Enclosed is the data you requested for nine states. This detailed information, from the data base for CONSAD's Jobs-at-Risk: Short-Term and Transitional Employment Impacts of Global Climate Policy Options, reports on the anticipated short-term and transitional jobs-at-risk (of various degrees) and job losses tied to the first several years of a relatively low-rate (\$24/ton of carbon removed) carbon tax and/or an equivalent command-and-control policy to reduce the use of carbon.

Figure 1 displays the total employment in the nine states, as reported from the latest available U.S. Department of Commerce County Business Patterns.

Figure 2 displays, for each state:

1. The total jobs-at-risk in the first several years after the imposition of the tax;
2. The number (of this total) placed severely-at-risk; and
3. The prospective job losses by the year 2000.

Figure 3 summarizes these same totals, absolutely and percentage-wise, for each of the states.

Figure 4 displays, by state and for approximately 20 indicated industrial sectors the number of workers whose jobs are placed at-risk, and the breakout into those jobs severely-at-risk, moderate-at-risk, and minimally-at-risk.

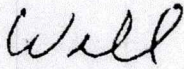
Figure 5 maps the key affected industries in each state.

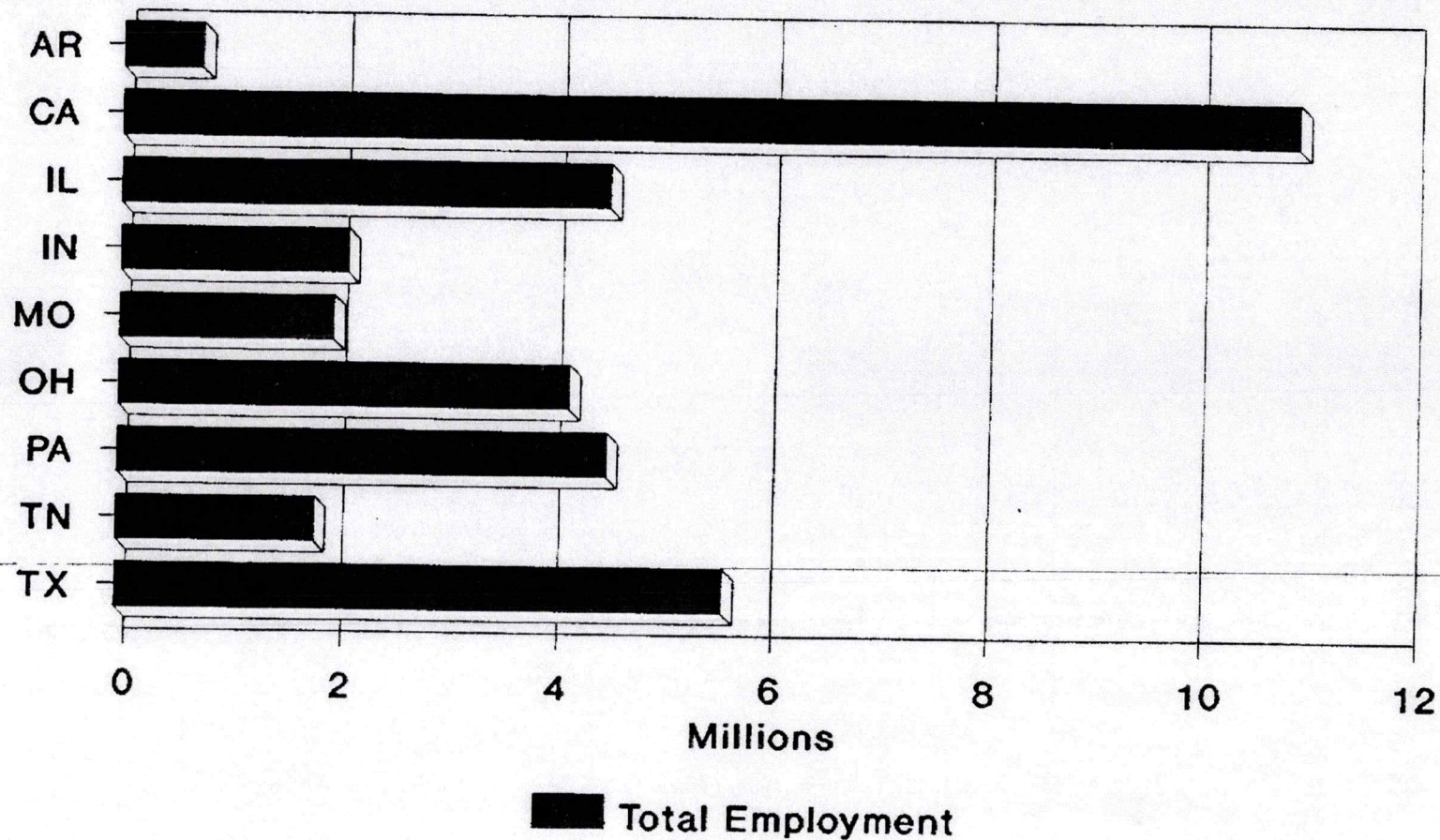

(Selected States)

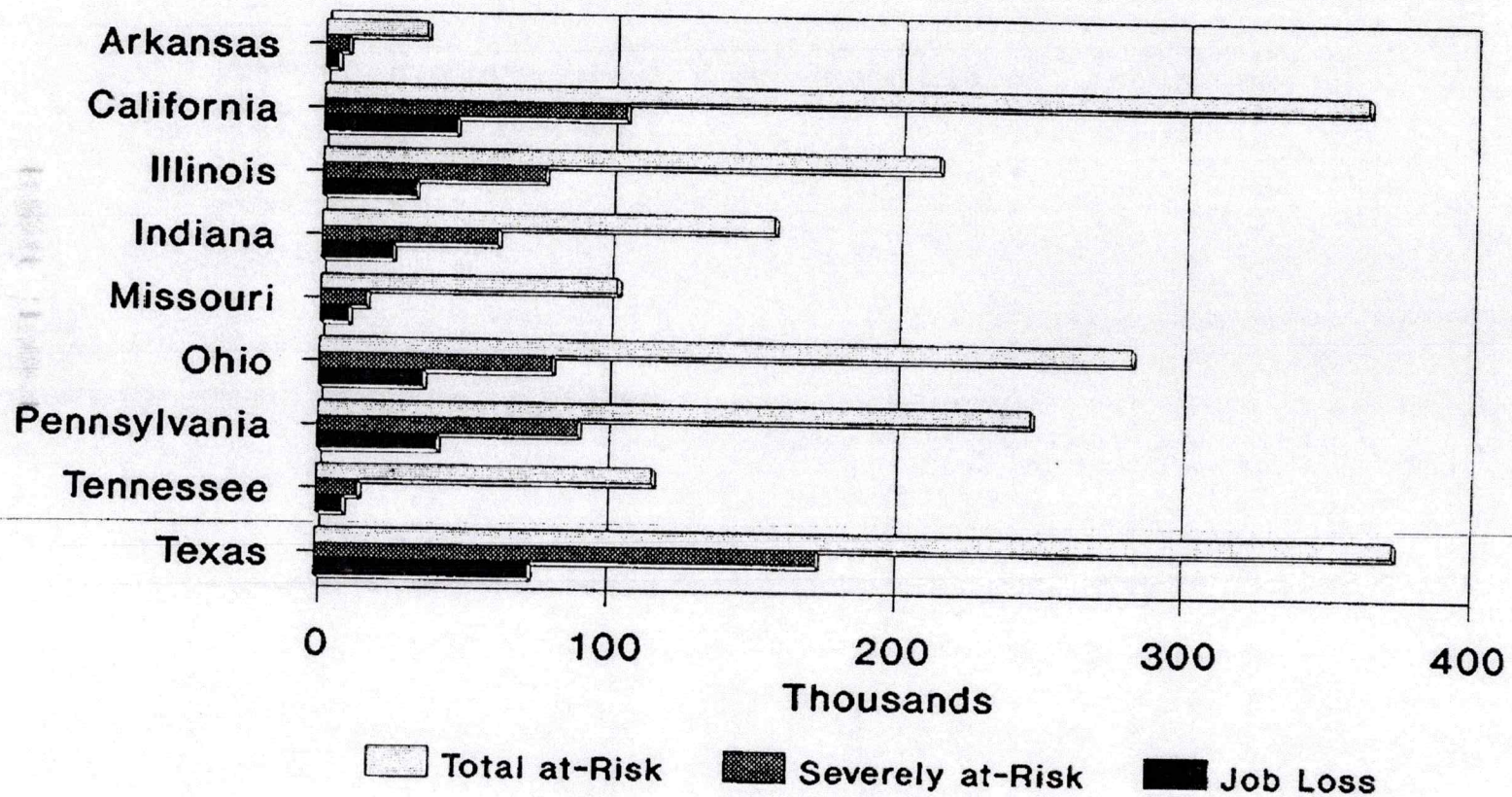


Figure 3: Jobs Data by State

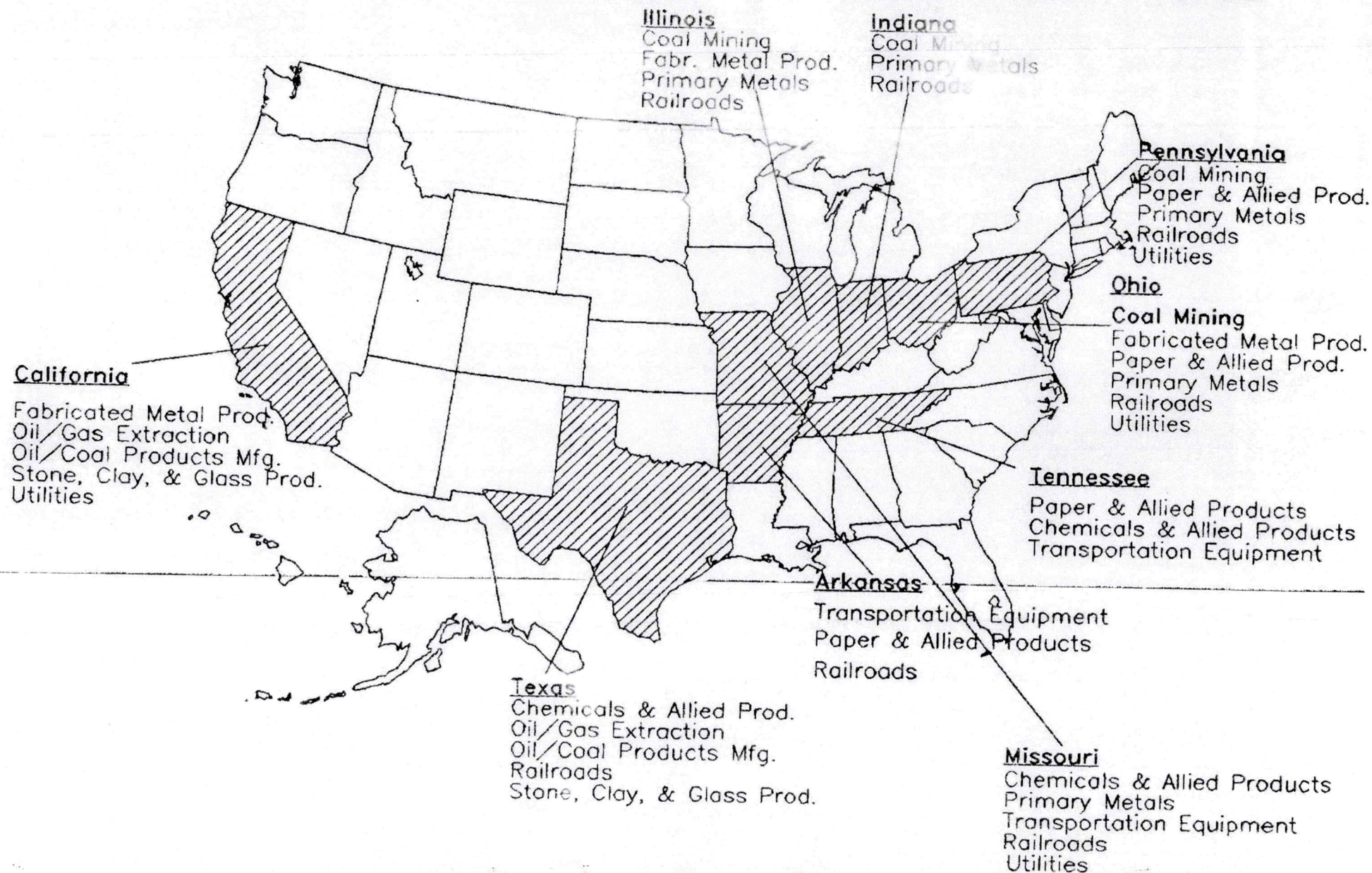

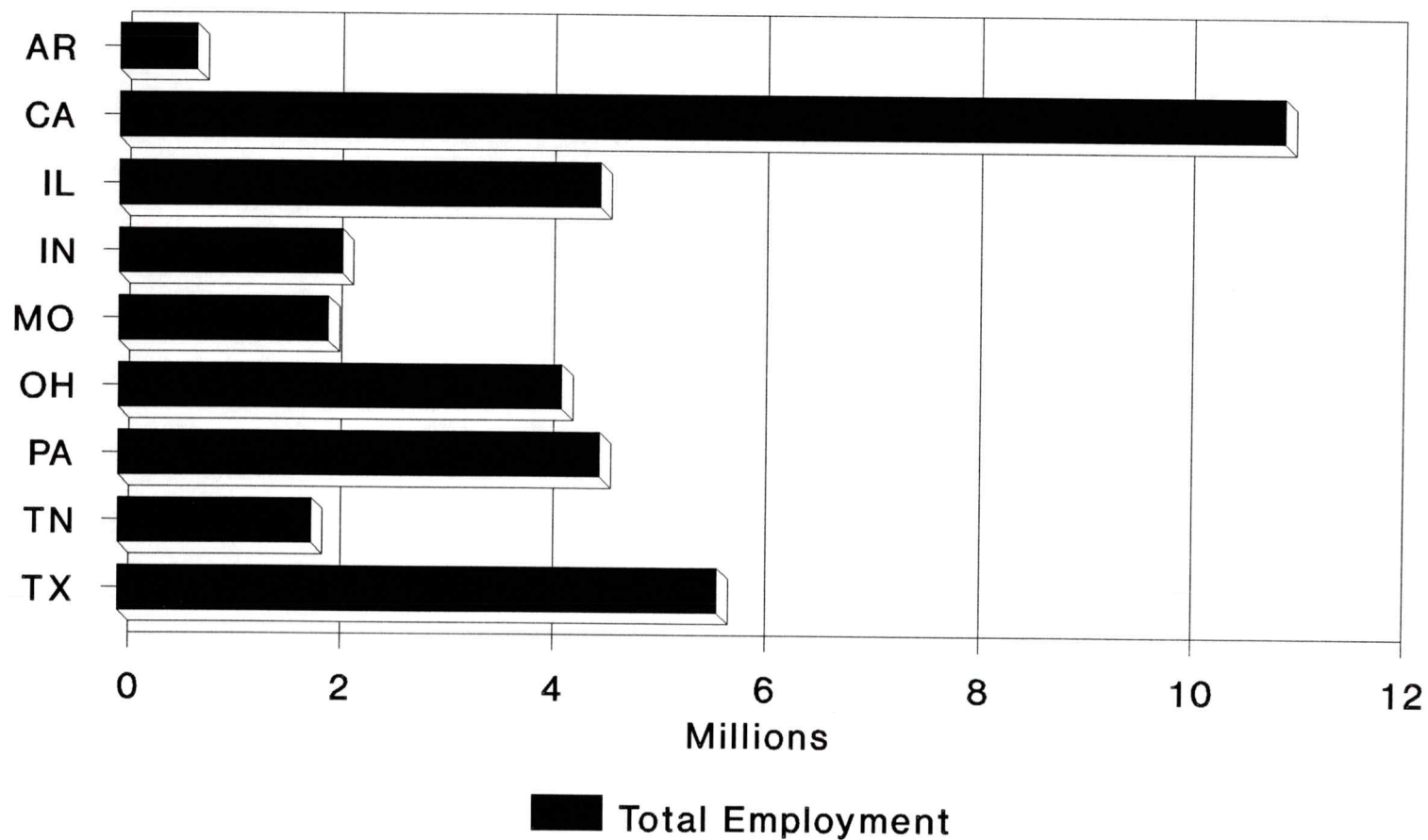

(Selected States)

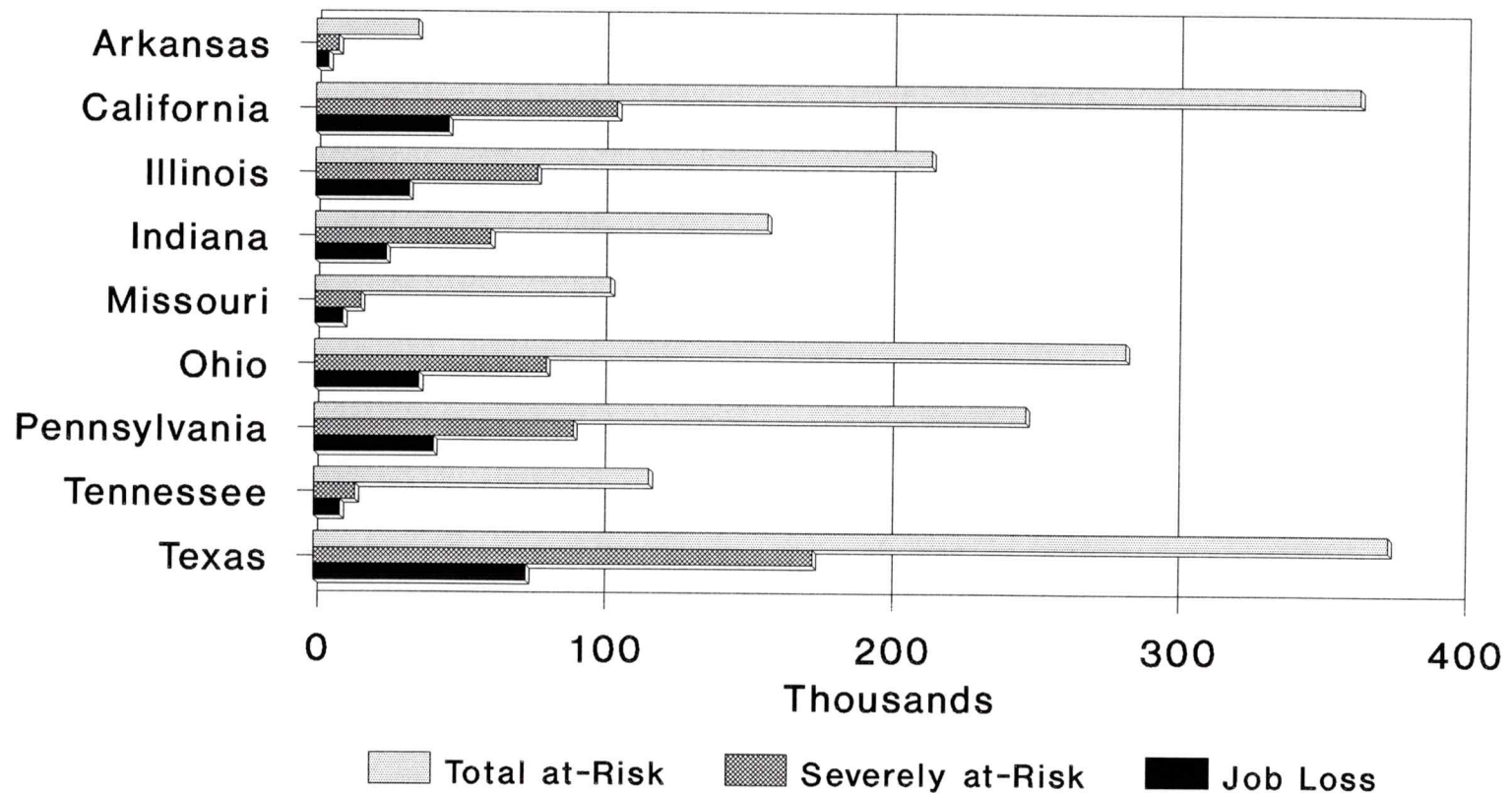


Figure 3: Jobs Data by State
