State Treasurer Joseph Malone (R)

Joseph Malone is the 56th Treasurer and Receiver-General of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. The first Republican to hold this office since 1949, Malone carried the state with a 58% margin of victory. Malone also serves as Executive Director of the Massachusetts Republican party. You last saw him during your trip to Boston on Monday, November 25, 1991. You sent a personal note to Malone on November 25 as follow-up.

Mary Lee King, Governor's Chief Policy Advisor (R)

In her capacity as Chief Policy Advisor to the Governor and Lt. Governor, King advises on all legislative and regulatory policy matters and is the chief liaison between the Legislature and the Executive Office. She is a member of the Republican State Committee.

The Honorable William M. Bulger (D), President of the Senate

First elected to the State Senate in 1971, Senator Bulger has served as President of the Senate since July 1978. Prior to that time, he served in the Massachusetts House of Representatives from 1961 - 1970.

The Honorable David H. Locke (R), Minority Leader of the Senate

Senator Locke will also be attending the Civil Justice Reform Roundtable. First elected to the State Senate in 1968, Senator Locke has served as Minority Leader since January 1989. Prior to that time, he served in the Massachusetts House of Representatives from 1960 - 1968. Senator Locke was named "Legislator of the Year" by the National Republican Legislators Association in 1990. Locke also served as Senior Co-Chairman for the 1988 Bush-Quayle campaign.

The Honorable Charles Flaherty (D), Speaker of the House

Serving his 13th term in the Massachusetts House of Representatives, Flaherty has been Speaker of the House since 1991.

The Honorable Peter Forman (R), Minority Leader of the House

Representative Forman will also be attending the Civil Justice Reform Roundtable. First elected to the House of Representatives in 1980 at the age of 22, Peter Forman is the youngest elected Republican to the Massachusetts Legislature in this century. He has served as Minority Leader since 1991. In this capacity, he is the youngest Massachusetts Leader, of either party, in this century and the fourth youngest Floor Leader in the nation. In 1986, Forman was selected by then-Vice President Bush to be Massachusetts Chairman of the Vice President's Political Action Committee. In 1988 he was named co-chairman of the Massachusetts Bush for President Campaign.

Frank Bellotti (D)

Mr. Bellotti will also attend the Civil Justice Reform Roundtable. Currently practicing law in Boston, he served as Massachusetts Attorney General from 1975 - 1987, and was a Democratic candidate for Massachusetts Governor in 1990 and 1994.

Peter Berlandi (D)

Mr. Berlandi is a private consultant in Boston and serves as the Finance Director for the Weld/Cellucci Committee. As you may recall, Berlandi was Governor Weld's guest at the Reception at the Residence for Republican Governors on Monday, February 3, 1992. You also saw Berlandi during your trip to Boston on Monday, November 25, 1991. You wrote a note to Berlandi on November 25 as follow-up.

The Honorable Jack Flood (D), former member of the Massachusetts House of Representatives

Representative Flood served from 1981 - 1990 as a member of the Massachusetts House of Representatives. He was a candidate for Massachusetts Governor in 1990. Flood currently practices law in Boston, concentrating on the areas of business and corporate law. It is our understanding from the Governor's office that Flood is a well-known, moderate Democrat who is expected to switch to the Republican party within the next month.

William F. Weld Governor of Massachusetts

Bill Weld attended the Middlesex School in Concord, Mass., from 1956 to 1962 before entering Harvard College, where he graduated summa cum laude in 1966. A year later, he received a diploma in economics and political science, with distinction, from Oxford University. Weld graduated cum laude from Harvard Law School in 1970.

After serving as a law clerk with the state's Supreme Judicial Court for one year, Weld worked for 10 years at the Boston law firm of Hill & Barlow. In 1974, he served as associate minority counsel to the U.S. House Judiciary Committee during its Watergate impeachment inquiry. Weld was the 1978 Republican nominee for attorney general.

In 1981, Weld was named U.S. Attorney for Massachusetts by President Ronald Reagan. During Weld's five-year tenure, the office won convictions in 109 of 111 political corruption cases, imposed fines on several banks engaged in money laundering, obtained lengthy prison terms for the leaders of the Boston Mafia, and broke up an arson ring that was responsible for 306 fires in the Greater Boston area. In 1985, Weld's fellow U.S. Attorneys elected him chairman of the Attorney General's Advisory Committee of U.S. Attorneys.

Reagan brought Weld to Washington in 1986, appointing him Assistant Attorney General in charge of the Criminal Division. Emphasizing public corruption, narcotics and white-collar crime cases, Weld oversaw all federal criminal investigations in the nation. He resigned from that post in 1988 and joined the Boston law firm of Hale & Dorr, where he served as a senior partner until his election as Governor of Massachusetts in 1990.

On January 4, 1990, Weld formally announced his candidacy for Governor of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and was elected on November 6, 1990. He was inaugurated on January 3, 1991.

Weld was born on July 31, 1945 in Smithtown, New York, and is 46 years old. He lives in Cambridge with his wife, Susan Roosevelt, and their five children: David, (b) (6) Ethel, (b) (6) Mary, (b) (6) Quentin, (b) (6) and Frances, (b) (6)

Paul Cellucci Lieutenant Governor

Paul Cellucci is a graduate of Hudson Catholic High School, the Boston College School of Management, and Boston College Law School. From 1966 until 1970, Cellucci was a member of the Reserve Officers Training Corps (ROTC), and he served in the U.S. Army Reserves from 1970 until 1978, when he was honorably discharged with the rank of captain.

In 1970, Cellucci was elected to the Hudson Charter Commission. A year later, he won election to the Hudson Board of Selectmen, and he served on that panel until 1976, when he was elected to the first of four terms in the Massachusetts House of Representatives.

In 1984, Cellucci was elected to the Massachusetts Senate from the Middlesex and Worcester District, and in 1989 became the Senate's assistant Republican leader. During his fourteen years in the Legislature, Cellucci was heavily involved in health care issues, campaign finance reform and issues concerning local government.

In 1979, Cellucci became the first elected official in Massachusetts to endorse the presidential candidacy of George Bush. In 1988, Cellucci served as chairman of Bush's Massachusetts campaign. In 1982, he served as campaign chairman for gubernatorial candidate Andrew Card of Holbrook, who is now the President's deputy chief of staff.

From 1973 to 1990, Cellucci practiced law in his hometown of Hudson.

On January 4, 1990, Cellucci formally announced his candidacy for Lieutenant Governor of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and was elected on November 6, 1990. He was inaugurated on January 3, 1991.

Cellucci is 43 years old. He lives in Hudson with his wife Jan Garnett, and their two children: Kate (b) (6) and Anne (b) (6).

BIOGRAPHY: STATE TREASURER JOE MALONE

On January 16, 1991, Joseph D. Malone was inaugurated 56th Treasurer and Receiver-General of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. The first Republican to hold that office since 1949, Joe carried the state with a 58% margin of victory.

Malone has instituted innovative programs such as the Middle-Class American Dream program, which brings the dream of home ownership within closer reach of those struggling in Massachusetts' forgotten middle class.

Long active in Massachusetts' civic affairs, Joe has devoted his professional life to rebuilding the two-party system in Massachusetts. As Executive Director of the Massachusetts Republican party, he helped repeal a legislative pay raise, and worked toward state hierarchy's withdrawal of a \$220 million proposed increase in fees, fines, and taxes.

In 1988, Joe waged a widely-applauded, upbeat campaign for incumbent veteran Ted Kennedy's U.S. Senate seat. The campaign drew support throughout the state and around the country.

In 1991, Malone spearheaded a volunteer fundraising drive to benefit men and women of Massachusetts who answered our country's call during Operation Desert Storm. The drive -- "A Hero's Welcome" -- raised \$750,000 for veterans. Presently, Treasurer Malone's civic interests find him serving his second term as Chairman of the annual Great Strides walk, which is sponsored by the Massachusetts chapter of the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation. Malone has also initiated a special secondary-education outreach program: he teaches classes to students at local high schools, and brings experience, inspiration, and "real life" application to book-learning. In doing so, he brings government back to the people in its purest form.

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Senator David H. Locke, the Minority Leader of the Massachusetts Senate, has a long and distinguished record of public service.

While still in college, Locke was elected Town Meeting Member in his hometown of Wellesley, a post he held for many years. He became actively involved in the affairs of the community, through memberships in organizations including the Republican Town Committee, the Wellesley Kiwanis Club, the Newton-Wellesley Hospital Board of Overseers, the Wellesley Friendly Aid, the Wellesley Red Cross, and the local Community Chest.

Locke was elected to the Wellesley Board of Selectmen, where he also served a term as Chairman of the panel. In 1960, Locke waged a successful campaign for the Massachusetts House, where he served four consecutive terms before he was elected to the State Senate in 1968.

In 1971, Senator Locke was named Assistant Republican Leader, a position he maintained for 18 years until he was elected Minority Leader in January 1989.

Senator Locke was named "Legislator of the Year" by the National Republican Legislators Association in 1990, when he was selected from nearly 3000 nominees nationwide.

In the spring of 1990, Senator Locke founded the "Save Our Senatè" (SOS) political action committee, an organization dedicated to helping Republican candidates for the Massachusetts Senate, and ending one-party domination of the state Legislature. These efforts paid dividends in the November 1990 elections when Republican strength in the Senate doubled, from eight to 16 members, the largest gain for the GOP in 75 years.

Senator Locke was Chairman of the Massachusetts Reagan-Bush Campaign in 1980 and 1984. In 1988, he served as the Senior Co-Chairman for the Bush Campaign in Massachusetts.

Locke, a resident of Wellesley, is the father of five children. He graduated from the Wellesley Public Schools, Harvard College (A.B. '51), and Harvard Law School (J.D. '54). He is a veteran of the United States Marine Corps.

Senator Locke is a practicing attorney with the Wellesley firm of Locke, Fullerton and Lundwal. He began his legal career as a Special Assistant District Attorney for Norfolk County in 1956-57.

The Senator is a past President of the Middlesex Club, the oldest Republican Club in the nation, founded in 1867.

Representative Peter Forman Biographical Information

Representative Peter Forman was born and educated in Plymouth. He graduated from Colby College in 1980 and immediately ran for the open House seat in Plymouth. At the age of 22, he became the youngest elected Republican to the Legislature in this century.

Over the last 12 years Representative Forman has served on the Committees on Public Service, Federal Financial Assistance, Election Laws, Insurance and Health Care.

In addition to those permanent committees, he has served on the Special Committee on Redistricting (1988) and was House Chairman of a special joint committee to investigate the Pilgrim Nuclear Plant.

In 1989 the Representative was elected by House Republicans to the position of Assistant Minority Whip. In 1991 he was unanimously elected by his Republican colleagues to his current position of House Minority Leader. He is the youngest Massachusetts Floor Leader, of either party, in this century and the fourth youngest Floor Leader in the nation.

The House Minority Leader received in 1991 the prestigious Fenn Award for Political Leadership from the John Fitzgerald Kennedy Library. The Fenn Award is given each year to a young elected official in Massachusetts who has demonstrated outstanding leadership skills in dealing with difficult public policy issues. He was the first Republican to receive the Kennedy Library honor.

Among his political accomplishments, in 1986 Representative Forman was selected by then Vice President George Bush to be Massachusetts Chairman of the Vice President's Political Action Committee. In 1988 he was named cochairman of the Massachusetts Bush for President Campaign.

MEMORANDUM TO THE FILE

Re: The Vice President's Boston Trip

On Thursday, February 13, 1992, Vice President Quayle will participate in roundtable discussions of the proposed Civil Justice Reform Act in Boston. This legislative proposal arose from the Competitiveness Council chaired by the Vice President, and was introduced in Congress last week. The Vice President has advocated enactment of the Council's recommendations in public speeches and appearances for a number of months, including most notably at the American Bar Association convention last summer. I understand that he will continue to do so now that the recommendations have been proposed as legislation.

The roundtable discussions will be bipartisan, including Democratic and Republican state legislators, business leaders, and community leaders. They will be held at the State Capitol. After the roundtables, the Vice President will participate in one-on-one interviews with the Boston media.

The question has arisen whether the timing of the trip five days before the New Hampshire primary requires that the trip be treated as campaign-related rather than official. Media coverage of the Vice President's visit will be accessible to New Hampshire residents, and the press may ask questions about the campaign. For the reasons that follow, and subject to the restrictions discussed, I believe the trip can properly be deemed official.

First, the express purpose of the trip is official. The Civil Justice Reform Act is a major Administration initiative, and the Vice President has been at the forefront of that effort.

Second, I understand that no "campaign activity" -- express advocacy of the re-election of the President and Vice President or the defeat of another identifiable candidate, or solicitation of contributions to Bush-Quayle 92 -- will occur during the roundtable discussions. No Bush-Quayle 92 personnel will accompany the Vice President to Boston, nor will any Bush-Quayle 92 personnel do advance work for or participate in the roundtable discussions.

Third, although the Vice President cannot control the questions he receives from the media interviewers, he could and should make clear during each interview that he is in Boston to promote the Civil Justice Reform Act. If possible, written confirmations of those interviews should also state that the Vice President would welcome and be prepared to answer questions about that bill. The Vice President can respond to campaign-related questions put to him by the media, but should avoid campaign speech making in response to such inquiries.
