ate jobs here isn't to cut and run, and we're not going to do that, ever. The way to create jobs is by opening markets, opening markets for exports everywhere in the world. And I'm going to fight hard in every foreign market to do that, and I'm going to resist—I don't care about the politics—I am going to resist the siren's call for protection. It is not good for America. We are the leaders of the world not in retreat.

And I'm going to fight hard, lastly, in every primary, not for my sake but for America's. I believe fundamentally we're an optimistic people. We saw it after Desert Storm. We saw the country come together, and we were lifted up. And now we're subjected to some tough economic times, and there's some icing on that cake, with a lot of gloom and doom over and over again coming out of the political process itself.

I believe the American people want to hear about how we're going to address our country's challenges. They want to hear solutions, not just a lot of name-calling, and running this country down. And I might say parenthetically, again without any regard to the primaries, I think we've got to come together as a country to resist the politics of ugliness and hate, racial bigotry and discrimination. We've got to stand against that wherever we are.

So, the bottom line is, I need your help. I need your help to keep our party strong, keep it united so we can win this fall. And yes, there are many challenges before us, and I guarantee you we're going to meet them. We are the United States of America. We're going to come out of these rough economic times. We are going to continue to lead the world. And I, as President, am going to continue to see that our national security is second to none around the world.

We're going to meet these challenges, meet them all across the State of Florida from the Panhandle down to the Florida Keys. And yes, there's an important election next week, and then there's another one in November. And I say this, I hope without arrogance, I am confident I am going to win this nomination. And I am confident I am going to win this election, because I believe that the values I've touched on here today are the fundamental values of the American

people. And I will do my level best. I will continue to try my hardest in tough times, and I will continue to lead the greatest, freest Nation on the face of the Earth. But I need your support on Tuesday, and I'll need it again in November.

Thank you all, and may God bless our great country.

Remarks at the Bush-Quayle South Florida Rally in Hialeah, Florida March 4, 1992

The President. Thank you very, very much. What a wonderful turnout. Thank you. Thank you, Jeb. And may I first salute your great Congresswoman, Ileana Ros-Lehtinen, doing a superb job in Washington, DC; Mayor Julio Martinez, also working at this important local level. And it's great to be back in south Florida. I believe I am the first President to visit Hialeah, but I am sure proud to be here. I want to mention three other State leaders who can't be with us today, senator Casas and representatives Garcia and Rojas. They'd planned on being here; they were called to Tallahassee for action in the legislature. And I just pay them my respects because they, too, are serving you all very, very well.

I wish we had a little more time here today. It would be great to have a Cafe Cubano at Chico Two's, but time won't permit it. And may I thank the people from south Miami here who are providing us with this cheering. And right over here, there they are, Hialeah.

I'm going to keep this speech short. When you've got to face the voters, you can't afford to give a 4-hour stemwinder, Castro-style. So I'll keep it shorter. Let me get right to the point of this visit. I want to be your President for 4 more years. We can, and we will, win

elections up and down the line, in Congress, in the statehouses, and in local communities, for people that share our values, who are working for jobs, family, peace. And together, we can win a great victory on primary day and then another one on November 3d, 1992.

You see, I think we agree on the big issues that shape the world, on the values that guide us at home. And I'm speaking of world peace, the importance of family, the need to create and sustain good jobs in a productive society.

We have big plans for this year. Here's what we need to accomplish together. First, we are going to get that economy growing and thriving. Help me with the Congress. And with Ileana's help, I will try to keep rolling back a Government that's too big and spending too much. We'll try to keep working on that one, Ileana. And we're holding Congress' feet to the fire, to meet this March 20th deadline for tax cuts to create jobs and incentives to get the housing market back on its feet. Right now, the tired old liberal leadership in the Congress is moving in the wrong direction.

You know, the House passed a bill that would raise taxes \$100 billion, and if it comes to my desk, I am going to veto it so fast it'll make your head swim. And let me say also, we've got to break this stranglehold of Government monopoly on the schools. You see, we say don't let the bureaucrats decide. Let the parents decide. Let the parents choose where the children go to school. And let them have the freedom to choose among private and parochial schools as well as public schools.

Another point, and Jeb touched on it, we've got to take back our neighborhoods from the thugs and the drug dealers. Part of the answer is a tough crime bill in Washington, DC. Give me your support to get that passed. Our bill gives new protection to women and children, those that are victimized by sex criminals. It stops endless appeals. And for the worst kind of crimes, it provides the death penalty for the cop-killers and those narcotic kings. I support our police, and I think we need to show more compassion for the victims of crime and be a little tougher on the criminals.

And let me shift a little bit to a little bit to do with foreign affairs. I am looking forward to the day when democracy has triumphed and the Castro dictatorship nearby is no more. And let me say to those people outside who are concerned about their country: I want to see democracy restored to Haiti, and we will continue to work for the return of President Aristide.

I want to honor the Cuban brave human-rights activists and its martyrs for freedom and those who died resisting the dictatorship of Castro. And I'm looking forward to being the first President of the United States to set foot on the free soil of post-Castro Cuba.

Audience members. Four more years! Four more years! Four more years!

The President. Let's look at the real situation in the world. Look around the world. Fidel Castro is now hopelessly isolated. And let me be very clear about this: We cannot and we will not have a normal dialog with Cuba as long as that dictatorship remains in power. And we do not and we will not help Castro police that prison state. We're going to keep heavy pressure on the outlaw regime, and we are going to strictly maintain our embargo.

Now let me say, as I look at this situation as your President, Castro is showing signs of desperation. Over the past year, he has intensified his persecution of people who attempt free expression, of people who try to form independent organizations. And the secret police have carried out more arrests. The Government-controlled mobs are increasing their violence against brave individuals who stand up for the basic rights and liberties that we take for granted in this country. And so, Castro is trying to crush the Cuban spirit and the Cuban society in a manner like Stalin.

The world has run out of patience with Fidel Castro. Let me give you a profound example of what I have just said. Yesterday, at the Human Rights Commission in the United Nations in Geneva, they voted for the strongest action ever against Castro's human rights abuses. And listen to this one: A new democracy, a brandnew democracy joined the world's condemnation of Castro's crimes, and that democratic was Russia. Imagine the change. Russia condemning Fidel Castro. And the vote of that important Commission

was overwhelming. The ex-communist states of Bulgaria and Hungary and Czechoslovakia cosponsored that anti-Castro resolution. But not a single Latin American country voted to defend Castro. It's changing. It's changing all around the world. And this man is isolated in his dictatorship.

But let me say this more positively. Let me say this more positively: When Castro falls, and inevitably he will, we are going to be instantly prepared to renew our friendship and then help instantly in the rebuilding of a free and democratic Cuba. And I'm talking about a lot of trade. And while I'm on that subject, let me mention in a broad sense that the people I am running against for President of the United States, or who are running against me, do not share this vision of free and fair trade. They want to barricade our borders against job-creating trade. And they're the same kind of people that said to Columbus, "The Earth is flat, don't go." And as for me, I'm going to keep working to increase the flow of foreign trade and investment, which is the lifeblood of modern Miami. We will not go back to the sorry, sad, pessimistic days of protectionism. We're not going to do that as long as I am President.

My son, Jeb, told me that there were many people right here in the Guards and in the Reserve and in the regulars that served in Desert Storm. And they served with great patriotism. And let me say to them: You did a first-class job.

And now you're seeing in this political year many people that are saying cut the heart out of defense. Cut it all up. Cut it away. Don't have a defense. Let me tell you something. I am going to keep this country strong and ready for the challenges ahead, whatever they may be. Yes, we can make cutbacks. Because these people fought so well, our credibility is high, communism is on the run, democracy is going forward. We can make cuts in defense, but true to form, the liberals want to cut it to the bone. And we must not let that happen. I am for prudent cuts. We have suggested some. They're on the recommendation of the Joint Chiefs and of Colin Powell and of Dick Cheney. But I am not going to permit these people to gut defense so they can run off and spend money

When I think of Hialeah, I think of patriotism and service to country. And the Florida reservists and guardsmen answered that call for Desert Storm, and airmen and sailors from Florida's bases, and of course, the soldiers of General Schwarzkopf, central command all responded. And I am so proud of those of you here who served. And with your service and with your courage you said, "Never will we tuck our tail and let aggression stand." And we fought. And we won. And you that served deserve the credit.

And there were those who didn't support us then, and there are those who second-guess us now. But not the good people of Hialeah. Not the people of Florida. And when our kids laid it on the line, you never wavered. And for this, I want to thank the people of this great State.

And every 4 years we have this political dance. And now we are in the battle for the future of the United States of America. And we are determined to leave our kids the best legacy possible. We want to lead the world in good jobs with productive work. We want to remain a powerful force, the single world leader for world peace and freedom. And we're fighting to protect our most basic institution, the one that means so much to the people of Hialeah, and I'm talking about the family.

And on primary day and in November, you are going to have the future of this country in your hands. And you can prove your faith in self-government. You can prove that this epitomizes success in America, people that come here halfway around the world and then make a success of their lives. You can prove your success, and we can prove the pessimists wrong. So stand up and vote for what you believe in. Show Florida your strength. Show America the power that you represent. And give me 4 more years as President of the United States of America.

Background

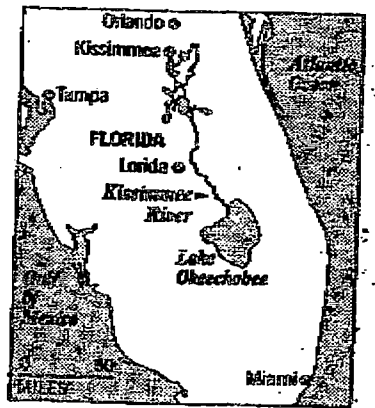
The Army Corps of Engineers is completing a study of a plan to restore the environmental values that were lost as a result of the completion in 1971 of a Federal project which channelized the Kissimmee River, north of Lake Okeechobee for flood control and navigation. The channelization of the river dramatically altered the natural physical form, ecological function, and hydrologic characteristics of the river floodplain system contributing to significant long-term ecological degradation. Approximately 21,000 acres of wetlands were lost in the lower Kissimmee basin. The Corps restoration plan is based upon the so-called level 2 backfilling plan published in 1990 by the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD), who is the non-Federal sponsor of the existing Kissimmee River project and will be the sponsor of the Corps restoration project. The Water Resources Development Act of 1990, which authorized the Corps study, directed that a final report be transmitted to Congress no later than April 1, 1992. That report is on schedule and is now being completed in Washington, D.C. The recommended plan for restoration of the river will restore essential physical and hydrologic characteristics of the lower Kissimmee basin. This, in turn, will lead to re-establishment of complex physical, chemical, and biological interrelationships that supported the historic ecosystem's high levels of resilience and productivity. In essence, this project would reverse the damage caused by the channelization. It would restore 66 miles of river and 29,000 acres of wetlands, and benefit 300 species of fish and wildlife, including 3 endangered species. The recommended project is expected to be authorized in the 1992 Water Resources Development Act. Project design and construction will take several years and will be funded through the annual appropriations process.

Issue

While there has been agreement as to the appropriate scope and staging of the project, there has yet to be agreement on the financial terms under which this \$514 million project should be undertaken. The Assistant Secretary of the Army (Civil Works) has been negotiating with the project sponsor, the SFWMD, in an effort to arrive at a mutually agreeable division of responsibilities between Federal and non-Federal interests. The Assistant Secretary has recently received a proposal from the SFWMD which would divide the project into one element costing \$368 million to be jointly financed with the Federal Government on a 50/50 basis, and another \$146 million element that would be done at the expense of the sponsor. The Assistant Secretary is scheduled to meet with Governor Chiles on Thursday, March 5. At the meeting, she intends to indicate her willingness to support the proposal of the SFWMD. However, the option is available for the President to make this announcement on Wednesday.



Aerial photo, left, shows the straight canal that is the Kissimmee River on left and the meandering section of restored waterway on the right.



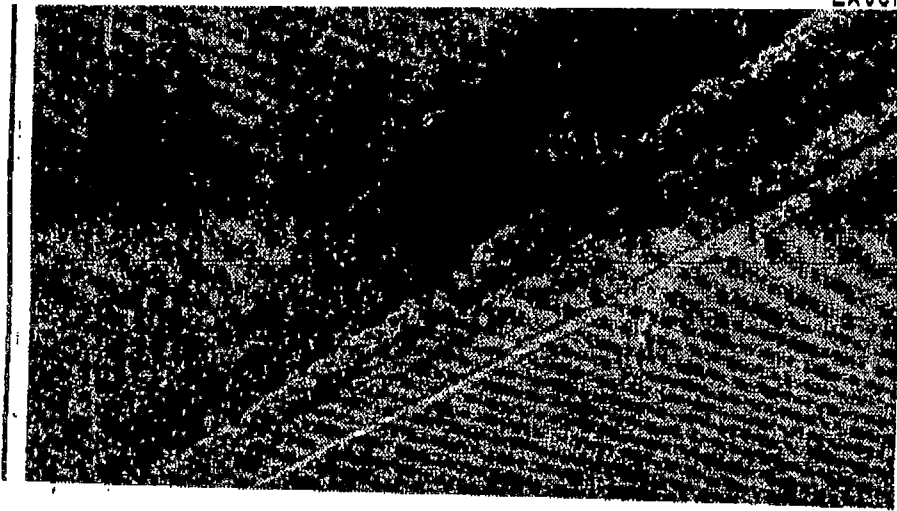

Before the corps straightened the Kis- simmee, the river was a shallow, meander- ing waterway surrounded by marsh. A se- ries of hurricanes in the 1940s caused wide- spread flooding in the Kissimmee basin with massive loss of lives and property. The state of Florida then asked the corps to bring the Kissimmee under control. The engineers did with a vengeance.

They straightened, widened and deepened the entire river, from its headwaters in Lake Kissimmee south of Orlando to Lake Oke- chobee. They turned 103 miles of meander- ing river into a 56-mile canal, complete with several dammed-up reservoirs whose water levels are controlled by electrically operated steel-and-concrete locks.

The 10-year project was finished in 1971. Within five years, however, the Florida Legislature was calling for restoring the river, which had suffered a dramatic drop in game fish and a loss of 90 percent of the waterfowl population and about 43,000 acres of wetland.

"I think people were just amazed at what the corps had done to the river," Toth said.

To restore the Kissimmee, ecologists and the eco-engineers would like to fill in the canal with the very same dirt dug out by the

corps. This would plug the canal and force water into the old, adjacent river channel and nearby marshes.

To prove that the concept would work, weirs were installed a few years ago along a section of the canal. They acted like dams and sent water flowing back into the old river course.

The response was almost immediate. Wading birds and migrating ducks returned to the meandering restored section. The bottom of the old channels, once filled with muck, was scoured clean. Sand bars were reestablished. Bass returned, as did willow, pickerel weed and other natural vegetation.

Yet complete success on the Kissimmee is anything but guaranteed. The reappearance of wading birds, sand bars and pickerel weed was partial and temporary because the ex- periment did not include a return to natural water levels and constant current, something the complete restoration would include.

"We didn't restore the Kissimmee," said Toth, who works for the South Florida Wa- ter Management District and directs the scientific team that will evaluate the pro- ject. "We showed the river could be re- stored, but we didn't prove it."

Cairns agreed, saying, "I don't believe we can put anything back the way it was. But we can put it back close enough, so that it

would take a professional to tell the differ- ence between real and restored."

Cash-poor Florida legislators and some environmentalists have questioned whether spending \$422 million to repair a degraded river is a wise investment. Why not, they ask, spend the money conserving still un- touched areas? Half a billion dollars could buy a lot of habitat.

Toth and Kissimmee advocates say the restoration must be seen in the broader con- text of repairing the entire watery world of south Florida. It is all, they say, one big sys- tem.

Water from Lake Kissimmee drains down through the river into the great inland Lake Okeechobee, which in turn feeds the Ever- glades that spill into Florida Bay and the Keys. Cleaning the Kissimmee, they say, would clean the Everglades.

As Toth cruises the backwaters of the par- tially repaired Kissimmee, jet fighters roar across the sky, making mock bombing raids over nearby Avon Park Air Force Range.

It has not escaped the attention of envi- ronmentalists that, for the cost of two fight- er jets, the Kissimmee could be stirred from its coma and made whole again.

"This could be a pretty little river," Toth said. "I really believe we could do something amazing here."

LORIDA, Fla.—The Kissimmee River is not exactly dead. It is comatose.

"It's like rehabilitating Cairns, a professor at Virginia Polytechnic Institute, a man widely known as the restoration ecologist that's broken, and just starting to get back on his feet."

Cairns recently advised the National Research Council that, by the year 2000, the States restore 10 million acres of wetland lost since the arrival of the Corps.
