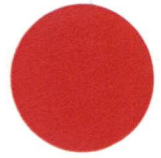

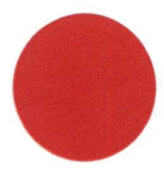

As I depart for Rome and the Hague to meet with top European officials, I would like to discuss the importance of this trip for the American people.

In Rome, I will meet with NATO leaders in Rome to talk about the challenges of security in the post Cold War world. We will work to promote peace in troubled regions of the world and to defend our shared interests -- just as we did during the Gulf War. Sound agreements will protect Americans abroad from terror and harassment. Sound agreements will protect Americans here in the United States from the threat of war. I certainly support any initiatives that can keep our loved ones safe and free.

After the meetings in Rome, I will travel to the Hague and meet with European Community leaders. There, we will talk about security issues, but we also will discuss ways of expanding free and fair trade around the world -- something that will generate new business and opportunities for American farmers, manufacturers, service industries, and even media organizations.

We're not talking small potatoes. This year The United States will do more than 200 billion dollars' worth of trade with European Community nations, and every billion dollars' worth of manufactured exports means 20,000 jobs here in the U.S.A.

Congress continues to struggle with our growth package, while the American people justifiably demand action. Fortunately, our allies are serious about fostering new opportunities for themselves -- and for Americans. That's why I'll be in the Hague.

You know, most American children learn in school that our nation always has looked outward, toward the broader world. Many of them feel a sense of pride and wonder when they trace on the globe the movement of their ancestors from distant lands to the United States. America has been shaped and enriched by cultures from across the world. That may explain why our Nation has a special role as the greatest political, economic, military and moral power on earth.

As a nation, we have learned the awful price of isolationism, which helped spawn two world wars. We have learned that protectionism -- trade isolationism -- hastened the worst economic depression in modern history.

On this trip, we will prove that we have learned those lessons well. The United States and its allies have joined in a thrilling enterprise to build a world of unprecedented prosperity and peace. And this week, we will *(take ~~not just~~ great strides)* to create greater economic opportunities for working Americans, greater security for our families, and greater hopes for our children, and our children's children.
