**A FRAMEWORK FOR DECISION-MAKING
A PRELIMINARY PROPOSAL FOR A PLANNING STUDY
FOR THE OCCUPIED TERRITORIES IN THE MIDDLE EAST**

Transtech Engineers International, Inc.
and

In anticipation of serious negotiations pursuant to the resolution of conflict in the occupied territories and the possible creation of a new state in the Middle East, Transtech Engineers International Inc. and SIR, an international planning and design firm, proposes to undertake a technical planning study which would serve as a basis for discussions and decision-making concerning the future development of these disputed territories. The proposed study would serve to clarify and substantiate the United States' position and leadership in assisting the peace process and promoting the successful redevelopment of this troubled region.

Such a study would have as its objective the application of rational and scientific methods of analysis and planning to promote the successful growth and development of the region and the peaceful coexistence of the attendant nations. PLANNING PROCESS

Its function is an integrative one, serving to establish an informed framework for decision-making. The major components of this process are as follows:

1. Data Collection and Analysis: Includes a general assessment of the subject area in terms of (a) geo-political boundaries, resources, land characteristics, climate, history, support and utility networks (transportation, electricity, water) and existing settlements and their characteristics; and (b) the demographic characteristics of the existing and proposed population.

2. Synthesis: Formulation of alternative scenarios, which describe conceptual development plans in terms of the social, political, economic, physical-environmental and behavioral subsystems within a comprehensive planning framework. The integrative function of this phase of the planning effort examines the reciprocal relationship between the various subsystems, creating a rational basis for assessing and discussing the problems and potentials of various, alternative, comprehensive planning models. A key issue in this regard would be a realistic assessment of the impact caused by the political redefinition of the disputed territories on surrounding and otherwise interested nations and the economic and political trade-offs which would be required.

3. Physical Plan: Development of a settlement plan for the area which includes land use, infrastructure and utilities, and case study plans for target cities and towns including prototypical building designs and construction systems.

4. Implementation Strategies: Including coordinated staging and phasing plans, financial and implementation schedules.
