Ladies and gentleman, I have a special reason for welcoming the National Managed Health Care Congress to Washington.

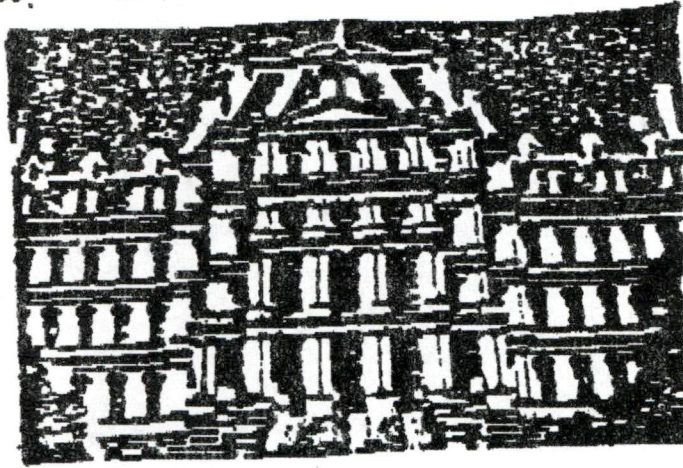
