Good morning, everyone. Thank you all for coming.

I'd first like to welcome all the employees of the Superconducting Super Collider Laboratory -- those here and those watching back in Texas. And my greetings to the Members of Congress who are here and who've worked so hard for this moment.

We are here today to take another step into the future -- an American future that offers opportunities unprecedented in our country's history. The task before us is to grasp those opportunities, and to make them available for every American.

The great question today is not whether America will compete in the new century. You know and I know -- we will. The question is how we compete, how we remain the world's leader -- not only militarily and politically, but economically as well.

In large measure, the answer lies in pushing back the frontiers of human knowledge, so that the daring ideas and dreams of this decade become the everyday life of the next.
