that goes on inside the RNC . . . i.e. demonstrating computer facilities that serve opposition research, and the telecommunications outreach banks and printing and publications. We also have a good video of Jeanie in Costa Rica. This would add to our credibility.

**SENATE/HOUSE INPUT:** Discuss the actual impact of the overseas vote on election results. (1-2 minutes)

Using the Capitol as a setting, RA would get a member of the House and/or Senate leadership to deliver the "every vote counts" message and offer selected evidence of races which have been won or lost on margins attributable directly to absentee ballots. Congressman Guy Vander Jagt and Senator Robert Dole have already agreed to participate. This segment could end with a

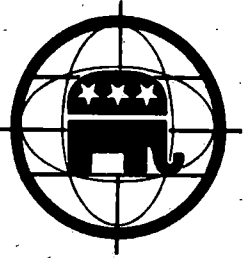
15-20 second visual of the House or Senate voting on a major bill and a reminder to the overseas voter's obligation to make their input to this process before others make it for them.

**MESSAGE FROM RA LEADERSHIP:** Discuss role and functions of the country chapters within the RA network and the importance of fundraising. (3-4 minutes)

This would be a scripted message from RA Chairman John G. McCarthy, Jr. recorded in Geneva or Paris and sent here for merging into the rest of the tape. McCarthy would discuss what each chapter needs to do in order to be a vital part of the network and give specific examples of American initiatives in electoral politics over the history of the organization. McCarthy's message would be interspersed with visuals of country chapter meetings or rallies, previous footage from RA's participation in the conventions and at least three messages from an active country chapter (i.e. Jerry Loupee - Thailand, John Wood - U.K., Betty Dahlstrom - Costa Rica, John Bauer - Bahrain). Included in this segment would a discussion of the importance of fundraising

**CONCLUSION/ MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT:**

Taking outside shots of the White House, the video would conclude with a recorded message from President Bush, directed specifically at Republicans Abroad and the overseas vote, from the Oval Office. As President Bush is well aware of the work of RA through the years and has been a staunch supporter, it may very well be possible to get his participation in this project. The President's message will fade into film footage of Americans abroad or the Convention and the song, "Proud To Be An American".
