RICHARD W. PORTER

Richard W. Porter was appointed Counselor to the Vice President on January 7, 1992. He has responsibilities in the areas of politics and policy development.

Starting in July 1990, Mr. Porter served as Special Assistant to the President and Executive Secretary to the Domestic Policy Council. In this capacity, he coordinated the involvement of the Cabinet in advising the President on a wide variety of domestic policy issues.

Prior to this, he was Deputy Assistant Secretary for Policy Review and Analysis at the Department of the Treasury. At the Treasury, Mr. Porter monitored and reviewed the development of selected economic, tax and enforcement issues and advised the Secretary, the Deputy Secretary and the Assistant Secretary for Policy Management on those issues.

During 1988, Mr. Porter was an analyst and the chief writer on the domestic policy staff of Bush/Quayle '88. He also served as a law clerk to Judge Richard A. Posner on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit and worked as a lawyer/economist at Lexecon, Inc., a law and economics consulting firm in Chicago, Illinois. Mr. Porter started his career at IBM, where he was a Systems Engineer and a Marketing Representative.

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
